



PASTORAL REFLECTION



GOING FISHING WITH JESUS

The science is full of wonder. Take for example, such math symbols as the - and + signs. Basically these are very similar in appearance. The - is a short horizontal bar, whereas the + sign is the same horizontal bar crossed with a vertical bar. Deprived of its vertical bar, the + is no longer a positive sign but it becomes a negative sign. As such it spells negativity and lack of deprivation. A minus number designates a quantity less than zero. It suggests a disadvantage, less and deficit. But once it is crossed with a vertical bar, everything changes. The - sign becomes a + sign, and this entails a passivity, advantage, gain, and profit.

This example can serve to illustrate the mechanics of our spiritual life. Without a personal relationship with God, without a vertical dimension in our lives, without the upward connection with heaven, our existence becomes a mere - sign, a flat horizontal line limited to this world. And then, nothing makes sense, nothing satisfies us and nothing sparkles. However, when we lift our eyes towards God and invite Him into our lives, everything changes from negativity to positivity. Is it a mere coincidence that the + sign has the shape of a cross? Well! This is the sign of Christianity for the Spanish missionaries and colonizers who discovered South America and the Philippines. When we embrace the cross in our lives, which means accepting to die in our selfishness in order to love and serve others, then our lives blossom into something beautiful. This basic truth was spelled out by Jesus in this simple and crystal clear statement: "Without me you can do nothing."

This statement of Jesus is perfectly illustrated in this Sunday's Gospel. This incident happened between the Resurrection and the Ascension of Jesus. Jesus was not with the disciples. All night they toiled, but to no avail. When daybreak came, they had caught nothing. When Jesus showed up and took the lead of the operation and told them what to do, they made a significant catch. In short, without Jesus, they experience failure but with Jesus they succeeded beautifully and bountifully. "WITHOUT ME YOU CAN DO NOTHING!" In this Mass, therefore, let us make Jesus Number One in our whole life, whenever we go on vacation, staying home or in whatever plans, activities and endeavors we do. Amen!!! God bless you!




#125. A STORY OF 'TURNING SOULS TO JESUS': Once there was a young fisherman who fell in love with a mermaid. "Take me for thy bridegroom, said the fisherman." "You have a human soul," the mermaid answered. "If you would send away your soul, then I could love you." The young fisherman sent away his soul, married the mermaid and lived with her at the bottom of the sea. However, the soul kept on persuading to take him into himself. When the fisherman gave in to the soul's persuasion, it was too late. The soul which he sent out into the world had become evil. (From 'The Fisherman and his Soul' by Oscar Wilde.)

The fishermen who turned into "fishers of men" when called by Jesus had turned their 'souls' away to follow Jesus. They literally left everything behind – their parents, families, livelihood and ways of life. These were the first disciples of Jesus and became the Twelve Apostles of the Lord.

In this first week of May, on Monday we have the feast day of St. Athanasius, Bishop, and Doctor of the Church. He was bishop of Alexandria and champion of Nicea (325) and also known as the "Doctor of the Incarnation". On the 3rd, we have the feast of Ss. Philip and James, Apostles and Martyrs and both saints are mentioned in the Roman Canon. On the 5th, we have the 'Cinco de Mayo' and a National Day of Prayer. The 6th is our First Friday. On the 7th is First Saturday, we have our regular Mass at 9AM and benediction for our adorers and devotees of our Lady of Fatima. This is all for now, watch for the next bulletin.




