

PASTORAL REFLECTION



HOPE FOR THE WORST SINNER

In this Sunday Gospel, we read about Zacchaeus, a man who thrust his hand into the bottle, so to speak, and became captive of his own undoing. As a senior tax collector, Zacchaeus had grown rich by using his position of power (graft) to defraud people to line his own pocket. Does this have a contemporary ring?

Zacchaeus was a short man, but even shorter in the eyes of his countrymen who knew well enough his double-dealing reputation. His greed must have caught up with him, giving him a troubled conscience. "It's not right!" Zacchaeus must have realized.

He sought Jesus with genuine humility and sincere sorrow. This he showed in taking the unusual step of climbing a sycamore tree despite the fact that, being a senior tax collector, he was an important man in the city. He wanted to impress on the Lord that he had 'reformed' his life and that he was sincerely trying to do God's will. He told Jesus that he had been giving far beyond the requirement of the religious law in his effort to right the wrongs he did to others.

"Behold, Lord the half of my goods I give to the poor and if I have defrauded anyone of anything, I restore four times." (Lk. 18:8) It is a 180 degrees turn-around which we repentance or conversion; being "BORN AGAIN" or 'trans formation.' Jesus calls it 'salvation'.

Zacchaeus' story is God's unequivocal warning against greed, against enriching oneself at the expense of people. Businessmen and capitalists in their search for more and more money leave pollution and misery behind them. SOME enrich themselves in dangerous drugs, in pornography and flesh trades — corrupt practices that cause irreparable moral — spiritual damage to a person.


"It's not the man who has too little who is poor, but the man who craves for more," wrote an ancient Greek philosopher. The greedy is ever in want. But there's always 'hope for the worst sinner, the Zacchaeus story teaches. There's always room for God's mercy. All we have to do is to draw out our fist of the 'narrow-necked bottle' and let go of our hold.

#151. A STORY OF ONE'S HAND THRUST INTO A BOTTLE. A monkey scenting the nuts in a bottle, would thrust his paw into the long neck and take a fistful of the nuts. However, as soon as he tried to withdraw the prize, his clinched bulging fist would not pass through the narrow-neck of the bottle. So all the monkeys stayed where they were, screaming in chagrin and fear, unable to escape with their booty and yet unwilling to let go, until the members of the expedition arrived and took them captives. We may smile at the monkeys, thinking how foolish they were, but in some respect, are we not very much the same? AMEN.


This week, on Monday it is Halloween Night. November 1 is the Solemnity of All Saints and a Holy Day of Obligation in USA. We have two Masses; one is at 8AM and the second one at 6PM for all but especially for workers. On the 2nd, we have the Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed (All Souls' Day). We, again have two Masses; one is at 8AM and the second one is at 6PM for all. This is for the parishioners who have died from November 1, 2021 to October 31, 2022. We invite all the relatives of the deceased, to offer a small lighted candle at the altar to pray for them. On the 3rd, we have the feast of St. Martin de Porres, Religious and patron of social justice and of people of mixed races. The 4th is the memorial of St. Charles Borromeo, Bishop, considered as a model pastor by many bishops and patron of catechists and catechumens. This is also the First Friday of the month. On the 5th, we have the First Saturday and optional memorial of the BVM. We have our regular Mass at 9AM and a short adoration and benediction of the Blessed Sacrament. 



CHURCH REBUILD UPDATE

The Donor Wall is still in production. We have been reaching out to donors to get confirmation on how they want their name listed, so if you made a donation but haven't been contacted, please call or email the Parish Office.

Candles are available for purchase in the parish office or from the ushers at weekend Masses for \$2/each. After purchase, place in an empty wall sconce by the Saints. Parish staff will remove & recycle the candles as the battery dies.

Statues pictured will be placed in the external niches of the church building. The donation amount is \$9,500 per statue. Saints Luke, Matthew and John are all taken, but St. Mark is available for sponsorship. Please contact the Parish Office if you would like to take advantage of this opportunity. You can also still donate to the general Building Fund.

ST. JOSEPH, PRAY FOR US

We are proud to announce that after two years of negotiations we are close to having a senior facility for our aging parishioners and those in the surrounding area. The project will be developed by Shea Connelly, a group who has substantial experience with senior facilities. Though we will not be owners or management, we are providing a service to our community. It is part of our Catholic ministry to assist those in need and we would be doing so by allowing residents who otherwise would not be able to attend Mass or participate in church activities and ministries to do so. We will be leasing our land to the developer at market rates for senior living facilities as well as receiving a profit participation and other revenue. The negotiations are ongoing and expected to be concluded in the next sixty days once the developer has its final construction costs. As with any project of this nature there is a process and the developer has spent substantial funds with market studies, drawings, and meeting governmental requirements. We are now at the point of achieving zoning approval. This is a task which starts with notifying all neighbors. As expected there is opposition and the first meeting was to determine the objections and then work to eliminate them as factors. One of the comments was—There was to be a school which would be much more appealing and little traffic. The reality is a traffic count will show that a school has a much higher traffic count than the facility to be built. As always we need your prayers and support. Please visit the website below to get detailed information on the project and please show support for your parish by signing our petition. With the approval of our parishioners, especially those living in proximity to St. Joseph, as well as our neighbors who have not shown opposition, and along with other parishes in our city council district, we will make our desired senior facility a reality.
