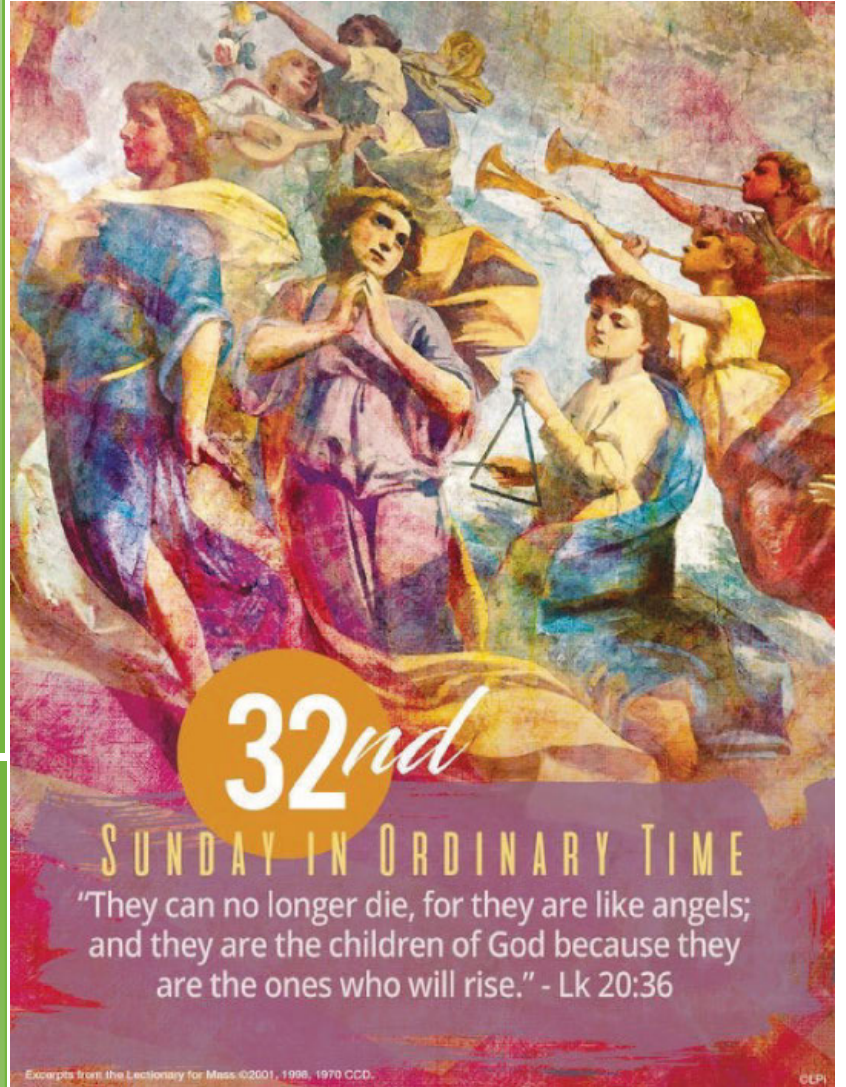

PASTORAL REFLECTION



YEARNING FOR LIFE IN HEAVEN

Our readings for this Sunday support our Christian practice of remembering the saints and praying for our departed. And in a special way, it gives us the chance to review what we really believe to be the meaning of HEAVEN, which is our goal to reach one day. Many people have lost touch with this yearning due to their focus on the purely material world. We have developed weird ideas of Heaven from the influence of non-Christian literature and practices.

The Gospel shows us that Heaven is not a mere continuation of our earthly life. Heaven is infinitely more than we can imagine. There is a difference of quality. Notice how Jesus answered the question about the woman married seven times. In heaven, human love will not continue as it was on earth. Our loved ones will be with us still. They will still be important. But it is not our human love for each other or our human attachments that will matter. Rather, we will all gaze on the beauty of God.

The Gospel reiterates that because God is powerful and transforming love, heaven is a place bustling with life. While we lose our loved ones, our hearts are sorrowful but when we have reflected and realized the meaning of death, we are consoled that our departed have reached their home in God. That is why, every year, we pray for them, we realize that they in good hands, in the company of Abraham, Isaac and Jacob, who first encountered the “God of the Living, not of the dead.” We pray that at least in their last moments, our departed have surrendered their lives to Jesus, and thus now, live joyfully in God. Of course, we are aware that many people too, have closed their hearts to Jesus and to heaven itself. We commend them to God’s mercy.

In conclusion, as we go through the motions of remembering and praying for the departed, may our hearts also long to find rest in the promised heaven of God! Heaven does not start after death. We prepare for it now! The courageous brothers in the 1st. Reading desired to die for their faith than live in sin because they know that HEAVEN is infinitely more real and wonderful. They lived their lives so as to be worthy of Heaven. May we partake of their enthusiasm to spend our lives today as a prelude to the life and love, peace and joy that will never end!

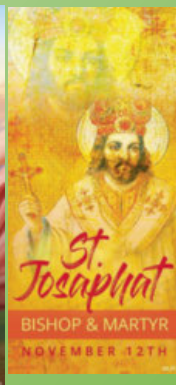

Rite of Christian Initiation of Children – RCIC:

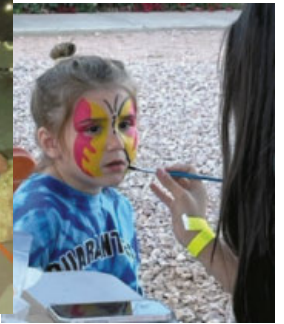

- Must be registered parishioners and attending Mass (3) months before the Baptism.
- Parents and sponsor must attend a Baptism Preparation class at the parish.
- St. Joseph offers a Baptism Preparation Class for Parents and Godparents every 3rd Saturday of each month from 9:00 AM – 12:00 Noon in classroom #4.
- Baptism can be scheduled every Saturday; there are no baptisms during Lent and Holy Week.
- Parents and/or Godparents may give a donation to the Deacon or Priest who is officiating the Sacrament.

CHURCH REBUILD UPDATE

The Donor Wall is still in production. We have been reaching out to donors to get confirmation on how they want their name listed, so if you made a donation but haven't been contacted, please call or email the Parish Office.

Candles are available for purchase in the parish office or from the ushers at weekend Masses for \$2/each. After purchase, place in an empty wall sconce by the Saints. Parish staff will remove & recycle the candles as the battery dies.

Statues pictured will be placed in the external niches of the church building. The donation amount is \$9,500 per statue. Saints Luke, Matthew and John are all taken, but St. Mark is available for sponsorship. Please contact the Parish Office if you would like to take advantage of this opportunity. You can also still donate to the general Building Fund.

ST. JOSEPH, PRAY FOR US



We are proud to announce that after two years of negotiations we are close to having a senior facility for our aging parishioners and those in the surrounding area. The project will be developed by Shea Connelly, a group who has substantial experience with senior facilities. Though we will not be owners or management, we are providing a service to our community. It is part of our Catholic ministry to assist those in need and we would be doing so by allowing residents who otherwise would not be able to attend Mass or participate in church activities and ministries to do so. We will be leasing our land to the developer at market rates for senior living facilities as well as receiving a profit participation and other revenue. The negotiations are ongoing and expected to be concluded in the next sixty days once the developer has its final construction costs. As with any project of this nature there is a process and the developer has spent substantial funds with market studies, drawings, and meeting governmental requirements. We are now at the point of achieving zoning approval. This is a task which starts with notifying all neighbors. As expected there is opposition and the first meeting was to determine the objections and then work to eliminate them as factors. One of the comments was—There was to be a school which would be much more appealing and little traffic. The reality is a traffic count will show that a school has a much higher traffic count than the facility to be built. As always we need your prayers and support. Please visit the website below to get detailed information on the project and please show support for your parish by signing our petition. With the approval of our parishioners, especially those living in proximity to St. Joseph, as well as our neighbors who have not shown opposition, and along with other parishes in our city council district, we will make our desired senior facility a reality.
