

PASTORAL REFLECTION



A GREAT STAR 'THE REAL LIGHT'

2022 years ago, like "A GREAT STAR" JESUS came down from heaven and lit up the darkness of the world. And the Gospel in today's Mass speaks of Jesus as "THE REAL LIGHT... that comes... and shines on all." It adds: "The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has never put it out."

The Christmas image of Jesus is that of a light shining in the darkness. This image took on a remarkable meaning for Victor Frankl, a Nazi prisoner in World War II. One morning, very early, he and some other prisoners were digging in the cold, hard ground; Frankl writes in his book 'Man's Search for Meaning': "The dawn was gray around us; gray was the sky above us; gray the snow in the pale light of dawn; gray the rags in which my fellow prisoners were clad, and gray their faces... I was struggling to find a reason for my sufferings, my slow dying."

As Frankl struggled in the miserable cold to make sense of his suffering, suddenly he became totally convinced that there was a reason, even though he didn't fully comprehend it. Frankl describes what happened then: "At that moment a light was lit in a distant farmhouse, which stood on the horizon as if it were painted there, in the mist of the miserable gray." At that moment, there flashed into Frankl's mind the words of today's Gospel: "The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has never put it out." Frankl says that experience radically changed his entire prison life. It gave him hope, where before he had only despair.

#5. A CHRISTMAS STORY FROM ST. JOE: One Christmas Day during the war a young family — a father, mother and children — were outside making a snowman. Suddenly a plane passed directly overhead. The mother shouted to the children: "That's the plane your uncle is on. Let's all wave. Maybe he'll see us." The children jumped up and down, waved frantically and shouted at the top of their voices.

Seconds later, after the plane had passed, the tiniest child turned to her daddy and asked, "Daddy, how do people climb up to the sky to get into the planes?" Her daddy explained that passengers didn't have to climb to the sky to get into the planes. The planes came down from the sky to the passengers. This story is a beautiful illustration of what Christmas is all about. Christmas celebrates the fact that we don't have to climb up to the sky to get to God. God has come down to earth to us.

This week on Monday we celebrate the Feast of Stephen, one of the seven deacons of the Acts of the Apostles and the first disciple to be martyred. On the 27th, we have the Feast of St. John, Apostle and Evangelist, brother of James; 'disciple whom Jesus loved', authored three letters, the Book of Revelation and the Fourth Gospel also patron of Asiatic Turkey. The 28th, is the Feast of the Holy Innocents. On the 29th, we have the 5th Day within the Octave of Christmas and the optional memorial of St. Thomas Becket, Bishop, and Martyr and considered the most famous martyr of the Middle Ages. On the 30th, we celebrate the Feast of the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph. The 31st, is 7th Day within the Octave of Christmas and optional memorial of St. Sylvester I, Pope. In the evening we have our New Year's Eve Mass at 4PM and on New Year's Day we have our regular Sunday Masses at 8:30AM and at 10:30AM. HAPPY, HAPPY NEW YEAR TO ALL!!! This is all for now watch for the next bulletin. God Bless!



CHURCH REBUILD UPDATE

The Donor Wall is still in production. We have been reaching out to donors to get confirmation on how they want their name listed, so if you made a donation but haven't been contacted, please call or email the Parish Office.

Statues will be placed in the external niches of the church building. The donation amount is \$9,500 per statue. Saints Luke, Matthew and John are all taken, but St. Mark is available for sponsorship. Please contact the Parish Office if you would like to take advantage of this opportunity. You can also still donate to the general Building Fund.

St. JOSEPH, PRAY FOR US

We are proud to announce that after two years of negotiations we are close to having a senior facility for our aging parishioners and those in the surrounding area. The project will be developed by Shea Connelly, a group who has substantial experience with senior facilities. Though we will not be owners or management, we are providing a service to our community. It is part of our Catholic ministry to assist those in need and we would be doing so by allowing residents who otherwise would not be able to attend Mass or participate in church activities and ministries to do so. We will be leasing our land to the developer at market rates for senior living facilities as well as receiving a profit participation and other revenue. The negotiations are ongoing and expected to be concluded in the next sixty days once the developer has its final construction costs. As with any project of this nature there is a process and the developer has spent substantial funds with market studies, drawings, and meeting governmental requirements. We are now at the point of achieving zoning approval. This is a task which starts with notifying all neighbors. As expected there is opposition and the first meeting was to determine the objections and then work to eliminate them as factors. One of the comments was—There was to be a school which would be much more appealing and little traffic. The reality is a traffic count will show that a school has a much higher traffic count than the facility to be built. As always we need your prayers and support. Please visit the website below to get detailed information on the project and please show support for your parish by signing our petition. With the approval of our parishioners, especially those living in proximity to St. Joseph, as well as our neighbors who have not shown opposition, and along with other parishes in our city council district, we will make our desired senior facility a reality.
