

PASTORAL REFLECTION



GOD'S MOTHER, OUR MOTHER TOO!

How appropriate that on the first of the year, we honor Mary, the Holy Mother of God, for it was her willing obedience to God's plan that enabled the Incarnation and initiated what in time became Christianity. As we start this New Year 2023, we celebrate the Motherhood of Mary; thus reminding us of our other Mother, Mama Mary. It is noteworthy that when we're in danger, like when we are about to fall down, we instantly call out: "Mama Mia!" Mary, like all other mothers, always connotes help, care and support. As we commemorate, Mary's motherhood, the Church has for us these salient reminders: FIRST – The Council of Ephesus, an ecumenical council of the bishops of the Catholic Faith, more than 1600 years ago proclaimed: "MARY is rightfully, the Mother of God." (Theotokos in Greek.)

SECOND – The first person to refer to Mary, as the Mother of God was her cousin Elizabeth, who cried out: "Who am I that the Mother of my Lord should come to me?" There are sectors, some of whom are even Christians, who object that Mary be called the "Mother of God," If God exists from all eternity, how can Mary, a creature, born in time be called the Mother of God, they say. St. Thomas Aquinas, the angelic doctor of the Church, answers this very well. He asked; "Do mothers beget bodies or persons? Do our mothers merely give birth to our bodies or to ourselves as persons? As persons, of course!" Thus, Mary conceived in her womb, the Son of God, not just his human nature but his divine nature as well.

As a mother teaches her children positive values and wholesome attitudes, so Mary instills in her spiritual sons all the values her Son taught us: Faith, Love, Forgiveness, Compassion and Obedience. In the wedding at Cana, Mary told the waiters: "Do everything He tells you." And because, they did exactly as told by the Lord, a miracle took place; the transformation of the Water into the Best Wine.

As we cross the threshold of a New Year, we don't know what it will bring us. Will it bring us great success or joy? Suffering or Sorrow? The loss of dear one, some failure, loneliness or illness. Whether we look forward in joyful anticipation to the year just beginning or foreboding and fear, we would do well if we follow Mary's words: "Do whatever He tells you." And we can be sure of experiencing the joy, protection, peace and security throughout the whole New Year. Happy, happy and grace-laden New Year to one and all. God Bless!

#6. A STORY OF A 'MOTHER' FROM ST. JOE: During the French Revolution, this story was told of a mother, who had wandered through the woods for three days with her two sons, to survive on roots and leaves. On the third day, she heard some of the soldiers approaching and immediately hid herself and the children behind some bushes. The sergeant in charge prodded the bushes to see what was stirring behind them. When he saw the starving woman and children, he immediately gave them a loaf of brown bread. The mother took it eagerly, broke it into two pieces and gave one piece to each of the children. "She had kept none for herself," the sergeant said. "Because she is not hungry," a soldier asked; "No, because she is a Mother," the sergeant replied. That's the essence of a mother: caring, loving and godliness. As a Jewish proverb aptly puts it, "God cannot be everywhere so He created Mothers."

This Sunday is New Year's Day and World Day of Peace. On the 2nd, we have the memorial of Ss. Basil the Great and Gregory Nazianzen, Bishops and Doctors of the Church. The 3rd, is the feast of the Holy Name of Jesus. On the 4th, we celebrate the Feast of St. Elizabeth Ann Seton, Religious (USA) and foundress of the first congregation for women religious in USA, the Sisters of Charity. She was also the first native-born citizen canonized (1975). On the 5th, we have the memorial of St. John Neumann, Bishop (USA) and the American bishop canonized (1977). On the 6th, we have the Feast of St. Andre Bessette, (USA), Religious and patron of caregivers. The 7th is the Orthodox Christmas (Julian calendar) and the Feast of St. Raymond of Penyafort, Priest and patron of canonists and lawyers. This is the First Saturday of the Year, we have our regular Mass at 9AM and a short adoration and benediction for our devotees of Our Lady of Fatima. This is all for now, watch for the next bulletin.



HAND CARVED in BETHLEHEM

PLEASE STOP BY THE TABLES OF RELIGIOUS WARES (Nativity set, rosaries, statues, crucifixes, charms, etc.) AFTER ALL THE MASSES THE WEEKEND OF JANUARY 14 & 15.

Ayman Khair is representing about 180 Christian families from Bethlehem. These families have been dependent upon sales of their hand carved religious articles to tourists of the Holy Land. Due to the conflict in the Middle East and the Pandemic, tourism has been stopped completely from March 2, 2020, till February 2022.

It is very important to support them at this critical time since they have no income. In order to survive, they have turned to Christian communities in the United State to purchase their articles.

These hand carved religious articles are beyond description. Carved from wood of the sacred Olive tree, this workmanship has been traditional for these families for hundreds of years. It is hoped that through the efforts of Mr. Khair, these families who have little income and are able to stay living and surviving in the Holy Land.

Sadly enough, the Christian population dropped from 22 % to less than 2% in the last 20 years. Thank you in advance for your support.



CHURCH REBUILD UPDATE

The Donor Wall is still in production. We have been reaching out to donors to get confirmation on how they want their name listed, so if you made a donation but haven't been contacted, please call or email the Parish Office.

Statues will be placed in the external niches of the church building. The donation amount is \$9,500 per statue. Saints Luke, Matthew and John are all taken, but St. Mark is available for sponsorship. Please contact the Parish Office if you would like to take advantage of this opportunity. You can also still donate to the general Building Fund.

St. JOSEPH, PRAY FOR US

We are proud to announce that after two years of negotiations we are close to having a senior facility for our aging parishioners and those in the surrounding area. The project will be developed by Shea Connelly, a group who has substantial experience with senior facilities. Though we will not be owners or management, we are providing a service to our community. It is part of our Catholic ministry to assist those in need and we would be doing so by allowing residents who otherwise would not be able to attend Mass or participate in church activities and ministries to do so. We will be leasing our land to the developer at market rates for senior living facilities as well as receiving a profit participation and other revenue. The negotiations are ongoing and expected to be concluded in the next sixty days once the developer has its final construction costs. As with any project of this nature there is a process and the developer has spent substantial funds with market studies, drawings, and meeting governmental requirements. We are now at the point of achieving zoning approval. This is a task which starts with notifying all neighbors. As expected there is opposition and the first meeting was to determine the objections and then work to eliminate them as factors. One of the comments was—There was to be a school which would be much more appealing and little traffic. The reality is a traffic count will show that a school has a much higher traffic count than the facility to be built. As always we need your prayers and support. Please visit the website below to get detailed information on the project and please show support for your parish by signing our petition. With the approval of our parishioners, especially those living in proximity to St. Joseph, as well as our neighbors who have not shown opposition, and along with other parishes in our city council district, we will make our desired senior facility a reality.
