

PASTORAL REFLECTION



JOHN THE BAPTIST RECOGNIZES JESUS...

In this Sunday's Gospel, John testifies that the Holy Spirit descended upon Jesus when John baptized Him, meaning that the Holy Spirit joined in Christ's entire mission. The Holy Spirit descended upon us in our own baptism as well. May we be conscious of that divine presence as we join in Christ's mission during our own ordinary time!

The work of John the Baptist may follow this order: First, he began to baptize people. Then, one day, God told him, "When you see the Holy Spirit descend and rest on someone, it is He who is to baptize with the Holy Spirit." Soon after that time, Jesus came to him to be baptized. When John saw Him, he said, "Look, there is the Lamb of God who takes away the sins of the world!" Afterwards, he baptized Jesus, during which time "the Holy Spirit descended on Jesus like a dove."

We see here how God gradually revealed to John who Jesus was. Possibly, Jesus went to the Jordan River earlier, however, at that time John did not recognize Him as the Messiah. He only recognized Him as such when God told him this secretly in his heart. Later, after Jesus was baptized, the dove appeared, but this was just a verification that Jesus was, indeed, the true Messiah. The important point is that John only recognized Jesus as the Messiah when God revealed this to him.

In the Letter to the Colossians, Paul says that we can only know God's will "through perfect wisdom and spiritual understanding." How do we get these spiritual gifts? Of course, from God. Granted that we live a good life, God will bless us. Consequently, we will be able to discern His will in our daily life. Mary was a perfect example of this. She was a very good person and so God revealed Himself to her. The same was true of Joseph. And the same holds true of John the Baptist. By his own power he was not able to recognize Jesus as the Messiah. He only came to know this when God revealed it secretly to him.

What is true of all these saints is also true of us. When God sees us doing our very best, He reveals Himself to us in ways far beyond what we might obtain by human efforts alone. He certainly did this with Mary, Joseph and John the Baptist, just as He does with all his saints. May we be as fortunate as they were so as to understand the heart and mind of God. God Bless!



HAND CARVED in BETHLEHEM

PLEASE STOP BY THE TABLES OF RELIGIOUS WARES (Nativity set, rosaries, statues, crucifixes, charms, etc.) AFTER ALL THE MASSES THE WEEKEND OF JANUARY 14 & 15.

Ayman Khair is representing about 180 Christian families from Bethlehem. These families have been dependent upon sales of their hand carved religious articles to tourists of the Holy Land. Due to the conflict in the Middle East and the Pandemic, tourism has been stopped completely from March 2, 2020, till February 2022.

It is very important to support them at this critical time since they have no income. In order to survive, they have turned to Christian communities in the United State to purchase their articles.

These hand carved religious articles are beyond description. Carved from wood of the sacred Olive tree, this workmanship has been traditional for these families for hundreds of years. It is hoped that through the efforts of Mr. Khair, these families who have little income and are able to stay living and surviving in the Holy Land.

Sadly enough, the Christian population dropped from 22 % to less than 2% in the last 20 years. Thank you in advance for your support.

CHURCH REBUILD UPDATE

The Donor Wall is still in production. We have been reaching out to donors to get confirmation on how they want their name listed, so if you made a donation but haven't been contacted, please call or email the Parish Office.

Statues will be placed in the external niches of the church building. The donation amount is \$9,500 per statue. Saints Luke, Matthew and John are all taken, but St. Mark is available for sponsorship. Please contact the Parish Office if you would like to take advantage of this opportunity.

St. JOSEPH, PRAY FOR US

We are proud to announce that after two years of negotiations we are close to having a senior facility for our aging parishioners and those in the surrounding area. The project will be developed by Shea Connelly, a group who has substantial experience with senior facilities. Though we will not be owners or management, we are providing a service to our community. It is part of our Catholic ministry to assist those in need and we would be doing so by allowing residents who otherwise would not be able to attend Mass or participate in church activities and ministries to do so. We will be leasing our land to the developer at market rates for senior living facilities as well as receiving a profit participation and other revenue. The negotiations are ongoing and expected to be concluded in the next sixty days once the developer has its final construction costs. As with any project of this nature there is a process and the developer has spent substantial funds with market studies, drawings, and meeting governmental requirements. We are now at the point of achieving zoning approval. This is a task which starts with notifying all neighbors. As expected there is opposition and the first meeting was to determine the objections and then work to eliminate them as factors. One of the comments was—There was to be a school which would be much more appealing and little traffic. The reality is a traffic count will show that a school has a much higher traffic count than the facility to be built. As always we need your prayers and support. Please visit the website below to get detailed information on the project and please show support for your parish by signing our petition. With the approval of our parishioners, especially those living in proximity to St. Joseph, as well as our neighbors who have not shown opposition, and along with other parishes in our city council district, we will make our desired senior facility a reality.
