

PASTORAL REFLECTION



"LIGHT OF THE WORLD!"

We just read in today's Good News: "The people who sat in darkness have seen a great light, and for those who sat in the region and shadow of death light has dawned."

Who are these people sitting in darkness and the shadow of death? They are those who lived before the coming of Christ. The world was dark. Men did not know how to get home or even where the home was. CHRIST came like a great light, to pierce the darkness, and shine in the hearts of men. He was the Light. A few moments ago, we heard the prophecy: "The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light." We prayed in the Responsorial Psalm; "The Lord is my Light and my Salvation." In the Bible, Light is another word for God, as we will pray in the Nicene Creed shortly; "We believe in the one Lord, Jesus Christ the Only Son of God... God from God. Light from Light..."

To the crowd at that time He forgave Mary Magdalene, Jesus declared, "I am the Light of the world. He who follows me does not walk in the darkness but will have the light of life." (Jn. 8:12) The absolute need for light, both spiritual and physical is brought out repeatedly in both Old Testament and New Testament.

Light for the body is not nearly as necessary as the light for the soul. Christ not only brings this interior light but also He is the Light itself. How is Christ a Light for you and me right now? All the deep questions of life are brought out into the light by Jesus. What is true, what is false, what is good, what is evil? How can I be truly happy? In all history, the best answers, in fact, the only answers have been given by the Light of the world --- Jesus Christ.

Who of us does not have a problem in health, finance, personality, injustice, loneliness, ingratitude and love unreturned? In the bright light of what Jesus said and did, we see our way through these perplexing problems. Truly, we who follow Him do not walk in darkness, but in the light.

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ, that light is renewed and rekindled here on this altar. May we renew our love for the light of the world --- Jesus Christ! God Bless You!


January 22 is the Sunday devoted for the Word of God. On the 23rd, we have the Day of Prayer for the Legal Protection of Unborn Children. This is also the optional memorial Ss. Vincent, Deacon, Martyr and patron of wine-producers; Marianne Cope, Virgin and caregiver of the lepers in the Island of Molokai. The 24th is the feast of St. Francis de Sales, Bishop, Doctor of the Church and co-founder with St. Jane Frances de Chantal of the Visitation Order. He is also the patron of writers, journalists and the deaf. On the 25th, we celebrate the Conversion of St. Paul, The Apostle to the Gentiles. On the 26th, we have the memorial of Ss. Timothy and Titus, Bishops and Companions of St. Paul in his missionary works. On the 27th, we have the optional memorial of St. Angela Merici, Virgin and foundress of the Ursuline Order. On the 28th, we celebrate the Feast of St. Thomas Aquinas, Priest, Doctor of the Church, and also called the "Angelic Doctor" who wrote the 'Summa Theologica. 

CHURCH REBUILD UPDATE

The Donor Wall is still in production. We have been reaching out to donors to get confirmation on how they want their name listed, so if you made a donation but haven't been contacted, please call or email the Parish Office.

Statues will be placed in the external niches of the church building. The donation amount is \$9,500 per statue. Saints Luke, Matthew and John are all taken, but St. Mark is available for sponsorship. Please contact the Parish Office if you would like to take advantage of this opportunity.

You can also still donate to the general Building Fund.

St. JOSEPH, PRAY FOR US

We are proud to announce that after two years of negotiations we are close to having a senior facility for our aging parishioners and those in the surrounding area. The project will be developed by Shea Connelly, a group who has substantial experience with senior facilities. Though we will not be owners or management, we are providing a service to our community. It is part of our Catholic ministry to assist those in need and we would be doing so by allowing residents who otherwise would not be able to attend Mass or participate in church activities and ministries to do so. We will be leasing our land to the developer at market rates for senior living facilities as well as receiving a profit participation and other revenue. The negotiations are ongoing and expected to be concluded in the next sixty days once the developer has its final construction costs. As with any project of this nature there is a process and the developer has spent substantial funds with market studies, drawings, and meeting governmental requirements. We are now at the point of achieving zoning approval. This is a task which starts with notifying all neighbors. As expected there is opposition and the first meeting was to determine the objections and then work to eliminate them as factors. One of the comments was—There was to be a school which would be much more appealing and little traffic. The reality is a traffic count will show that a school has a much higher traffic count than the facility to be built. As always we need your prayers and support. Please visit the website below to get detailed information on the project and please show support for your parish by signing our petition. With the approval of our parishioners, especially those living in proximity to St. Joseph, as well as our neighbors who have not shown opposition, and along with other parishes in our city council district, we will make our desired senior facility a reality.
