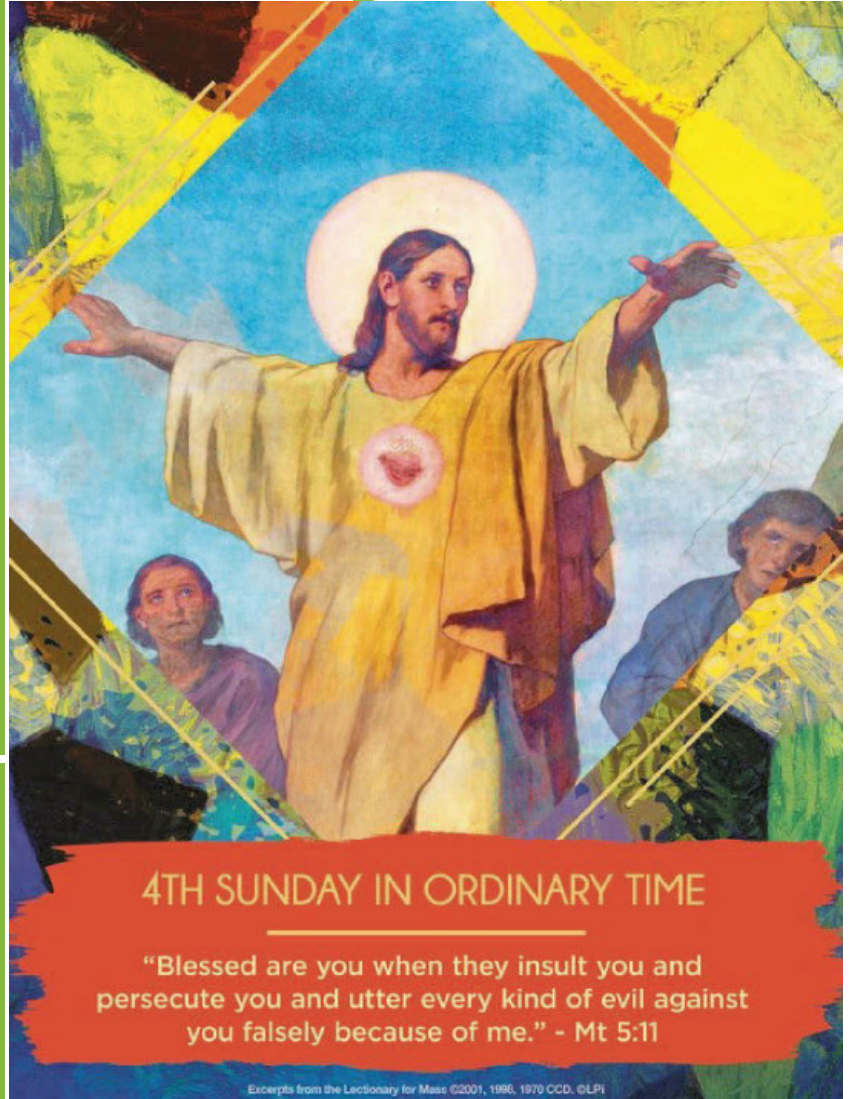

PASTORAL REFLECTION



“BLESSED ARE THE MERCIFUL...”

For our reflection on this Sunday’s Gospel, we focus on the Lord’s words: “Happy are the merciful to others, for they will obtain mercy.” We humbly ask God for forgiveness and for the grace to forgive our neighbor and ourselves for the wrongs we do to each other, trusting that the Lord looks with favor on the humble and merciful.

The word **MERCIFUL** means two things: 1) the one who forgives the offence of others and 2) one who is compassionate. Those who show mercy and compassion will have more mercy and compassion shown to them by God.

A story is told about an Australian missionary and his two sons who were brutally murdered in Orissa, India. Graham Gaines had lived in India for 34 years and had been serving lepers, and certainly among the poorest of the poor. But the jeep in which he and his sons were sleeping was torched, apparently by Indian fanatics. The missionaries tried to escape but were pushed back and burned beyond recognition. The incident caused uproar both in India and beyond. There were the usual condemnations and cries for justice. But his wife Gladys, when interviewed on national television, showed no bitterness or desire for revenge. She appealed for forgiveness and expressed the hope that the death of her loved ones would strengthen them. In doing so, she showed herself to be a true Christian.

MERCY AND JUSTICE are not in opposition. Mercy perfects Justice. We need Justice in the world but we need mercy even more. “An eye for an eye and a tooth for a tooth” if duly observed will leave us toothless and blind. Our Lord, to save the world, went beyond that and asked us to love our enemies and do good to them who hate us. (Mt.5, 44 and Lk. 6:21). If we want to obtain mercy, the surest way to obtain it is to show mercy to others, ourselves.

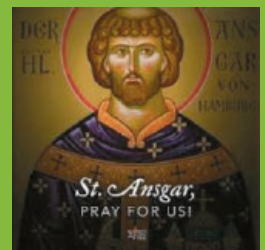
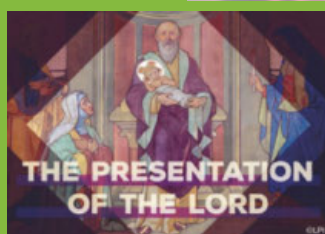
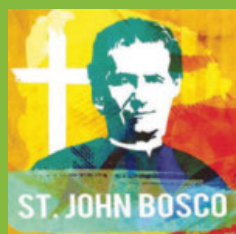
Fr. Matthew Fernandez, an Indian priest, working in Abu Dhabi told this story: One day he was called to help a woman suspected possessed by an evil spirit. When he came to her, she was being held by four strong men; all he could say was: “Lord forgive her. Forgive me! Forgive us all!!!” To his surprise, the woman collapsed and returned to normalcy. The problem was solved by an appeal to God’s mercy. Many more problems in our society will be solved if we seek God’s mercy and show mercy to one another. Then, we will be at peace with God, with ourselves, and with one another. Amen! God bless you!

CHURCH REBUILD UPDATE

The Donor Wall is still in production. We have been reaching out to donors to get confirmation on how they want their name listed, so if you made a donation but haven't been contacted, please call or email the Parish Office.

Statues will be placed in the external niches of the church building. The donation amount is \$9,500 per statue. Saints Luke, Matthew and John are all taken, but St. Mark is available for sponsorship. Please contact the Parish Office if you would like to take advantage of this opportunity. You can also still donate to the general Building Fund. **ST. JOSEPH, PRAY FOR US**

We are proud to announce that after two years of negotiations we are close to having a senior facility for our aging parishioners and those in the surrounding area. The project will be developed by Shea Connelly, a group who has substantial experience with senior facilities. Though we will not be owners or management, we are providing a service to our community. It is part of our Catholic ministry to assist those in need and we would be doing so by allowing residents who otherwise would not be able to attend Mass or participate in church activities and ministries to do so. We will be leasing our land to the developer at market rates for senior living facilities as well as receiving a profit participation and other revenue. The negotiations are ongoing and expected to be concluded in the next sixty days once the developer has its final construction costs. As with any project of this nature there is a process and the developer has spent substantial funds with market studies, drawings, and meeting governmental requirements. We are now at the point of achieving zoning approval. This is a task which starts with notifying all neighbors. As expected there is opposition and the first meeting was to determine the objections and then work to eliminate them as factors. One of the comments was—There was to be a school which would be much more appealing and little traffic. The reality is a traffic count will show that a school has a much higher traffic count than the facility to be built. As always we need your prayers and support. Please visit the website below to get detailed information on the project and please show support for your parish by signing our petition. With the approval of our parishioners, especially those living in proximity to St. Joseph, as well as our neighbors who have not shown opposition, and along with other parishes in our city council district, we will make our desired senior facility a reality.
