PASTORAL REFLECTION



“LOVING OUR ENEMIES:”

The sayings of our Lord in this Sunday’s Gospel are probably among the hardest to accept in our way of Christian living. Particularly most difficult to accept and practice is his command: “Love your enemies, pray for your persecutors.” I still remember our Israeli tourist guide during our pilgrimage to the Holy Land in the year 2000 telling us: “I cannot get myself to love my enemies, at least, while they are my enemies.”

It is quite natural to love those who love us, or those who are our kin and countrymen. But to love our enemies, those who do not wish us well, really goes contrary to our natural tendencies. Thus, to love such people is a sign that there is something more than human in our hearts and that we are not only human but sons and daughters of the Father. That is why Jesus tells us that our love for our enemies “will prove you are sons of your Heavenly Father.” Our love for our enemies is a mirror of the love of our Father in Heaven who loves even those who do not deserve to be loved, for as Jesus says: “his sun rises on the bad and on the good.”

By the time Matthew wrote his gospel, he already had the example of Jesus who asked the Father to forgive those who were crucifying Him [Lk.23:34], and also the example of St. Stephen, the first Christian martyr, who died while praying for his enemies who were stoning him (Acts. 7:60).

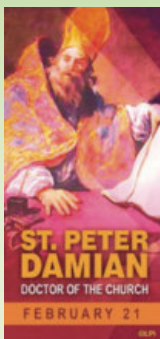
We also have a very beautiful contemporary example of a love of an enemy. The late Cardinal Bernardin was accused of sexual abuse by a man named Steven Cook, a former seminarian who had been alienated from the Church. The whole world came to know about the accusation, which was false. After the case against the Cardinal was dropped, he sought out his accuser who was seriously ill. The Cardinal visited him in the hospital. Steven admitted to the Cardinal that he was never abused by him. Then he apologized to the Cardinal. They ended their meeting with a celebration of the Mass after which the Cardinal administered to his former accuser the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick. The story of their reconciliation was also published afterwards. It has been a source of edification for many. For such love as the Cardinal manifested towards Steven Cook could not have happened except by the grace of Jesus Christ. And Christ unfailingly gives his grace. He does not command us to love our enemies and pray for our persecutors, and then leaves us to do it alone. He always gives us the grace to do what He commands. If we learn to love those who do not deserve our love and if we reach out to our enemies through prayer and dialogue, there will be more peace and harmony in our country and in our personal lives. AMEN!!! God Bless You!

#13. A MESSAGE FROM ST. JOE “ON BEING NICE TO OTHERS:” There was a man who had a fight and a big argument with his beloved wife one night. He left the house to hang out with his friends and be happy. That same night he came home drunk. When he woke up the next day for work there was food at the table and a few minutes later the wife came and gave him a big hug and she said: “I love you very much and more... with a kiss! He was confused and so he asked, “Honey, what happened? Am I in the same house? Why did you do that to me?” His wife responds, “Yes, honey! It’s me. I just came from the Church and I listened to the Gospel which said: “Love your enemy... so ...I love you and pray for you!” And the man asked his daughter, “Why is your mom in such good mood?” The daughter answered, “Daddy, last night when you came home you were so drunk that mom had to help you go to the bedroom, and you said to her... Lady, stay away from me! I’m married!!! It is NICE to be important but it is more important to be NICE to others.

This Week on Monday, is Presidents’ Day and Washington’s Birthday. This is also World Day of Social Justice. On the 21st, we have the optional memorial of St. Peter Damian, Bishop and Doctor of the Church and ‘Mardi Gras’ On the 22nd, we have Ash Wednesday, Day of obligatory fast and abstinence, and the beginning of the Lenten Season for 2023. On the 23rd, we remember St. Polycarp, Bishop, Martyr and one of the first martyrs to be venerated. This is all for now, watch for the next bulletin.
