

# PASTORAL REFLECTION



#### **START SMALL:**

This First Sunday of Lent Gospel tells us how Jesus resisted three (3) big temptations by the devil himself – to pleasures, honors and riches. To steer Jesus from his task of saving all men; the devil urged Our Lord to turn stones into bread. To seek honor of being held by angels; the devil suggested that Jesus throw Himself down from the top of the temple. To obtain all the kingdoms of the world, the all Good One was to fall down and adore the all Evil One.

JESUS REJECTED ALL THESE GREAT TEMPTATIONS. Sometimes, we are also confronted with great temptations, but in general our temptations are smaller, especially in the beginning. RESIST the first suggestion, to seek sinful pleasures, sinful honors, sinful riches and you are strengthened against the next attack of the devil. By the same reasoning, if you want to do something great for God, start with something small – a kind thought, a wish, or a prayer. For example, "Jesus I want to be like you!" Repeat these words ten times (10x) and these will be yours. Think of a small way to say or do something kind. Give a little something to the needy and poor people. Try to attend weekday Masses during Lent. Read the story of Jesus' Passion a few minutes each day especially in these Lenten days. Use your own head and heart to figure out a way to be like Jesus Christ. Start small but definite. Then, you can say: "I did it yesterday, I can do it today. I'll be able to do it tomorrow."


LENT is an ideal time to start our program for Christ and against the devil. Today's First Reading tells us how Adam and Eve listened to the devil. We all know the result. The Second Reading tells us: "Just as through one man's disobedience, all became just." To every temptation, big and small, repeat the words of Jesus; "GET AWAY SATAN!" We all want to be on the side of a winner, Christ always wins out. He won the battle against Satan in today's Gospel. Be on his side during this Lent and you will win out with HIM on Easter.

#14 A MESSAGE FROM ST. JOE: "ON USUAL STORY OF SIN." The official in charge asked the condemned criminal for killing a cop, who will die to the electric chair in Sing-Sing death house, if he had anything to say. With agony in his voice, the prisoner blurted out: "This all started when I stole a nickel from my mother's purse. Then I stole two nickels. I began taking things at school, at the grocery, at the drug store, malls and supermarkets. A couple of kids and I started breaking in. The haul got bigger and bigger. We decided to rob a bank. That's when I shot a cop. It all started with a nickel. That and even today is the usual story of big crimes of robbery.

This Week, on Monday we remember the optional memorial of St. Gregory of Narek, Abbot and Doctor of the Church. He is best known for his 'Book of Lamentations,' a major work of mystical literature. On March 3, we have a World Day of Prayer and we remember St. Katharine Drexel (USA) Virgin and foundress of the Missionary Sisters of the Blessed Sacrament. On the 4th, we have the feast day of St. Casimir, a Polish prince known as the 'brother and defender of the poor and patron of Poland and Lithuania. This is the First Saturday of the March; we have our regular Mass at 9AM and short adoration with benediction for our adorers and devotees of Our Lady of Fatima. This is all for now, watch the next bulletin. God Bless!



The Monstrance Cover that survived the fire of May 1, 2019 has been beautifully framed and is now hanging in the Adoration Chapel.




#### CHURCH REBUILD UPDATE


