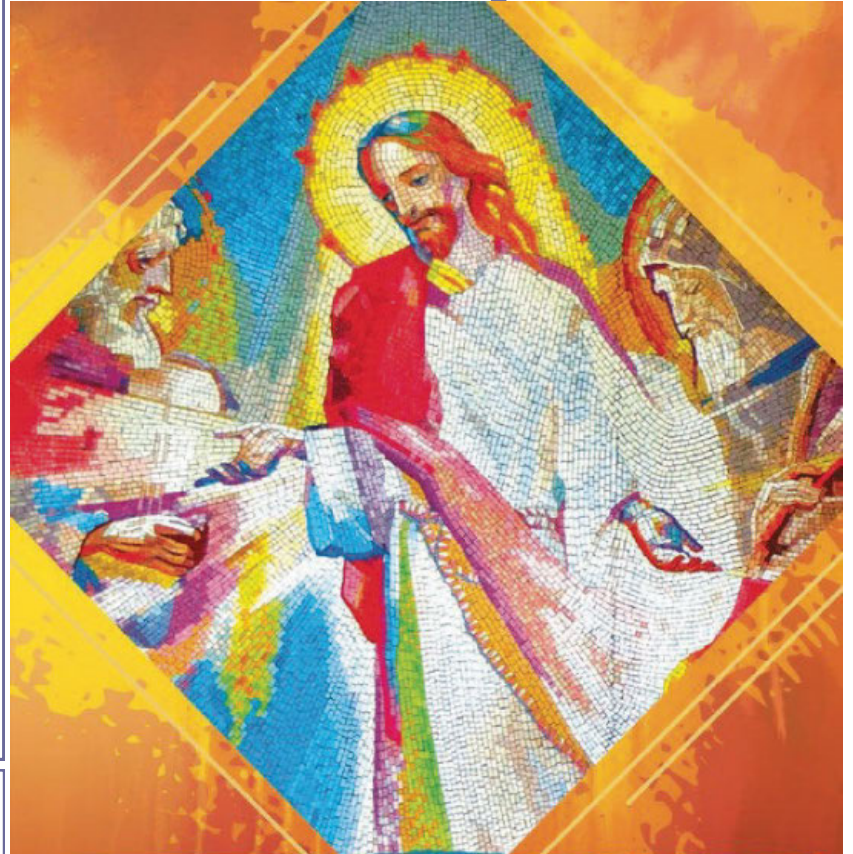

# PASTORAL REFLECTION



## LANGUAGE 101: LISTENING FROM THE HEART

“Shema Israel” In Hebrew, this is known as the ‘Shema (“Hear”), the classic Hebrew confession of faith, describing who God is and what our duty is towards Him. “Hear, Israel, the Lord is our God, the Lord is One.” SHEMA! LISTEN! This is the first imperative word God mentions that forms an essential part of the whole First Commandment. And the theological point is this: **THE FIRST REQUIREMENT OF REAL LOVING IS LISTENING FROM THE HEART.**

There are at least three occasions when God the Father spoke in the New Testament: Baptism, Transfiguration and the Entry of Jesus into Jerusalem. What He has to say, therefore, must be important! God explicates the Shema command during Transfiguration — when Moses and Elijah representing the Law and the Prophets, appeared to the apostles! “This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased, listen to Him.”


On this Second Sunday of Lent, we learn in language 101 the art of listening from the heart. Who are the persons you say you love? How much time do you spend listening to them from your heart? Do you spend some time listening to God’s voice in prayer speaking to you in silence? What can you do to better or improve your listening habits? Let these questions guide us as we learn to listen from the heart.

Which is the First Commandment? SHEMA! HEAR! LISTEN! The Shema still plays a central role in the faith life of each Catholic Christian. However, the command does not stop at listening. Listening should flower into real loving. Indeed, loving in spite of non-listening hearts and despite hardness of hearts and minds of those we love. Let us learn this new Language! The language of listening love.

#15. A MESSAGE FROM ST. JOE: The MASS has a lot of the marks of the TRANSFIGURATION. It takes us to the mount of this Altar. It shows us Jesus in the WHITENESS of the SACRED HOST. In this sacred ceremony we eat and sing together, pray together and greet one another. It is a Happy Event, a High Point and a Festive Celebration. With St. Peter every one of us can cry out: “It is good that we are here!”

This Week on the 7th, we have the optional memorial of Sts. Perpetua and Felicity, Martyrs; a noble lady and her slave, at Carthage in 203 under Septimus Severus were persecuted. On the 8th, we have the International Women’s Day and the feast day of St. John of God, Religious and patron of hospitals and the sick, of nurses and booksellers. On the 9th, we remember St. Frances of Rome, Religious and mother who founded a community of Benedictine women oblates and she is patroness of widows and motorists. This is all for now, watch for the next bulletin. God Bless!


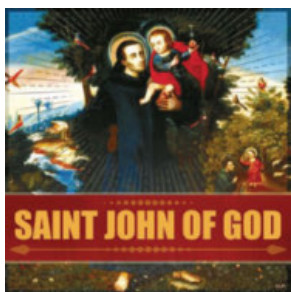

Fasting consists of eating only one meal, with the possibility of two smaller snacks that do not add up to a single full meal.

Catholics age 14 and older are to abstain from meat on all Fridays in Lent.

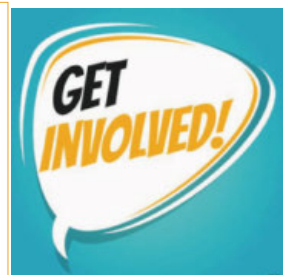
