

## PASTORAL REFLECTION



#### A GREATER MIRACLE

Three High School classmates decided to cut classes one morning and did not go to school until noon. They said to the teacher: "our car had a flat tire that is why we are very late." They were so relieved when they saw the teacher smile and heard her say: "Okay, I understand boys. You missed the test, but you can take it right now." She then sat them in the four corners of the room, away from one another. "Now, you will answer just one question," the teacher said. "Which tire was flat?" And the boys, profusely perspiring, had all different answers! They had lied about having a flat tire.

This story has a parallel to Jesus' encounter with the Samaritan woman at Jacob's well in this Sunday's Gospel. In their dialogue, the woman's response is half-truth and evasive. Jesus was asking her to fetch her husband. The woman replied, "I have no husband." Jesus' witty rejoinder made it clear that He knew her story already; "You are right, because you have had five husbands and the man with whom you are living is not your husband." (Jn. 4:7ff)

Does it have a contemporary ring among showbiz personalities and lived-in couples today? Her life is a mess. But note that Jesus did not condemn her, neither does He excuse her?

The astonishing answer from a total stranger – and a good looking one at that – leads the flirty woman to realize that she was in the presence of someone beyond her normal experience. "Sir, I can see that you are a prophet." She is beginning to move from the earthly level to the spiritual, culminating in Christ's self-revelation as the Messiah. "I, who speak to you, am He." (Jn. 4:26)

In this simple episode at the well, we have the drama of a soul struggling to rise from worldly things to recognition of Jesus. That is spiritual awakening. All of us are much like the Samaritan woman. We do have dark areas in our lives; one way or another we have made a mess in our lives and we try to hide it. It could be the fruit of an illicit relationship, some ill-gotten wealth or an unforgivable injustice inflicted on someone.

God knows about them already. Our life is an open book. But we draw hope and courage from the sympathetic and affirming attitude of our Lord as manifested towards the woman at the well.

We are presently at the season of Lent – an opportune time to look into those "dark areas" of our lives and make a fresh start. In this connection, we tend to be excited about alleged apparitions and miracles – but when a person reforms from his vices and negative ways, when a man remains staunchly honest and straight in an environment of corruption and dishonesty, isn't that a greater miracle?... Amen!!!

#16. A STORY FROM ST. JOE ABOUT A "WOMAN WHO REPRESENTS HER HUSBAND". Every time Mrs. Smith would invite her husband to come to Church, he always said; 'Just represent in the Church; anyway, we're husband and wife." Both met an accident and found themselves knocking at the Pearly Gates.

St. Peter opened the Gate and exclaimed: "Oh! Mr. and Mrs. Smith welcome to Heaven. Come in Mrs. Smith." (Mr. Smith was about to follow.) St. Peter said, I am sorry Mr. Smith, but Mrs. Smith represents you. In the meantime, they're waiting for you in Hell." {See! The big lesson in this story}.

This Sunday is Girl Scouts' Birthday and Daylight Saving Time begins. On the 17th, we celebrate the feast day of St. Patrick, Bishop; patron of Nigeria, apostle and patron of Ireland. On the 18th, we have the optional memorial of St. Cyril of Jerusalem, Bishop and Doctor of the Church; authored 18 "Catecheses" and exiled 3x by the Arians. This is all for now, watch for the next bulletin. God Bless!
