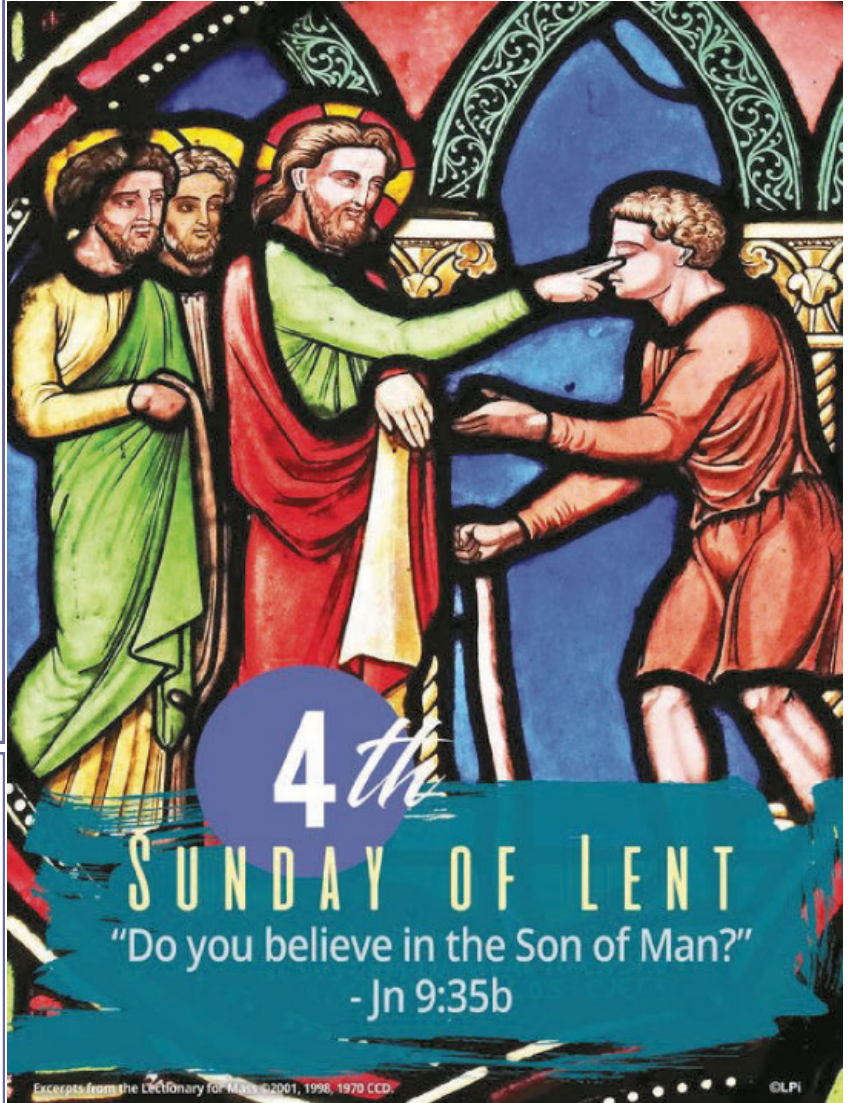

PASTORAL REFLECTION



SIGHT FOR THE SIGHTLESS:

Today we have reached the halfway point of Lent. We celebrate LAETARE SUNDAY. The Latin word, pronounced 'lay-TAR-ray' means "rejoice." We rejoice in the knowledge that the cross does not end in death, and that Jesus' story does not end in the tomb. In today's Gospel, Jesus heals a blind man. More significantly, He can heal our blindness as well. Let us rejoice!

Today's Gospel tells us that Jesus cured a man of his blindness. Jesus did everything He could for that blind man. Since He was God, Christ gave him back his sight. Ann Sullivan did everything she could for Helen Keller. She made it possible for the blind and deaf girl to get in touch with the world outside herself. In a sense, Anne worked a miracle, a miracle of Love and Concern.

You and I can work the same kind of miracle by loving concern for all the handicapped, especially for the blind and the deaf. Any kind effort to help the sightless is pleasing to our Lord. What can I do? The sightless appreciate very much having someone to read to them – the newspaper, the Bible, catholic articles and short stories. What you read and how long you read will depend on time and circumstances. We can subscribe to papers and magazines with large prints for those with limited visions. Talking books and tapes are a boom to the sightless. These are available at no cost from our public libraries.

Many blind people long to attend Sunday Masses or Services of their own churches – remember we must not limit our concern to Catholic Christians only. Why not take them with you? A simple walk around the block, a telephone call, a few minutes visit: What would these mean to you, if you were blind? Some of the sightless persons like to work with their hands. Teach them some simple hobbies. If at all possible, try to provide or find employment, however, limited for the sightless people.

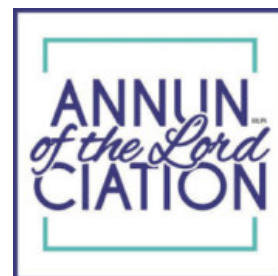
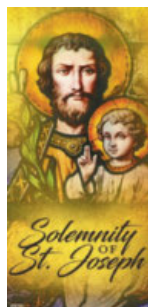
Every one of us can share material blessings with the individual blind and with groups working with and for the blind. Any sacrifice you make to help the blind can be offered to God with this sacrifice of the Mass. How precious will it be in Christ Jesus? Amen! God Bless You!

#17. A STORY FROM ST. JOE: A 'BLIND WOMAN' ONE OF THE MOST HIGHLY EDUCATED WOMEN OF HER TIME. When Helen Keller was two years old, a serious illness destroyed her sight and her hearing. Imagine not able to see and hear. When she was 7 years old, a teacher named Anne Sullivan tackled the apparently impossible job of making contact with Helen's mind through the sense of touch. Anne worked out a sort of alphabet by which she spelled words on Helen's hands. Gradually, the child was able to connect words with objects. Once started, Helen made rapid progress. Within 3 years, she could read and write in Braille. At the age of 10, she determined to perfect her speech. At the age of 16, she entered Radcliffe College from which she graduated with honors in 1904. She became one of the most highly educated women of her time. Anne Sullivan was constantly at her side until the dedicated teacher died in 1938.

This Sunday is Laetare Sunday and the Second Sunday of the Elect. On Monday we celebrate the Solemnity of St. Joseph, our Parish Patron Saint, declared Patron of the Universal Church in 1870 by Pope Pius IX and Guardian of the Redeemer in 1989 by Pope St. John Paul II; also patron of workers and carpenters. On the 23rd, we have the feast day of St. Turibius of Mogrovejo, Bishop, from Salamanca. As a lay man, he was the chief judge of the Inquisition at Granada and as archbishop of Lima, established the first seminary in the Americas. He was also patron of Latin American bishops. On the 24th, we have the International Day for the Right to the Truth Concerning Gross Human Rights Violations and for the Dignity of Victims. On the 25th, we celebrate the Solemnity of the Annunciation of the Lord. This is all for now, watch for the next bulletin.



LENTEN DISCIPLINES OF FASTING & ABSTINENCE

Catholics in good health ages 18 to 59 are required to fast and to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.

Fasting consists of eating only one meal, with the possibility of two smaller snacks that do not add up to a single full meal.


Catholics age 14 and older are to abstain from meat on all Fridays in Lent.

Baptism PREPARATION

- Infant baptism includes children from birth thru their 6th year (Children 7 or older must attend RCIC).
- Must be registered parishioners and attending Mass (3) months before the Baptism.
- Parents and sponsor must attend a Baptism Preparation class at the parish.
- St. Joseph offers a Baptism Preparation Class for Parents and Godparents every 3rd Saturday of each month from 9:00 AM – 12:00 Noon in classroom #4.
- Baptism can be scheduled every Saturday; there are no baptisms during Lent and Holy Week.
- Parents and/or Godparents may give a donation to the Deacon or Priest who is officiating the Sacrament.

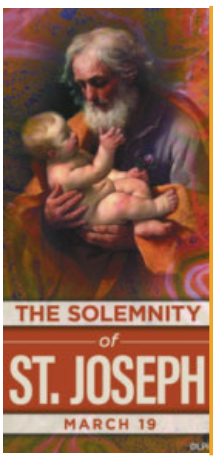

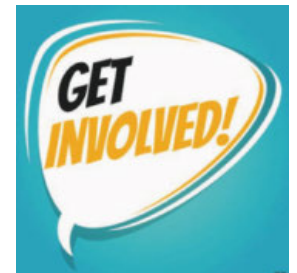
