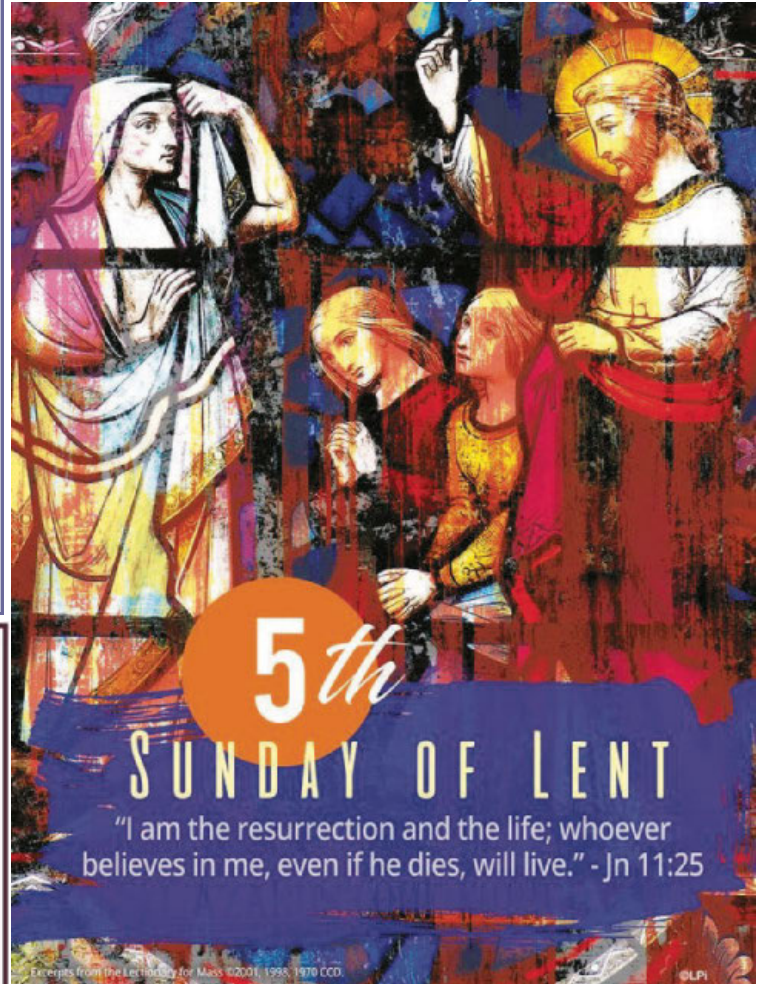

PASTORAL REFLECTION



LAZARUS, COME FORTH!

We all have been to funerals and sometimes we witness tearful and dramatic scenes, where grief-stricken loved ones cry out, just before the deceased person is laid to rest in the tomb: "Please! Wake Up and be with us again!" Of course, nothing happens and the deceased remain dead.

But in this Sunday's Gospel, we have an incredible event; a dead person rises again from the dead. What did it mean then and what does it mean to us now? What it meant then? It was clear to us that Jesus was a family friend of Martha, Mary and Lazarus. But the strange thing was that Jesus did not go right away when news of Lazarus' illness reached Jesus. Jesus waited until his friend Lazarus died. Why? Jesus gives the answer to his disciples so that then, the miracle He was going to perform, they and others would believe in Him as the Messiah sent by the Father.

The Miracle of Lazarus' resurrection showed the power of God at work in His Son. It was also meant to strengthen the belief even when his followers would witness his cruel passion and death on the cross. Secondly, it became the occasion for Jesus to give his solemn and very reassuring declaration: "I AM THE RESURRECTION AND THE LIFE, WHOEVER BELIEVES IN ME, EVEN IF HE DIES, WILL LIVE; AND EVERY ONE WHO LIVES AND BELIEVES IN ME WILL NEVER DIE."

At that time, it was intended for Martha and Mary, so that they believe in the power of Jesus, the Son of God and his gift of eternal life. What does it mean for us now? What Jesus meant for this miracle then, He likewise means it for us now, that we too believe in Him as the Messiah, the Son of God.

We hear more and more that Jesus "was just a man, a great man perhaps, but still just a man." The Gospel clearly shows that Jesus, both human and divine and that as God, has absolute power over life and death.

Secondly, his reassuring words to Martha are also meant for us; that faced with the death of our loved ones and even with our own death, we would continue to believe and hope in Christ who gives the promise of everlasting life. True enough, now we don't witness miracles, like the resurrection of Lazarus, but the Gospel foretells the resurrection of all those who believe in Christ and by His own resurrection from the dead, He conquered sin and death once and for all, and opened for us the Gate of Everlasting Life. Reflect on this. God Bless!

#16. A 'FUNNY STORY' FROM ST. JOE "ON LIFE AFTER DEATH": On one sunny day a ship was sailing on the sea. Standing on the deck were three passengers: a Christian, an atheist and a Hindu. The other passengers, who were gathered at the deck anxiously followed his progress. Finally, the Christian succeeded in saving the man onto the deck. The atheist and the Hindu went to him and said: "We supposed that you risked your life to save that man from drowning in the belief that you would be 'RESURRECTED' if you had died." "No," the Christian answered. "Why, then did you risk your life to save him?" "He owed me a Lot of Money!"
