PASTORAL REFLECTION



The question of whether or not one should pay taxes to the emperor is a legitimate, hotly debated issue. The same question is posed to Jesus as a trap. The followers of the Pharisees and the Herodians attempt at first to win Jesus over by addressing Him as “Teacher” and by heaping praises on Him. Jesus does not beat around the bush and calls a spade a spade when He calls them “hypocrites.” He knows of the malice in their hearts and their lack of interest to learn from Him.

Jesus knows that the question is formulated to incriminate Him; however, He answers. If He says YES, Jesus will be aligning Himself with Herod and the hated Romans; if No, He will win the sympathy of the crowds who are burdened with over taxation, but He will be accused of fomenting a revolution against the Romans.

Jesus asks for a coin used to pay the tax. It is different from the ordinary coin used by the Jews around Palestine. They hand Him an imperial coin stamped with the image of the emperor and the inscription “Tiberius Caesar, son of the divine Augustus.” This image and the title are unacceptable to the Jews who have vowed to recognize and worship only one God.

Whose image is this and whose inscription? When the crowd answers, ‘Caesar’s,’ Jesus replies, “Then repay to Caesar what belongs Caesar and to God what belongs to God.”

Jesus calls us to be good citizens but also reminds us that since everything belongs to God, the highest praise and honor also belong to Him.

A final thought for today. It’s Mission Sunday. “The Christian Faith remains ever young when it is open to the mission that Christ entrust to us. ‘Mission revitalizes faith’ in the words of St. John Paul II, a Pope who showed such great love and concern for young people. God Bless!

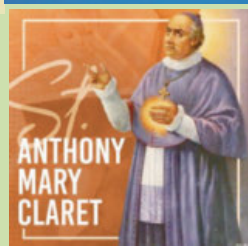
#48. A ROYAL STORY FROM ST. JOE. This story is told of a King who placed a heavy stone on the road and then hid and watch to see who would remove it. Men of various classes came and worked their way round it; some loudly blaming the king for not keeping the highways clear, but all dodging the duty of getting it out of the way. At last a poor peasant on his way to town with his burden of vegetables for sale came, and, contemplating the stone, laid down his load, and rolled down the stone into the gutter. Then looking round, he spied a purse that had lain right under the stone. He opened it and found it full of gold pieces with a note from the king saying it was for the one who would remove the stone.

Though the Pharisees wanted to trap Jesus, He taught them an important lesson on Civic Duty.

On this Sunday, we celebrate WORLD MISSION SUNDAY. On the 23rd, we remember St. John of Capistrano, Priest, and reformer of the Franciscans and Poor Clares, also patron of military chaplain. The 24th is the United Nations Day and the feast day of St. Anthony Mary Claret, Bishop and Founder of the Missionary Sons of the Immaculate Heart of Mary (C.M.F. Claretians) today numbering about 3,040; he fostered credit unions and the apostolate of the press. On the 28th, we celebrate the Feast of Ss. SIMON and JUDE, APOSTLES, and Patron Saints of our cathedral in the Diocese of Phoenix. This is all for now, watch for the next bulletin. God Bless!

I have spent many hours in adoration praying, crying, speaking, listening to our Lord. During my time in adoration, I have discerned my vocation, profession, and made many difficult and life changing decisions in the presence of our Lord. During a powerful holy hour, it was revealed to me by our Lord reasons why things had happened in my life, what I needed to do, more specifically, what the Lord was calling me to do.
