A LETTER FROM OUR PASTOR

Jesus told them this parable: "There once was a person who had a fig tree planted in his orchard, and when he came in search of fruit on it but found none, he said to the gardener, 'For three years now I have come in search of fruit on this fig tree but have found none. So cut it down. Why should it exhaust the soil?' He said to him in reply, 'Sir, leave it for this year also, and I shall cultivate the ground around it and fertilize it; it may bear fruit in the future. If not you can cut it down."

The readings this Sunday capture the essence of God's Lenten message to us, His people, offering words of compassion and mercy as well as warning of the need to repent and make the most of the gift of time He has given us.

Today's Gospel passage includes the familiar parable of the unfruitful fig tree. It is preceded by an interesting dialogue between Jesus and some people reporting the news of the day, asking for His "take" on the matter. They tell Jesus about a bloody massacre that some Galileans had suffered at the hands of Pilate. They expected Him to confirm their view that the Galileans had done something to deserve such a death. But Jesus defies their expectation, telling them that the people who died such an awful death were no more sinful than they themselves are. He goes on to say the same of another recent event in which a group of people had been killed when the tower of Siloam fell on them. They, too, Jesus says, were no more sinful than anyone else. They were simply in the wrong place at the wrong time when tragedy struck.

The point He is making is that life is precious and the gift of time on this earth

is just that — a gift. None of us knows how much time will be granted to us, so we must use this gift intentionally to glorify God and serve our neighbor.

Jesus offers the parable of the fig tree to further illustrate this truth. The owner of the orchard came searching for fruit on a fig tree he had planted in his orchard. Finding no fruit on the tree after three years, he told the gardener to cut it down. But the gardener intercedes and asks for one more year to cultivate and fertilize the tree in hopes it would bear fruit in the future. The fig tree was not dying; it simply wasn't doing much of anything at all. Can this be said of us and our lives as well?

The season of Lent is a time to reflect carefully on the way we spend our time. Do we give first priority to God, tending to our spiritual growth and sacramental life with diligence? Do we give next priority to our loved ones, focusing intentionally on them each day without distractions from phones, screens, or thoughts of work? If not, now is the moment to repent of our waste of time or of misplaced priorities on our use of time. God is merciful but just. Let's turn to Him and ask Him to make our lives fruitful while we still have time to do so.



Missionary Postulant, Daniel Lang, received a special blessing last weekend from our parish family. In a few days he will be leaving for his missionary work overseas and we send with him our prayers and best wishes. We will keep in touch with Daniel in his journey. We thank him for sharing his faith walk and how he has inspired us to keep our hearts open to the promptings of the Holy Spirit as to what God wants for each of us.

For those of our parish family that might be new to SJN, Fr. Bede Wevita was our first pastor at St. John Neumann and started this parish back in 1999. He recently went back to his home country of Sri Lanka to focus on his health. Recently Fr. Marc received this note from Fr. Bede letting us know how he is doing. We will arrange for an opportunity for those of you that want to send cards to Fr. Bede to bring them to the office and we'll send them all together.

HELLO FROM SRI LANKAa note from Fr. Bede

It has been 40 days since I returned to Sri Lanka. The reason that I came to Sri Lanka is that my kidney functions have gone down to 18 percent. If the kidney function goes further down, I need to do dialysis or a kidney transplant. I learned that finding a kidney donor from the family is better.

Not only a kidney but emotional support and care are essential too. I have incredible support from both my family and friends. Doctors and the health systems are also much more flexible and affordable.

So far, I have met a Nephrologist, Cardiologist, Surgeon, Nutritionist, and Fitness Director. They want to monitor my kidney functions and fitness for three months before deciding on the transplant prep. They believe that by changing my lifestyle (bad habits of eating/ food and not exercising), they can reverse my kidney functions. So I am following their directions by walking 5 miles a day, swimming, exercising, and having restricted meals: no salt, low phosphorus, etc. I am also working on my blood pressure, sugar, and weight. So far, I have lost 7 pounds.

There is a church where I can walk from my apartment. They have daily Mass at 6:15 in the morning and on Sunday five Masses. There are three other churches within a 3 mile radius. I watched a Sinhala movie and 2 plays at a theater after 35 years. I concelebrated at my home parish at their 157th church feast too. I am trying to improve my Sinhalese (native language), which I didn't speak for 36 years (not every day). I am also participating in a photography workshop this weekend.

I miss my American friends and the parish life tremendously. Please continue to pray for me. Thank you for your prayers and cards and emails. I appreciate them tremendously. God bless you.
