The Light of the Moon

If you own a television that has been turned on at any point in the last month or so, chances are you've caught at least a scene or two of the 1946 classic film "It's a Wonderful Life."

If you're not familiar with the movie, it follows the life of George Bailey from childhood through adulthood. A dreamer by nature, George has big plans for himself that involve world exploration and adventure — but family and community obligations keep him tethered to the same spot on the map, leading an altogether ordinary life.

One of the most memorable scenes from that movie is of George dancing with his sweetheart Mary while they sing "Buffalo Gals — Won't you come out tonight/And dance by the light of the moon?"

That lyric always catches my ear. Of course, the moon doesn't have any light of its own. All the moon has is the ability to reflect the light that shines upon it.

The same holds for us, doesn't it? Our stewardship is purely a reflection of the grace granted to us by another. "Upon you the LORD shines," writes Isaiah, "and over you appears his glory." Every good action we will ever take begins in the mind of God. The fact that we have the honor of carrying it out on His behalf is a beautiful gift. It is God that makes our ordinary lives extraordinary.

In the end of the movie, George Bailey realizes that he had a far greater life because, instead of being the hero of his own story, he allowed himself to reflect goodness onto others.

Remember — the magi didn't chart their own course. They merely followed the star.

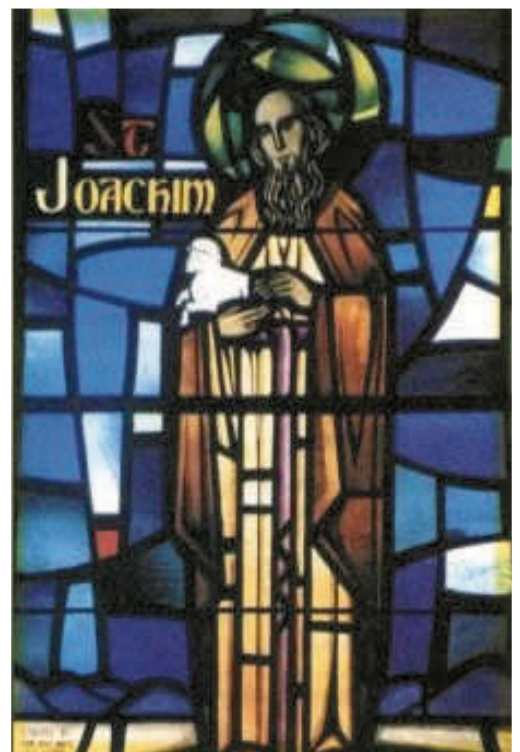

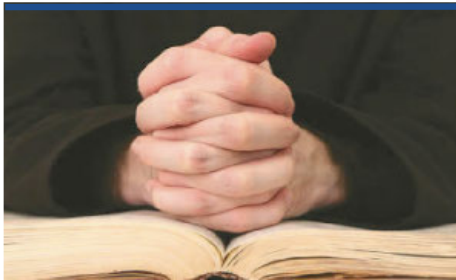

VATICAN CORNER

Pope Francis

turned 85 on December 17, 2021, and four days earlier he celebrated the 52nd anniversary of his ordination as a priest. Messages of good wishes poured in from all around the world. Cardinal Michael Czerny, led the celebration. He is a fellow Jesuit and an under-secretary of the Vatican's Migrants and Refugees Section of Human Development. He said that the Holy Father must have already had retirement plans when he went into the conclave in 2013. But the "Holy Spirit decided differently" and he was elected Pope. "we can only be very grateful" he said. Czerny wished Francis many more years to come and reflected on the important themes that Pope Francis' pontificate has championed and how they give us insight into his personality. Cardinal Czerny said the recently launched Synod on synodality, a two-year process, that is just beginning, sums up many of the cares and concern of the Holy Father, because it is "the most hopeful notion you could have about the Church." That synod (assembly) is to have the world's bishops first consult with everyone from parishioners, to monks, nuns, and Catholic universities, and then come together for a discussion in 2023. The synod's aim is to reorder the Church's internal mechanisms for discussion and reflection and to help shape a new way for the Church to articulate its self- understanding and its mission of evangelization. Cardinal Czerny said that from his personal experiences with the Pope, he has been most struck by Francis' "equilibrium, balance and serenity." He explained that "a big problem does not rattle him and a small problem does not get neglected. That kind of dynamic balance is very edifying (encouraging) and makes me very happy whenever we have the chance to meet." Two days later Pope Francis continued his birthday celebration with children from the Santa Marta Pediatric Clinic in the Vatican audience hall. The clinic is run by the Daughters of Charity of St. Vincent de Paul and they help families in need for medical care, food, clothing and diapers. Many of the parents are foreign or migrants without access to Italian government assistance or health care. There were balloons, silly hats, songs, skits, and gifts that included warm coats and sweets. There was a large birthday cake for the Pope and two of youngsters helping to present the cake, each ran their finger through the icing before the singing was over. Pope Francis said especially as Christmas approaches, he asked the children to be close to others just as Jesus is close to them, to help their friends and relatives and anyone who seems in need. And, he said, don't forget to talk to Jesus. He encouraged the children to learn to listen and to see what other people need. "Listen" is an important word, he told them. "Someone who doesn't listen to others only listens to themselves, And it's boring to only listen to yourself."

HOW TO REQUEST A MASS INTENTION

We are now accepting Mass intentions for the entire 2022 year. There are two ways that you can make a mass Intention. The easiest way to do it would be to come to the Rectory office. The office is open Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Friday from 11 AM—5 PM and Wednesday 1PM—7 PM. You may also do them on our parish website saintjoachim.net / Select the Donate/Pay in the upper right hand corner and then select mass intentions , put all your payment information in and in the comment section please put the name and the reason for the intention along with a date and time of the mass you would like your intention at. Please be sure and include your contact information so we may contact you if we have any questions. If you would like to see the intention in the bulletin, please plan at least a week in advance, however around holidays we often have to turn bulletins in early , so requesting intentions as early as possible is always recommended . Also please remember that we do not take regular mass intentions the day of the mass, only emergency intentions.

Sacraments

Baptism — We encourage you to baptize infants shortly after they are born. After the age of seven—the child would attend classes for baptism. We ask that the parents be registered at the church at least for three months before they baptize. We do group baptisms once a month in Spanish and once a month in English. Each child can have two godparents, one male and one female, or may be baptized with only one godparent. If your family wishes to have more than two godparents they are welcome to be there but would not be on the certificate. The godparents have to be at least 16 yrs. old and have received all applicable sacraments, meaning they have to be baptized, made their first communion and confirmation. If they are married, either to each other or to other people they would need to be married in the Catholic Church. They would need to give us a copy of their confirmation certificate and marriage certificate (if married). Godparents would need to have their parish priest sign the godparent form. Both parents and godparents will attend a baptism class prior to the baptism.

First Communion — You can sign your child up to begin First Communion classes to start in September of the year that they turn Seven or older. The children will attend classes for two years. Classes take place during the regular school year. Classes are available in English or Spanish. If the child is taking the classes in Spanish they would need to be able to read and write in Spanish. Children that attend their classes in English, can at your request have their First Communion mass in Spanish if they wish to. Registrations for the classes will be in July. When you come to register for class you will need to bring a copy of the child's birth certificate and baptism certificate.

Confirmation — Confirmation class like First Communion is a two year process. They can start their first year when they begin high school. Confirmation classes are in English. Registration is in July, at the same time as First Communion. Please bring copies of their birth certificate, baptism certificate and first communion certificate. Classes start in September.

Adult Confirmation — If you have reached the age of 18 and not yet been confirmed you can sign up for Adult Confirmation classes. These classes meet once a week in the evenings. Classes are available in both English and Spanish. Just like regular First Communion and Confirmation Classes, registration will begin in July. Certificate requirements would be the same— please bring copies of birth, baptism, and first communion certificates. The length of time of the class depends on the adult and where you are in your faith journey. May adults complete this sacramental preparation in about nine months.

Adult Baptism and First Communion — The process for receiving these two sacraments are similar to adult confirmation. Classes are held in the evening and are available in both English and Spanish.

Marriage — We ask for couples to plan at least six months in advance. Before you call to make an appointment with the priest you will need to contact the church that you were baptized in and request a newly printed copy of your baptism certificate and tell them that it is for the purpose of marriage. You will also need a copy of your first communion and confirmation certificates. These two can be copies of the original or newly printed. Once you have these certificates you can call to make an appointment with the Priest. Once you have met with the priest, he can then allow you to set your wedding date on the church calendar. You will also attend a marriage preparation class before your wedding.

Should you have any questions on any of the above Sacraments, please contact the Rectory office.

Sacramentos

Bautismo: Los alentamos a bautizar a los bebés poco después de que nazcan. Después de los siete años, el niño tiene que asistir a clases para el bautismo. Pedimos que los padres se registren en la iglesia al menos durante tres meses antes de bautizar. Hacemos bautismos grupales una vez al mes en español y una vez al mes en inglés. Cada niño puede tener dos padrinos, un hombre y una mujer, o puede ser bautizado con un solo padrino. Si su familia desea tener más de dos padrinos, pueden estar presentes, pero no aparecerían en el certificado. Los padrinos deben tener al menos 16 años de edad y hayan recibido todos los sacramentos aplicables, lo que significa que deben ser bautizados, hacer su primera comunión y confirmación. Si están casados, ya sea entre ellos o con otras personas, deberían estar casados por la Iglesia Católica. Tendrían que darnos una copia de su certificado de confirmación y certificado de matrimonio (si están casados). Los padrinos necesitarían que su párroco firmara el formulario de padrino. Tanto los padres como los padrinos asistirán a una clase de bautismo antes del bautismo.

Primera Comunión: puede inscribir a su hijo para que comience las clases de Primera Comunión en septiembre del año en que cumpla siete años o más. Los niños asistirán a clases durante dos años. Las clases tienen lugar durante el año escolar regular. Las clases están disponibles en inglés o español. Si el niño está tomando las clases en español, necesitará saber leer y escribir en español. Los niños que asisten a sus clases en inglés, si lo desean, pueden tener su misa de Primera Comunión en español si así lo desean. Las inscripciones a las clases serán en julio. Cuando venga a registrarse para la clase, deberá traer una copia del certificado de nacimiento y el certificado de bautismo del niño.

Confirmación: la clase de confirmación, como la primera comunión, es un proceso de dos años. Pueden comenzar su primer año cuando comienzan la escuela preparatoria. Las clases de confirmación son en inglés. La inscripción es en julio, al mismo tiempo que la Primera Comunión. Favor de traer copias de su acta de nacimiento, acta de bautismo y acta de primera comunión. Las clases comienzan en septiembre.

Confirmación para adultos: si ha cumplido 18 años y aún no ha sido confirmado, puede inscribirse en las clases de Confirmación para adultos. Estas clases se reúnen una vez a la semana por las tardes. Las clases están disponibles en inglés y español. Al igual que las clases regulares de Primera Comunión y Confirmación, el registro comenzará en julio. Los requisitos para el certificado serían los mismos: traiga copias de los certificados de nacimiento, bautismo y primera comunión. La duración de la clase depende del adulto y de dónde te encuentres en tu camino de fe. Que los adultos completen esta preparación sacramental en unos nueve meses.

Bautismo y primera comunión de adultos: el proceso para recibir estos dos sacramentos es similar a la confirmación de un adulto. Las clases se imparten por la noche y están disponibles tanto en inglés como en español.

Matrimonio: pedimos a las parejas que planifiquen con al menos seis meses de anticipación. Antes de llamar para hacer una cita con el sacerdote, deberá comunicarse con la iglesia en la que se bautizó y solicitar una copia recién impresa de su certificado de bautismo y decirles que es con el propósito de casarse. También necesitará una copia de su primera comunión y certificados de confirmación. Estos dos pueden ser copias del original o recién impresos. Una vez que tenga estos certificados, puede llamar para concertar una cita con el sacerdote. Una vez que se haya reunido con el sacerdote, él podrá permitirle fijar la fecha de su boda en el calendario de la iglesia. También asistirá a una clase de preparación matrimonial antes de su boda.

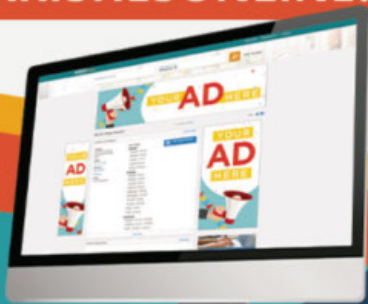
