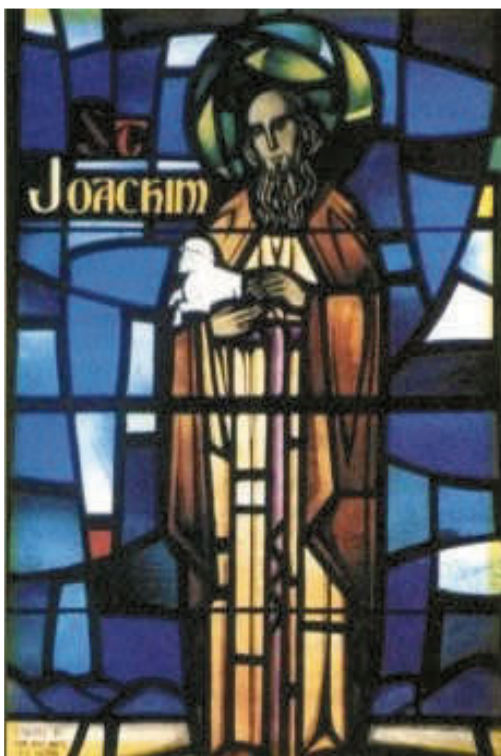

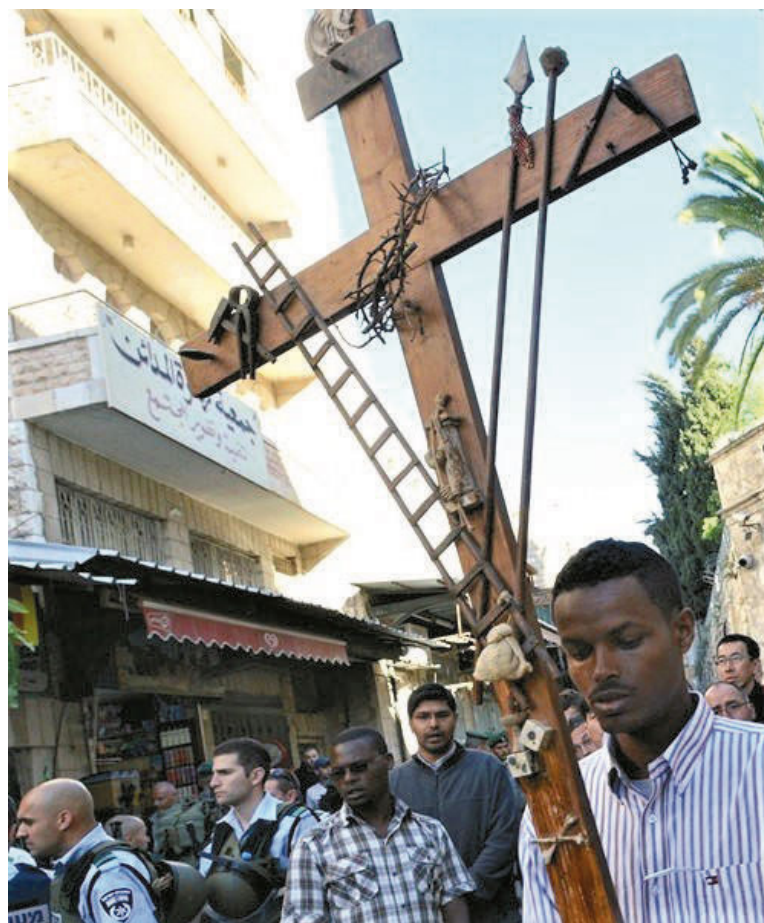

VATICAN CORNER

Every year on Good Friday, Catholic

Churches around the world take up a collection to support those Franciscan Friars who have custody of the Holy Land and are doing God's work there. Those Franciscans are responsible for the care of the Holy Places as well as the care of the Christians living there. Through many activities of solidarity such as the maintenance of spiritual guidance, education, welfare, health and social structures, those Franciscans are keeping the Christian presence alive there. This special collection originated with Pope Leo XIII in 1887, and each pope since has made it a requirement. Pope Paul VI in 1974 established Good Friday as the day for the collection to be taken up. Traditionally, sixty-five percent of the collection goes to the upkeep and repair of some 50 shrines that are dear to Christians and pilgrims of the world over, and goes to the living stones of the Holy Land, those Christians living there. Thirty-five percent of the collection goes to the Eastern Catholic Churches of the territory of the Holy Land. The territories which benefit are Jerusalem, Palestine, Israel, Jordan, Cyprus, Syria, Lebanon, Egypt, Ethiopia, Eritrea, Turkey, Iran and Iraq. Pope Francis has asked that all Catholics stand with solidarity with the Church in the Holy Land. It is the main source of sustenance for life around the Holy Places, and it is also the tool through which



those Franciscans are able to sustain and carry forward their important mission. Following a drop in donations of about 40% in 2021 amid the COVID-19 pandemic, on March 24, 2022, Cardinal Leonardo Sandri – the Prefect of the Congregation for Eastern Churches released a letter making an appeal for the support of the Good Friday collection. He said “For two consecutive years, the Christians of the Holy Land have celebrated Easter and Christmas in a sort of isolation, without the warmth and solidarity of pilgrims visiting the Holy Places and local communities. Families have suffered beyond measure, more from the lack of work than from the immediate effects of the pandemic itself. Even a small offering would be like ‘the widow’s mite’ that helps our brothers and sisters to continue to live, to hope and to offer a living witness to the World made flesh in places and on streets that saw his presence.” Cardinal Sandri said “the fund helps educational institutions such as the Pontifical Oriental Institute and Bethlehem University, which has almost 3,300 students, as well as the schools of the Latin Patriarchate of Jerusalem”. “Extraordinary aid went to countries such as Syria, Ethiopia, Egypt and Lebanon.” “The Middle East continues to live in instability and tension.” “There are people who have no food, others who lack medical treatment, children and youth without schools, and then those orphaned, wounded, and widowed by war.” “Ever since the end of February 2020 we have found ourselves without pilgrims, and this means serious economic difficulties for the local Christian communities, for the Christian families, and also for the Custody. In the meantime, we are trying to continue the mission that has been entrusted to us, knowing that Divine Providence which has willed our presence here will continue to take care of us.” Cardinal Sandri noted that when Pope Francis visited Iraq last year he invited Catholics to live in greater solidarity with their brothers and sisters in the Middle East. Sandri said “let us give new vigor to the practice of the Collection for the Holy Land.” “In Jerusalem, Bethlehem, Nazareth, and in many other shrines and monasteries, prayer is offered for the Church all over the world, and we are invited to remember with the heart and with a small gift all those who pronounce our name before the Lord, giving thanks for our generosity. It is vital that we lend our support to this cause in order to maintain a Christian presence in the very land made holy by the life, death and Resurrection of Jesus. Like Simon of Cyrene, who helped carry the cross for Jesus, we can help carry the cross too under very difficult circumstances in the Holy Land. Please be generous.

EVERYDAY STEWARDSHIP - RECOGNIZE GOD IN YOUR ORDINARY MOMENTS

A God Who Knows How It Feels

Christ could have spoken anything from the cross, so why did he choose to recite Psalm 22? And why is it so important that we recite that same Psalm at today's Mass? "My God, my God, why have You abandoned me?"

We've never known the Jesus of the Gospels to doubt the will of God. We've never known him to be a defeatist or to give into feelings of despair. He's the hero who walks on water, the Savior who is welcomed to Jerusalem with a pathway of palms. And he knows how this story ends; he knows full well that his Father has absolutely not abandoned him.

So why does he say this? Jesus doesn't make offhanded comments, especially in his last hour. Today, when we repeat the words that he calls out in his darkest moment, we must remember that he wants us, very particularly, to consider them. With his crucifixion, Jesus reminds us of his humanity. He is a man of flesh that can be torn and blood that can be shed. Somehow, in tandem with his divinity, he still possesses a heart that knows fear and pain and longing. And with this seemingly hopeless cry, he reminds us of that.

Let us never doubt that Jesus can relate to us in our brokenness. This is the week, friends. This is the week that reminds us that our God is a God who knows every pang, every trembling, and every uncertainty of human life. Our God knows what abandonment feels like. He knows what rejection feels like. He knows what it is to keep going when the strength and the will has disappeared. — Tracy Earl Welliver, MTS ©LPI

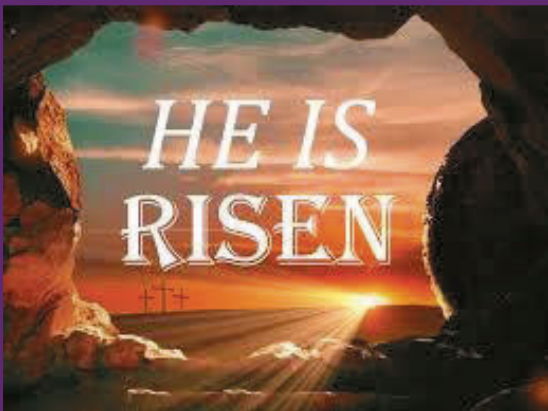
