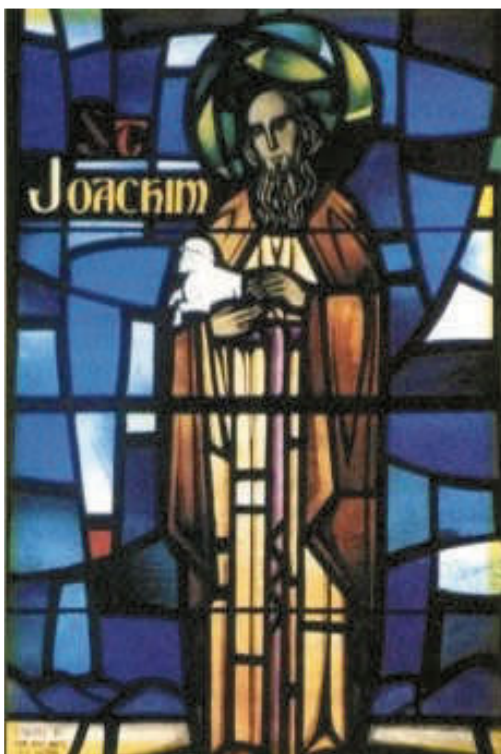

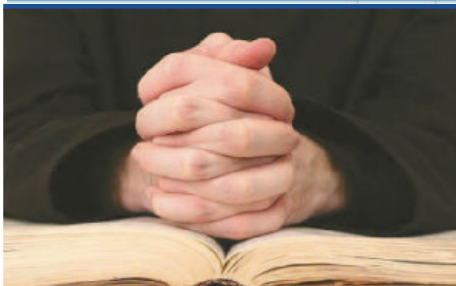

VATICAN CORNER

The Stations of the Cross, Via Crucis, and Via Dolorosa, are all names used for the same pictures or tableaux representing certain scenes in the Passion of Christ. Each scene corresponds to a particular incident, or special form of devotion which recalls the last stage of the journey that Jesus walked in his earthly life. The object of the Stations is to help the faithful to make in spirit, a pilgrimage to the chief places of Christ's suffering and death in the Holy Land of Jerusalem. It enables us more literally to obey Christ's command to take up our cross and follow him. The Stations has become one of the most popular of Catholic devotions. In Spain in the first half of the seventeenth century, especially in Franciscan communities, the present form of the Stations was developed, with its fourteen scenes placed in order. In the past the number of stations varied considerably in different places, but now the fourteen are found in almost every church.



At the present day, one of the most popularly attended Via Crucis is the one in the Colosseum in Rome. Every Friday the devotion of the Stations is conducted publicly by a Franciscan Father. Every year on the evening of Good Friday, the pope goes to the Colosseum to participate. On the evening of April 15, 2022 more than 10,000 people gathered outside the Roman Colosseum praying with Pope Francis for peace at the Way of the Cross. Francis had asked families to write the series of prayers and reflections for the 14 stations based on their actual experiences carrying difficult "crosses" in their life. Such Experiences as the loss of a family member, infertility, illness and disability, migration, etc., and the hope they seek from their faith. At the 13th Station – Jesus dies on the cross and Pope Francis asked a Ukrainian family and a Russian family to reflect on the tragedy of death, loss, and war. A few days before the event the meditation that they wrote was published and it said that they see "Death everywhere" and families ask, "Where are you, Lord? ... We want our life back as before ... What wrong did we do? Why did you break up our families like this?" "We know that you love us, Lord, but we don't feel this love, and it drives us to desperation." "Teach us to be peacemakers, brothers and sisters, and to rebuild what bombs tried to destroy." The plan was to have a Ukrainian woman and a Russian woman carry the cross together for this Station. Archbishop Sviatoslav Shevchuk, major archbishop of the Ukrainian Catholic Church asked Pope Francis not to have the women do this because he thought the idea "untimely, ambiguous and such that it does not take into account the context of Russia's military aggression against Ukraine." After the objection, Pope Francis decided to change the meditation to calling for a moment of silence: "In the face of death, silence is more eloquent than words. Let us pause in prayerful silence and each person pray in their hearts for peace in the world." However, the cross was still carried by two young women – Albina from Russia, and Irina from the Ukraine, and they didn't say a word, they carrying together was a gesture of peace. Both women have been friends for years while they have been studying nursing in Rome. The COVID-19 pandemic solidified their friendship during the long difficult months. In an interview they said that despite the war, their feelings of mutual appreciation haven't changed. They appreciate each other as people, as women, and as professionals in the service of saving lives, and they share "the suffering of the two peoples." Irina said "No one deserves to live under bombs, and children should not wake up in an anti-aircraft bunker."

Divine Mercy Sunday

Question:

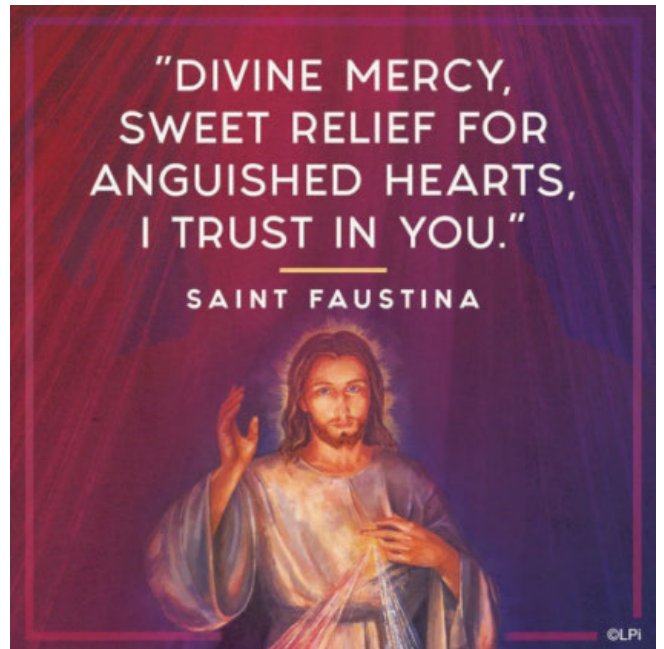
Where did the feast of Divine Mercy come from?

Answer:

If you were born well before the year 2000, you know the feast of Divine Mercy has not always been celebrated in the Church. In the early 1900s, a young Polish nun began receiving private revelations. Jesus appeared to her during her times of prayer, speaking a message of mercy and love for the world. She received a set of prayers — the Divine Mercy Chaplet — and the request to have a feast day established to remind the Church of the mercy of God. St. Faustina died in 1938, on the cusp of war and in the midst of one of the most violent centuries in the history of the world.

Her story and her diaries began circulating in Poland and beyond. It quickly became apparent that this was a holy young woman, and the cause for her canonization opened. In the year 2000, she was canonized by the first-ever Polish pope, St. John Paul II. On her canonization day, he established the second Sunday of Easter as Divine Mercy Sunday, “a perennial invitation to the Christian world to face, with confidence in divine benevolence, the difficulties and trials that mankind with experience in the years to come.”

Domingo de la Divina Misericordia

Pregunta:

¿De dónde viene la fiesta de la Divina Misericordia?

Responder:

Si naciste mucho antes del año 2000, sabes que la fiesta de la Divina Misericordia no siempre se ha celebrado en la Iglesia. A principios del siglo XX, una joven monja polaca comenzó a recibir revelaciones privadas. Jesús se le apareció durante sus momentos de oración, hablándole un mensaje de misericordia y amor por el mundo. Recibió un conjunto de oraciones, la Coronilla de la Divina Misericordia, y la solicitud de establecer un día de fiesta para recordar a la Iglesia la misericordia de Dios. Santa Faustina murió en 1938, al borde de la guerra y en medio de uno de los siglos más violentos de la historia del mundo.

Su historia y sus diarios comenzaron a circular en Polonia y más allá. Rápidamente se hizo evidente que se trataba de una joven santa, y se abrió la causa para su canonización. En el año 2000, fue canonizada por el primer Papa polaco, San Juan Pablo II. El día de su canonización, instituyó el segundo domingo de Pascua como Domingo de la Divina Misericordia, “una invitación perenne al mundo cristiano a afrontar, con confianza en la benevolencia divina, las dificultades y pruebas que la humanidad vivirá en los años venideros”.
