What is Confession ? *part one*

Confession is a sacrament instituted by Jesus Christ in His love and mercy to offer sinners forgiveness for offenses committed against God. At the same, sinners reconcile with the Church, because it also wounded by our sins. We know this sacrament by various names : penance, confession or reconciliation.

This is good news for all of us, because we all are sinners and in need of God forgiveness. In the Sacrament of Penance, we meet Christ in the person of the priest, ready and eager to absolve us and restore us to new life. We confess our sins to God through His minister, the priest, who absolves us in the name of Christ. WHY SHOULD WE CONFESS? The Sacrament of Reconciliation is a sacrament of healing and a sacrament of conversion, returning us to the Father after our sin. We are to confess serious sins at least once a year; those aware of committing a mortal sin must receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation before receiving Holy Communion.

The Church also encourages us to go to confession more frequently, if possible in order that we might deepen our relationship with God and grow in humility and virtue. Most people go to confession every first Friday or first Saturday of every month, in honor of the Sacred Heart of

Jesus and Immaculate Heart of Mary respectively. (*next part—

Confesamos nuestros pecados a Dios por su ministro, el sacerdote, que nos absuelve en el nombre de Cristo. ¿POR QUÉ DEBEMOS CONFESAR? el sacramento de La reconciliación es un sacramento de curación y un sacramento de conversión, devolviéndonos al Padre después de nuestro pecado. estamos para confesar pecados graves al menos una vez al año: los conscientes de cometer cometiendo un pecado mortal debe recibir el Sacramento de la Reconciliación antes de recibir la Sagrada Comunión. La Iglesia también nos anima a confesarnos con más frecuencia, si es posible para que podamos profundizar nuestra relación con Dios y crecer en la humildad y la virtud. La mayoría de la gente va a confesarse cada primer viernes o primer sábado de cada mes, en honor al Sagrado Corazón de Jesús e Inmaculado Corazón de María respectivamente. 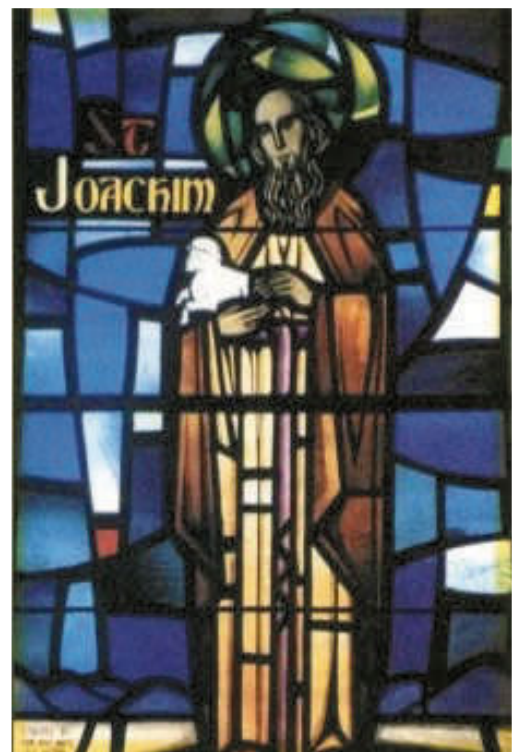

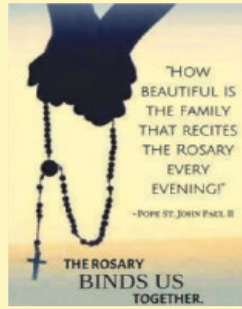

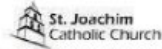
Come Pray the Rosary with us !

VATICAN CORNER

After a seven-year inquiry, a report

published in 2015 by the Truth and Reconciliation Commission of Canada concluded that at least 4,100 children died while attending residential compulsory boarding schools funded by the Canadian government and run by religious authorities during the 19th and 20th centuries. The children were taken from their families and many of the schools were Catholic –run. The goal of those schools was to assimilate indigenous youth into Euro-Canadian culture. However, as a result, lives were disrupted,

many of those children suffered neglect and abuse, and serious long-term problems were caused from this misguided goal of the schools. An estimated 150,000 First Nation Inuit and Métis children attended these schools and the Commission described the system as a “cultural genocide”. Since the last residential school closed in 1996, former students have demanded recognition and compensation resulting in a 2007 government settlement agreement and a formal apology by Canada’s prime minister. In early 2021, a discovery of the remain of an estimated 215 children, some as young as 3 years old ,were found in unmarked graves on the grounds of the former Catholic-run residential schools in Kamloops, British Columbia. The discovery drew new public attention to this tragedy. In June, Pope Francis joined with the Canadian bishops to express “closeness” to traumatized Canadians” over the discovery of these remains. The Canadian bishops published a statement of apology in September, 2021 and acknowledged that “grave abuses” had been committed by some in the Catholic community, and they expressed their “profound remorse”. The bishops expressed their commitment to walk with the Indigenous People along the pathway of hope and away from the residential school tragedy by making a nation-wide collective financial commitment of \$30 million to support healing and reconciliation initiatives for survivors, their families and their communities. In April, 2022, a delegation of survivors, knowledge keepers, elders and young indigenous people traveled from Canada and met with Pope Francis at the Vatican. The trip had been planned for December, but was delayed because of the fears of the potential spread of the new Omicron coronavirus variant. The Pope attended a week of meets with the delegation of 30. He listened to their stories, begged their forgiveness and apologized for the “deplorable” abuses children suffered in Canada’s Catholic-run residential schools. Francis also promised to accepted their invitation to continue the journey of healing and reconciliation by visiting Indigenous peoples in their homeland in Canada. ... to be continued
