

How to make a good Confession. part two

Three acts are required from the penitent for forgiveness through the Sacrament. These are contrition, confession and satisfaction.

CONTRITION: is sincere sorrow for having offended God, the most important act of the penitent. There can be no forgiveness of sin if we do not have sorrow and a firm resolve to not repeat our sin.

CONFESSION: requires confronting our sins in a profound way before God by acknowledging them aloud to a priest.

SATISFACTION: is the "penance" the priest imposes on the penitent to make amends for sin, an important part of our healing.

Confession is difficult, but it does require preparation. WE should begin with prayer, placing ourselves in the presence of God, our loving Father. We seek healing and forgiveness through repentance and a resolve to sin no more. Then we review our lives since our last confession, searching out thoughts, words, and actions that did not conform to God's love, to His law, or to the laws of the Church. This review is called an "examination of conscience". To make examination of conscience we should:

- ~ begin with prayer asking God's help.
- ~~ review our lives with the help of some guiding questions.
- ~~ tell God we are truly sorry for our sins.



~ make a firm resolution to avoid sin. (next part: steps in the Rite of Reconciliation)

Cómo hacer una buena

confesión. *la segunda parte*Se requieren tres actos del penitencia para el perdón a través del Sacramen-

to. Estos son la contrición, la confesión y la satisfacción.

CONTRICIÓN: es el dolor sincero por haber ofendido a Dios, el acto más importante del penitente. No puede haber perdón de pecados si no tenemos dolor y una firme resolución de no repetir nuestro pecado.

CONFESIÓN: requiere confrontar nuestros pecados de manera profunda ante Dios reconociéndolos en voz alta ante un sacerdote.

SATISFACCIÓN: es la "penitencia" que el sacerdote impone al penitente para reparar el pecado, parte importante de nuestra curación.

La confesión es difícil, pero requiere preparación. Debemos comenzar con la oración, poniéndonos en la presencia de Dios, nuestro Padre amoroso. Buscamos la curación y el perdón a través del arrepentimiento y la resolución de no pecar más. Luego repasamos nuestra vida desde nuestra última confesión, buscando pensamientos, palabras y acciones que no se ajustaban al amor de Dios, a su ley oa las leyes de la Iglesia. Esta revisión se denomina "examen de conciencia". Para hacer examen de conciencia debemos:

- ~ comience con una oración pidiendo la ayuda de Dios.
- ~ revisar nuestras vidas con la ayuda de algunas preguntas orientadoras.
- ~ Dile a Dios que realmente nos arrepentimos de nuestros pecados.
- ~ hacer una resolución firme para evitar el pecado. (siguiente parte: pasos en el Rito de la Reconciliación)





VATICAN CORNER ... continued Pope Francis made a

"penitential pilgrimage" to Canada on July 24 through July 30, 2022, with stops in Edmonton, Quebec and in the Arctic city of lagaluit, the capital of Nunavut Territory. Francis called it a "visit like no other." The trip was for the purpose of apologizing in person, on Canadian soil, for abuses to Indigenous people and their ancestors who suffered from Catholic missionaries and from the cooperation by many members of the local churches, in the notorious government-funded residential school system. Wherever he



went, Pope Francis apologized, begging humbly for forgiveness for the evil committed by so many Christians against the Indigenous Peoples and who suffered attempts to have their culture and identity erased. Pope Francis spoke his native Spanish and it was translated into English and into several indigenous languages. At one ceremony the Pope gave back the children's moccasins that he had received from the Indigenous delegation that earlier in the year had come to the Vatican to see him. The moccasins were meant to represent children who never came home from residential schools, and the delegation wanted him to return them in person. At Sacred Heart Church in Edmonton the Pope's chair at the front of the church was under wooden teepee poles. The parishioners sang hymns in English and Indigenous languages and offered gifts of a sash, guilt and artwork. Pope Francis said he was delighted to see the church community made up of both Indigenous and non-Indigenous people. In a news conference, Indigenous chiefs from four First Nations in Alberta spoke about what the Pope's apology meant to their people and their gratefulness to the world for bearing witness to the historic moment. But there were mixed reactions from other Indigenous about the Pope's apologies, and a smaller crowd than expected came to the Pope's Mass in the outdoor stadium. The Pope explained his Canadian journey was undertaken "to write a new page," and continue to walk together, always closer, with the indigenous peoples. He said that on the one hand, some men and women of the Church "were decisive and courageous supporters of the dignity of the indigenous peoples, coming to their defense and contributing to raising awareness of their languages and cultures," "But, on the other hand, there was unfortunately no shortage of those who participated in programs that today we understand are unacceptable and contrary to the Gospel." He said "In the name of Jesus, may this never happen again in the Church" He also acknowledged the Church's wrongs of the past, and rejects the belief in colonization, and instead how it now promotes indigenous cultures.


