COMMUNION IN THE HAND

Receiving the Body of Christ in the hand does not always feel easy for us, in fact sometimes it causes us problems. Perhaps it is because we may consider that we are not worthy to receive the divinity of Christ, of having God Himself in the form of bread. If we followed these instructions to the letter, then we must question ourselves as to which part of our body is really cleansed from sin enough to receive the Lord. The answer is logical. It does not imply any disrespect to the divinity of Christ, to His body, to be receiving Him in the hand. Rather, it is gratitude before a God who, despite our insecurities to receive Christ in our hand it is important that we identify and believe, and feel worthy to have the Body of Christ that is given to us in our hand. This speaks of how it is God, and what He is. Furthermore, this tradition of communion in the hand, dates from the year 386 and Saint Cyril, Bishop of Jerusalem spoke of this with his mystagogy (to lead through the mystery) catechesis, which is being guided into this Mystery. Receiving communion in the hand is not a matter of indignity or lack of respect, is also a form of personal responsibility to live according to what we RECEIVE.

SPIRITUAL COMMUNION PRAYER

My Jesus, I believe that you are present in the most Blessed Sacrament. I love You above all things and I desire to receive You into my soul. Since I cannot now receive You sacramentally, come at least spiritually into my heart. I embrace You as if You have already come, and unite myself wholly to You. Never permit me to be separated from You. Amen

COMUNION EN LA MANO

El recibir el Cuerpo de Cristo en la mano no siempre nos es fácil, de hecho a veces nos causa problemas. Quizá porque consideramos que no somos dignos de recibir la divinidad de Cristo, de tener en ella a Dios mismo hecho pan. Si siguiéramos este argumento al pie de la letra habría que cuestionarse respecto a qué parte de nuestro cuerpo está limpio de pecado para con ello recibir al Señor. La respuesta es lógica. No implica ninguna falta de respeto a la divinidad de Cristo, a su cuerpo, el recibirlo en la mano. Es más bien la gratitud ante un Dios que, a pesar de que no somos dignos de tenerlo en nuestra mano, es importante identificar y creer, y sentirnos dignos de recibir el Cuerpo que se nos da en la mano, y lo comulgamos. Eso habla de cómo es Dios, de lo que es él. Además, esta tradición de comunión en la mano, data desde el año 386 y san Cirilo, obispo de Jerusalén hablaba ya de

ella en sus catequesis mistagógicas. El recibir la comunión en la mano, no es cuestión de indignidad o falta de respeto, es también una forma de tomar la responsabilidad propia de vivir conforme a lo que Recibimos.



VATICAN CORNER

The Vatican's Anima Mundi Ethnological Museum is located just

before the main Museum's exit, and is one of the least-visited collections, but for some it is becoming the place of a battlefield. The Museum contains tens of thousands of artifacts and art made by Indigenous peoples from around the world. Much of those items were sent to Rome by Catholic missionaries for an exhibition in the Vatican gardens in1925. There are masks, embroidered animal skins, carved walrus tusks, a kayak, war clubs, wampum belts, and feathered headdresses to mention just a few. They were given as gifts to Pope Pius XI who wanted to celebrate the Church's global reach with its missionaries by showing off items from the evangelized Indigenous peoples. Now some Indigenous peoples are saying they want the items returned and that the items belong to the Indigenous. They say they are part of their culture and they question if the items were



offered freely or were taken. Returning Indigenous and colonial-era artifacts to their places of origin has become a pressing debate for museums across Europe. Does all culture form part of a global heritage that should be available to everyone, even after centuries of war and colonization? For some Indigenous, the material remnants of past lives are very real connections to their history and their ancestors. Do museums see cultural works by Indigenous peoples only as natural history, to be filed away like rocks, rather than treated as a vital culture? Should the Indigenous be given back items of their culture to let them display and honor them in more appropriate ways than the museums? Indigenous people have had some successes campaigning for the return of human remains. Sacred objects held by the museums are more likely to continue to be held. Museums need to work with the Indigenous on displays and interpretation for the public viewing. Some Indigenous are questioning the Vatican's relation to Indigenous communities today. When opening the remodeled Anima Mundi gallery in 2019 with artifacts from Oceania and a temporary Amazon exhibit, Pope Francis said items were cared for "with the same passion reserved for the masterpieces of the Renaissance or the immortal Greek and Roman statues." However, the Anima Mundi Museum is easy to miss. Official tours don't include it and the audio guide that includes two dozen museums and galleries ignores it completely. Private guides say they rarely take visitors there because there are no explanation signs on display cases or wall text panels. An Aboriginal exhibit at the Museum in 2010 was criticized for being a beautiful display but without information labels and therefor "culturally diminished" and only showing exoticness. Critics say the Vatican should focus on granting Indigenous scholars full access to the collection and ultimately, bringing items back home. Indigenous peoples say pieces hold their history and hold the energy of their ancestors. The injustices of colonization cannot be undone even if every object in every museum were returned. The goal for a museum should be to honor and nurture the cultural heritage of Indigenous peoples and at the same time promote cross-cultural communication.


