# Common Mistakes Catholics Make during Mass

The mass is a sacrament and also a sacrifice in which Jesus Christ Body and Soul and Blood and Divinity are contained and receive under the appearance of bread and wine.

The mass was instituted by Jesus Christ on Holy Thursday , during the Last Supper.

The Mass is divided into two parts

The Liturgy of the Word and the Liturgy of the Eucharist.

Let us now highlight the **common mistakes** made by Catholics during the celebration of the Holy Mass

1. Improper Attire -This is very common nowadays. Some church goers thought that they were going for a beach party or a walk in the park or in a basketball court; still others, they are unaware of the scandal they create because of very revealing dress or pant. We should be aware that we are to attend a religious celebration and therefore we should dress proper to the occasion, wear your Sunday best!!

2. Sitting before the Priest sits—in the Mass the presider is the representative of Christ in that Mass and it is inappropriate for the congregation to sit before he does. After the Priest has said the opening prayers and it 's time for the Mass readings, the congregation has to wait for the presider to sit before they do, unless in some situations where the priest asks the congregation to sit.

3. Making the sign of the cross repeatedly in the Mass—This is the mistake that many Catholic make most of the time. Making the sign of the cross repeatedly during Mass, especially after receiving the sacred hosts on Holy Communion, which is very wrong. The sign of the cross is made at only two parts of the Mass, in the beginning and at the end. The threefold small sign of the cross when the gospel is being proclaimed is made to prepare our intellect, our lips, and our mind to listen attentively to the Gospel. Errores comunes que cometen los católicos durante la misa

La misa es un sacramento y también un sacrificio en el que Jesucristo Cuerpo, Alma, Sangre y Divinidad están contenidos y recibidos bajo la apariencia de pan y vino.

La misa fue instituida por Jesucristo el Jueves Santo, durante la Última Cena.

La misa se divide en dos partes.

La Liturgia de la Palabra y la Liturgia de la Eucaristía.

Resaltemos ahora los **errores comunes** cometidos por los católicos durante la celebración de la Santa Misa.

1. Vestimenta Inapropiada – Esto es muy común hoy en día. Algunos asistentes a la iglesia piensan que van a una fiesta en la playa oa un paseo por el parque oa una cancha de basketball; otros más, desconocen el escándalo que arman por llevar un vestido o pantalón muy revelador. Debemos ser conscientes de que vamos a asistir a una celebración religiosa y por lo tanto debemos vestirnos apropiadamente para la ocasión, lucir lo mejor del domingo!!

**2. Sentarse antes de que se siente el Sacerdote:** en la Misa, el sacerdote es el representante de Cristo en esa Misa y es inapropiado que la congregación se siente antes que él.

Después de que el sacerdote haya dicho las oraciones de apertura y sea el momento de las lecturas de la Misa, la congregación debe esperar a que el sacerdote se siente antes de hacerlo, a Errores comunes que cometen los católicos durante la misa menos que en algunas situaciones el sacerdote le pida a la congregación que se siente.

3. Hacer la señal de la cruz repetidamente en la Misa. Este es el error que muchos católicos cometen la mayor parte del tiempo. Hacer la señal de la cruz repetidamente durante la Misa, especialmente después de recibir las sagradas hostias en la Sagrada Comunión, lo cual está muy mal. La señal de la cruz se hace en sólo dos partes de la Misa, al principio y al final.

La triple señal pequeña de la cruz cuando se proclama el evangelio se hace para preparar nuestro intelecto, nuestros labios y nuestra mente para escuchar atentamente el evangelio.
