## VATICAN CORNER

Pope Francis answered reporter's questions Nov. 6, 2022, during the in-flight press conference held on his return trip to Rome from Bahrain. One reporter asked if meetings with Muslim religious leaders are a path that is bearing tangible fruit? He explained that the Lord inspired this path. Three years earlier when he met with the Great Imam in Abu Dhabi, as a gesture of friendship, they unexpectedly decided to have lunch together. Someone at the lunch had the idea to make a document about the encounter. Francis said he didn't even know the Great Imam's name, but it was the Lord who inspired the encounter and he and the Imam have become friends. The document was the basis of his writing *Fratelli tutti* about human friendship. He said this writing is still relevant today, and work is being done to make it known. Francis was asked about women's equality. He recalled that in his native Argentina and in the United States, women long struggled for the right to vote. He asked "why today in the world we cannot stop the tragedy of genital mutilation of young girls? He labeled that practice sometimes done in Africa, Asia and the Middle East, as both "terrible" and a "crime." He said God created men and women equal but that is still not universally found. "A society that is unable to give the woman her place does not move forward." "They know how to run things in another way, which is not inferior, it is complementary." Francis did not specifically comment on the current Iranian protests over women's situations in that country, but he cited his own record of naming more women to head Vatican offices. He said "we have to keep fighting for (equality), because women are a gift." A reporter asked the Pope if he could tell us anything about how Ukraine peace negotiations are going. Francis said work is being done to get closer, to seek solutions. The Holy See always does what it has to do with regards to prisoners and the preaching for peace. He referred to the Ukraine as "tormented" from the cruelty, not by the Russian people, but by the mercenaries and soldiers who go off to war as an adventure ... "I have great affection for the Russian people and I also have great affection for the Ukrainian people. When I was eleven years old, there was a priest close to me who celebrated in Ukrainian and had no altar boys, and he taught me to serve Mass in Ukrainian, and all these Ukrainian songs I know them in their language because I learned them as a child. So I have a very great affection for the Ukrainian liturgy. I am in the midst of two peoples that I love." He called this a world war, because it is true that when empires, either on one side or the other weaken, they need to make a war in order to feel strong – and also to sell weapons! Francis spoke of other on-going wars in Yemen, Myanmar, Syria, Lebanon and how tragic it is. He spoke of visiting Piave, Italy where his grandfather had been in WWI and seeing all the grave of young men and how he cried, and how he saw all the graves of the American boys at the Anzio landings and how he cried. He asked all the journalists at the press conference to "be pacifists, speak out against wars, fight against war. I ask you as a brother. Thank you."

Today we celebrate the last Sunday of the Liturgical Year, known as the *Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe*. We began moving toward this goal with the First Sunday of Advent. Today we have reached it. Given the fact that the Liturgical Year represents our own life in miniature, this experience reminds us, and even more educates us, that we are on a journey toward an encounter with Jesus, when He will come as the King and Lord of life. The coming we are now awaiting is His second coming. His first coming was in the humility of a Child laid in a manger.

Pope Pius XI instituted this feast in 1925 with his encyclical *Quas primas* ("In the first") to respond to growing secularism and atheism. He recognized that attempting to "thrust Jesus Christ and his holy law" out of public life would result in continuing discord among people and nations. This solemnity reminds us that while governments come and go, Christ reigns as King forever.

Pope Pius XI proclaimed that the best way to defeat injustice was by acknowledging the kingship of Christ. "For people are instructed in the truths of faith, and brought to appreciate the inner joys of religion far more effectually by the annual celebration of our sacred mysteries than by any official pronouncement of the teaching of the Church. Such pronouncements usually reach only a few and the more learned among the faithful; feasts reach them all; the former speak but once, the latter speak every year - in fact, forever. Hoy celebramos el último domingo del Año Litúrgico, conocido como la Solemnidad de Nuestro Señor Jesucristo, Rey del Universo. Comenzamos a avanzar hacia esta meta con el Primer Domingo de Adviento. Hoy lo hemos logrado. Dado que el Año Litúrgico representa nuestra propia vida en miniatura, esta experiencia nos recuerda, y más aún nos educa, que estamos en camino hacia el encuentro con Jesús, cuando Él vendrá como Rey y Señor de la vida. La venida que ahora estamos esperando es su segunda venida. Su primera venida fue en la humildad de un niño acostado en un presebre.

"Porque la gente es instruida en las verdades de la fe, y llevada a apreciar las alegrías internas de la religión mucho más eficazmente por la celebración anual de nuestros sagrados misterios que por cualquier pronunciamiento oficial de la enseñanza de la Iglesia. Dichos pronunciamientos suelen llegar sólo a unos pocos y los más eruditos entre los fieles; las fiestas les alcanzan a todos; los primeros hablan solo una vez, los últimos hablan todos los años, de hecho, para siempre. La enseñanza de la iglesia afecta principalmente a la mente; sus fiestas afectan tanto la mente como el corazón. fuentes: *USCCB.org, vaticannews.va*
