


VATICAN CORNER

Pope Francis made a rare personal getaway on October

19 & 20, 2022 to visit for the first time since becoming Pope, his father's birthplace, the agricultural town of Portacomaro, located 6 miles east of the city of Asti, in the Piedmont region of northern Italy. The occasion was to celebrate the 90th birthday of his second cousin Carla Rabezzana. Pope Francis' father, Mario Jose Francisco Bergoglio and his father's parents immigrated from Portacomaro to Buenos Aires, Argentina in 1929 to join other relatives there. Francis's father met and married Regina Maria Sivori whose family had earlier also emigrated from Italy, and Jorge Mario Bergoglio, the



future Pope Francis, was born 8 years later. As a way of coping with poverty, the lack of land, overpopulation, and natural disaster, fourteen million Italians immigrated to foreign countries from 1876 to 1915. During the 19TH century, more Italians migrated to South America than North America. Many never planned to stay permanently; they desired an opportunity to work for a living, hoping to save enough money to return to a better life in the country of their birth. Only 20 to 30 percent returned to Italy permanently. Today over 60% of Argentina's population has Italian heritage! Pope Francis has made a feature of his papacy: the welcoming and integration of migrants. In October, 2022 he recognized the historical significance of the emigrant experience with the canonization of St. Giovanni Battista Scalabrini, an Italian bishop who founded an order to help Italian emigrants at the end of the 19th century, and St. Artemide Zatti, an Italian who immigrated to Argentina during the same time period, and dedicated his work to helping the sick. Francis began his visit to Portacomaro with a lunch at the home of his cousin, Carla Rabezzana, and her children, and grandchildren present. After lunch Francis visited a nearby home for the aged and then went to the little village of Tigliole to visit another second cousin, Delia Gai. The next day the cousins and their families joined an estimated 4,000 people for Mass with the Pope in the cathedral at Asti. In Francis' homily, he used some words in the Piedmont dialect that his grandmother had taught him. The Mass celebrated the end of the Liturgical Year, known as the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus, King of the Universe. The Pope described how the kingship of Christ is different from any idea people usually have of a king, "He appears as a slave executed by those in power." Accusing no one, "he opens his arms to all. That is how he shows himself to be our king: with open arms." At the beginning of the Mass, Stefano Accornero, a local seminarian, was installed in the ministry of acolyte (assistant to priest & deacon). Pope Francis, departing from his prepared homily and told Stefano and anyone else preparing for the priesthood: "Do not forget that this is your model: do not cling to honors, no. This is your model; if you do not think of being a priest like this king, better stop here." "Ours is not an unknown God, up in the heavens, powerful and distant, but rather a God who is close. Closeness is God's style; he is close with tenderness and mercy, tender and compassionate, his open arms console and caress us. That is our king!" 


