Blessing

Today, January 29th is the First Day of Catholic Schools Week. All are invited to the formal Blessing of our new Kindergarten building after the 10:30 mass, January 29, 2023. After the blessing you are invited to the Open House of the School.



Blessing of the Candles — February 2, 2023—8:30 AM Mass



Have your candles blessed at Mass on Thursday February 2nd at the 8:30 morning mass. Every Catholic household should have at least one or more blessed candles.

These candles should be of pure bees' wax. Other kinds, such as paraffin wax and electric candles will not answer the purpose of candles prescribed by the Church. The best time to bless your candles would be the 2nd of February. This day has been chosen by the Church for a very important ceremony, the solemn blessing of candles, whence the day is often called Candlemas — the Mass of the candles. The prayers which are used in this blessing during the Mass are quaint and beautiful, and express well the mind of the Church and the symbolic meaning of the candles. All are invited to bring their candles for blessing at this mass. The above candles are available to be purchased in the Rectory office.

Blessing of the Throats — February 3, 2023—8:30 AM Mass

Have your throats blessed on the feast of St. Blaise during the morning mass. We celebrate the feast of Saint Blaise, who was bishop of Sebaste in Armenia in the fourth century. Before being martyred, he is said to have healed a boy who was choking. Since the eighth century, Saint Blaise has been venerated as the patron of those who suffer from diseases of the throat. We pray in a special way for protection from afflictions of the throat and from other illnesses. The blessing of Saint Blaise is a sign of our faith in God's protection and love for us and for the sick.

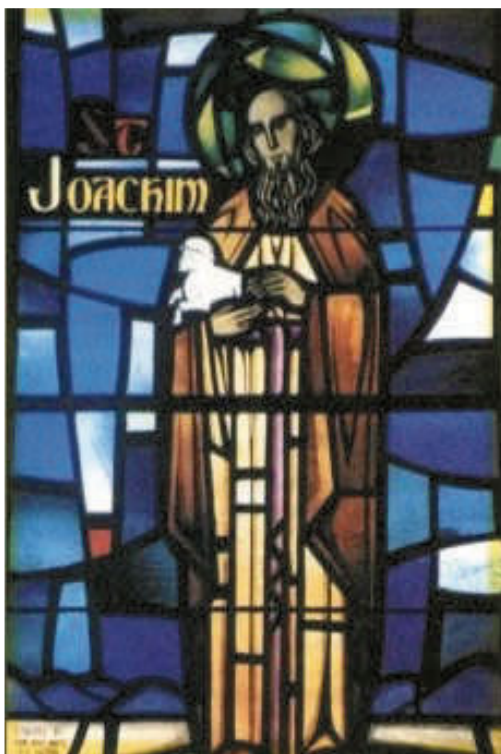

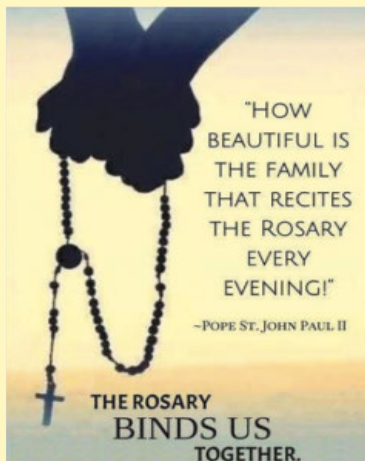
VATICAN CORNER

When he was a university teacher in his 30s and 40s,

Joseph Ratzinger, who later became Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI, was a champion of the reformist liberal agenda within the Church that steered the Second Vatican Council. Along with 1,360 prominent and radical theologians, he signed a famous statement in 1968 asserting their freedom to question the decisions of the Vatican departments running the Church. But 1968 was a time of student protests and similar to some universities in the United State and France, protests broke out in Tübingen, Germany where he was teaching. Radical literature branded the Cross as “a sadomasochistic artefact” and lectures were disrupted by tomato-throwing. Greatly shocked by these “brutal” events as he called them, he moved away to the more conservative University of Regensburg. Ratzinger’s former assistant Wolfgang Beinert stated that “Ratzinger believed that he was in some way responsible, for the chaos. From then on Ratzinger dropped his church reform ideas that might have changed its rigid structure and could have encouraged cooperation between the Vatican and Catholic bishops. He instead became a strong supporter of orthodoxy and a fighter of dissent in what he considered to be an increasingly disjointed and permissive world. His position within the Church advanced with the help of his high friends with similar ideology, becoming an archbishop and then cardinal, and he was put in charge of the Vatican’s office to protect the purity of the Church theology. As a theological enforcer for Pope John Paul II, liberals soon nicknamed him “Panzerkardinal”, while conservatives on the other hand approved of his enforcement actions. Cardinal Mario Grech wrote in an essay that Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI “often remained a misunderstood voice. And this has been a constant in Joseph Ratzinger’s life, theology, and papacy.” Cardinal Grech says that Ratzinger and his family were not understood when they resisted Nazi German. Nor was Ratzinger the theologian understood when after the Second Vatican Council, he questioned whether certain proposed reforms were for the good of the Church – losing friends and positions along the way. He was misunderstood in Rome when he was in charge of protecting the purity of the faith. He was even misunderstood when he resigned and his presence was used by some politically to create antagonism. Cardinal Grech says Ratzinger was continually searching for the truth, that is for Jesus Christ himself, and he was never willing to compromise with the truth whatever the cost. “It was his love of this God, his encounter with Jesus, that guided his whole life. Grech said “in fact, Benedict used to say, ‘at the beginning of being a Christian there is not an ethical decision or a great idea, but the encounter with an event, with a Person, who gives life a new horizon and thereby the decisive direction’. This Person is Jesus Christ.”
