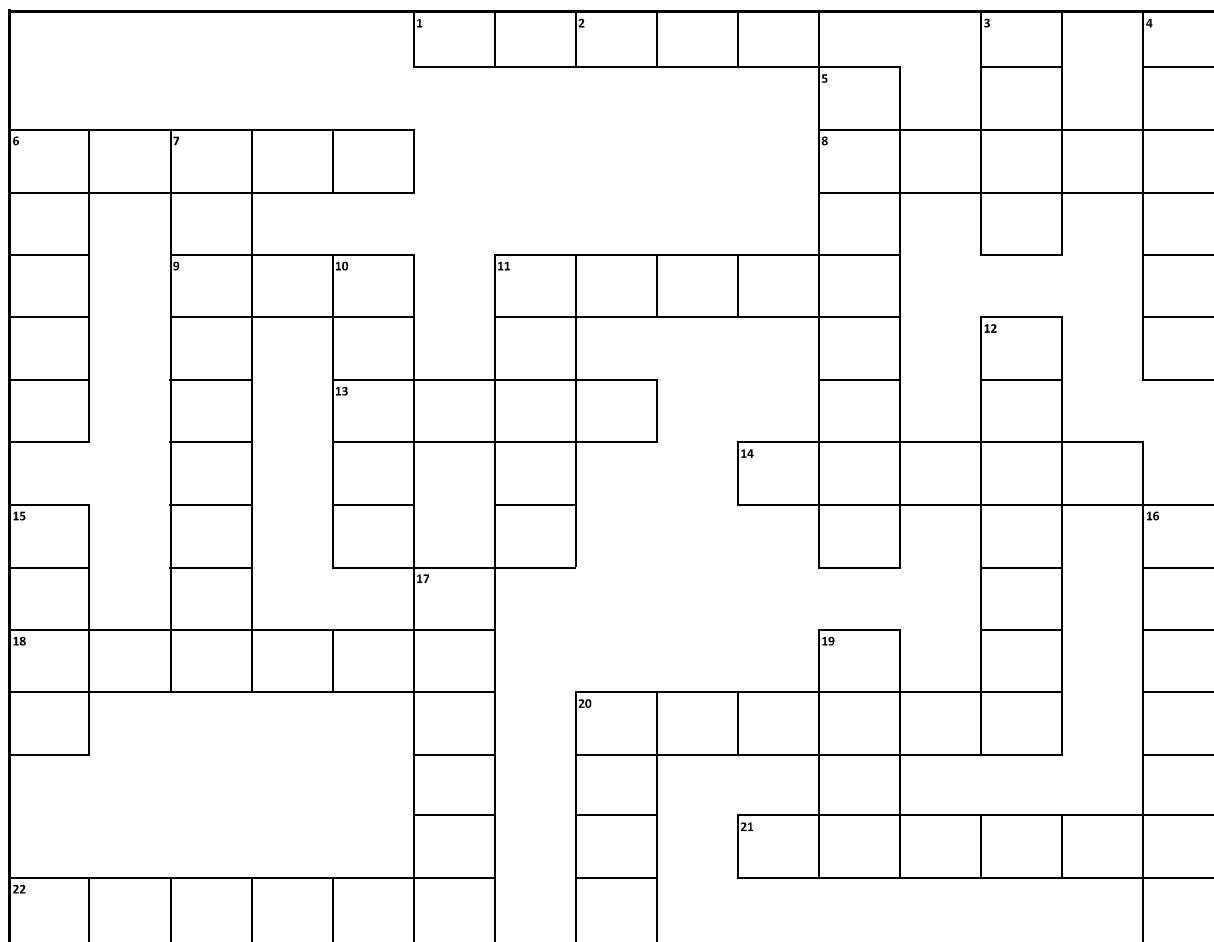

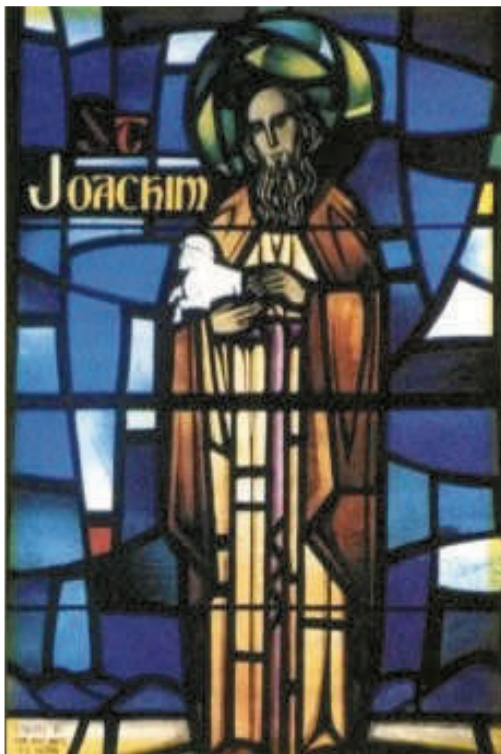

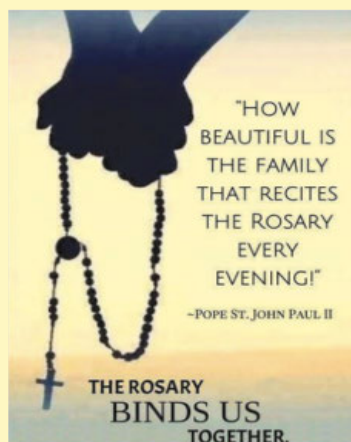

Cardinal Joseph Ratzinger, Dean of the College of Cardinals, was already 78 years old in 2005 when he was elected Pope and took the name Benedict XVI. His health had been worsening prior to his election, and later it was revealed that in 2005 he had been fitted with a heart pacemaker. After 8 years as Pope, with its additional burdens, and because of his advanced age, he decided to resign instead of reigning as Pope for life.

No other pope had stepped down since Pope Gregory XII in 1415, and no pope had resigned voluntarily since Pope Celestine V in 1294. On February 11, 2013 without any warning, Benedict startled the Catholic world by announcing to his cardinals that he would be resigning. Church law allows a pope to resign, and Benedict had seen first-hand how his predecessor Pope John Paul II had suffered in his later years from poor health, which kept him from performing his duties, and he did not want that for himself. Benedict's final public address in St. Peter's Square drew a crowd of more than 50,000. On February 28, 2013 he formally resigned and retired to a monastery located within the Vatican Gardens. He chose to keep his papal name, but he preferred to be known simply as "Father Benedict". Francis was elected as the new Pope and Benedict took on the title of Emeritus Pope. Pope Francis called Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI a "good companion" and a father figure. Francis said he would visit Benedict for counsel. "For me, he was a security. In the face of a doubt, I would ask for the car and go to the monastery and ask." But with the Vatican having two living popes, one current and one retired, that unique situation became the source of tension, problems and confusion. In spite of Benedict's pledge to remain silent for the rest of his days, he wrote and gave interviews, and whether he did it intentionally or not, Benedict became a rallying figure for opponents of Pope Francis because of doctrine differences, or because Francis wanted to remove clerical privileges. Now Francis is alone, and with his leadership strong, some call him unbound to fulfill his vision to promote a consensus through the synod processes, and with meetings of the world's bishops to make the changes he wants in the Church. Others see Francis' opposition now having a freer hand and not being held back by Benedict's instructions to his followers to calm down. It will be interesting to see if the awkwardness of the two-pope period can be left behind, and the Church can come together in a new era. As Francis said during Benedict's funeral Mass with a remark that is widely interpreted in the Vatican as a direct response to the complaints of Benedict's closest collaborator, Archbishop Georg Gänswein - who has a new book out about Benedict, "Let us worship God, not ourselves; let us worship God and not the false idols that seduce by the allure of prestige or power, or the allure of false news."

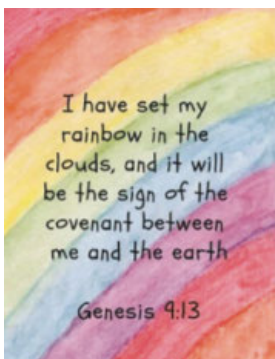

The Fil-Am Report: Simbang Gabi 2022

Every year, from December 16 to 24 (for others, December 15 to 23), churches and chapels teem with people from all walks of life for a pious exercise that has become so popular among Filipino Catholics all over the world. This is a form of popular piety that is known as “Aguinaldo Masses” and is commonly called “Simbang Gabi” or “Misa de Gallo”. This is a novena in preparation for the commemoration of the birth of Jesus Christ, the Savior and as a gift to Him.

The 2022 Simbang Gabi celebration was 100% in-person and participated in by the whole St. Joachim Church community. Filipinos and other ethnicities braved the cold and sometimes rainy December early mornings to be part of this annual event: Mass at 5:30M followed by a breakfast reception. As a witness to our faith and generosity, we contributed close to \$22,000.00 for the upkeep of the gym and other church facilities, and to sustain our church’s work.

The SJCFAM (St. Joachim Church Filipino-American Ministry) is the lead organization of the Simbang Gabi celebration in close collaboration with our Pastor, Rev. Fr. Henry Noga, SVD and our Associate Pastor, Rev. Fr. Emilio Reyes, SVD, the St. Joachim Council of the Knights of Columbus and our church’s liturgical ministries.

The SJCFAM is composed of the lay members of St. Joachim Church called together to witness a life in Jesus Christ through the intercession of our patron Saint Joachim, and the Blessed Virgin Mary. Our Mission is to assist in the pastoral outreach of our Pastor to serve the Filipino-American community, facilitate in their inculturation and integration in the whole St. Joachim Church community.

Through Filipino religious and cultural traditions, we encourage our community to grow in their faith and passing it on to the younger generation thus, sustaining the gift of faith of our forefathers. The SJCFAM participated in the Diocesan Simbang Gabi Kick-off Mass with other Fil-Am organizations presided by Bishop Michael Barber held at All Saint’s Church in Hayward last December 10, 2022.

The SJCFAM continues to work on the fiesta celebrations and propagating the devotions to the Filipino Saints: St. Lorenzo Ruiz de Manila (September 28) and St. Pedro Calungsod (March 27) and the devotion to our Blessed Mother during our church’s Marian Festival. The celebration of the Fiesta of Santo Niño last January 28, 2023 with a mass presided by Rev. Fr. Henry Noga, SVD was very meaningful with light refreshments to enjoy after the mass.

Collaboration and Reaching Out with other organizations and individuals in the parish is important to the SJCFAM. We are committed to play an active role for the success of parish activities and to support the work of our Pastor in our church. The SJCFAM is also committed to reaching out and encourage, especially Filipino families to register to our church and be more active in parish life.

“Mabuhay!” Long live! “Viva” to all of us and let us continue praying for the end of this pandemic, for our health and for everyone’s safety. Let us always thank God for the gift of faith that keeps us going in spite of our challenges. We are a people of hope because we are with Jesus Christ who is the Way, the Truth and the Life and our Blessed Mother Mary who is always guiding us. Let us keep the Light of Christ shining brightly in our hearts and in our lives. Blessings to all of you.
