



VATICAN CORNER



of Sudan, South Sudan became the world's youngest nation and Africa's 55th country when it gained independence from Sudan in 2011 after 20 years of guerrilla warfare. At least 1.5 million people were killed and more than four million displaced by that civil war. A 2005 agreement brought independence but did not bring conflict to an end. The country is one of the most diverse in Africa with over 60 different major ethnic groups. Roughly half the people are under 18 years of age. The county is ranked the lowest on the Human Development index. The majority of the inhabitants



adhere to Christianity or various indigenous faiths. It is a county prone to severe droughts and floods which have a devastating impact on people's lives. In 2012 disagreements with Sudan over oil production erupted into fighting, then a peace deal with the creation of a demilitarized zone. Civil war in South Sudan broke out when president Salva Kiir fired the cabinet and accused Vice-President Riek Machar of planning a failed coup. About 400,000 people were killed; there was severe famine; and 4 million people displaced. In 2018 the two opposing leaders agreed to a peace deal. In 2019, a retreat was held at the Vatican, where the two leaders were brought together for 24 hours of prayer and preaching in the attempt to heal their bitter division. Others who attended the retreat were Justin Welby, spiritual leader of the worldwide Anglican community, as well as the leader of the Church of Scotland and other Catholic and Presbyterian Church leaders from Africa. Pope Francis kissed the shoes of President Salva Kiir and Riek Machar the rebel leader who both signed a commitment to an armistice and to form a new unified government. Despite the official end of the civil war, violence between armed militia groups continued at a high level and in many cases fueled by the leadership. The first democratic elections in South Sudan were postponed. In early February, 2023, Pope Francis visited South Sudan along with Justin Welby, and the leader of the Church of Scotland, the same spiritual leaders present at the Vatican at 2019 retreat. Despite the dismal living conditions, desperate poverty and a seeming lack of future, the people of South Sudan appeared incredibly joyful to see Francis and the two other religious leaders. But as Miklos Gosztonyi, a political analyst and humanitarian expert said, "If the political élite in South Sudan thought that they would encounter a frail Pope without getting involved in some of the toughest part of politics, they were absolutely wrong." Gosztonyi said he felt that Pope Francis "thought this trip as a way of holding leaders accountable for not having lived up to the commitments they made to him when they visited the Vatican in 2019 and he kissed their feet". In an Ecumenical Prayer where the entire political leadership of the country was present, Pope Francis said "Those who choose Christ choose peace, always, those who unleash war and violence betray the Lord and deny his Gospel." Analyst Gosztonyi said that the Pope was telling them "they are not living a moral Christian life." He said saying that was huge, not only for the leaders but for everybody else in South Sudan who think that, and who are usually not able to say anything resembling that due to political repression. Gosztonyi also made a point that having the other two spiritual leaders there and who sent "exactly the same message" was extremely important, having a very clear message resonated across the different branches of Christianity made a very powerful and very unique occasion.
