





VATICAN CORNER

At the Mass to
mark the start of

Lent, Pope Francis said Lent is the time “to proclaim that “the Lord alone is God and we are work of his hands.” “It is the time to drop the pretense of being self-sufficient and the need to put ourselves at the center of things, to be the top of the class, to think that by our own abilities we can succeed in life and transform the world around us. How many distractions and trifles distract us from the things that really count! How often do we get caught up in our own wants and needs, lose sight of the heart of the matter, and fail to embrace the true meaning of our lives in this world!” “Lent is a time of truth, a time to drop the masks we put on each day to appear perfect in the eyes of the world, and to reject lies and hypocrisy. Not the lies and hypocrisies of others, but our own.” Francis said the Lenten period is “the favorable time” for returning to what is essential and true, and to be reconciled with God and each other. Pope Francis said the three great paths to take on this journey of truth and reconciliation are the paths of **almsgiving, prayer and fasting**. However, he said they must be done with a heart that is truly renewed and sincere. “All too often, our gestures and rites have no impact on our lives; they remain superficial. Perhaps we perform them only to gain the admiration or esteem of others.” “The only thing that truly matters is the truth and love that God himself sees.” The ashes we receive on Ash Wednesday tell us that every presumption of self-sufficiency is false and that self-idolatry is destructive, imprisoning us in isolation and loneliness.” “Life is instead a relationship: we receive it from God and from our parents, and we can always revive and renew it thanks to the Lord and to those he puts at our side.” Regarding **fasting**, Pope Francis said in a morning meditation in February 2018, that it is not just a matter of making choices about food, “but of a lifestyle, like the example of the Good Samaritan. Fasting has value if one adopts a sober lifestyle, if one lives “a way that does not waste, a way of life that does not ‘throw away.’” The fasting that the Lord desires is truth and consistency, to humble yourself and think about your sins. And in February 2023, Francis said that “fasting is not a quaint devotion, but a powerful gesture to remind ourselves what truly matters and what is merely ephemeral (fleeting)” Jesus tells us in the Sermon on the Mount that fasting should be done in secret so that it can’t be used as a way of bringing glory to ourselves. Fasting should make us humble instead of proud. In the end it is not our works, but our hearts that matter to God. God promises to reward openly those who fast and pray in secret.

LENTEN MISTAKES

1. Your Lenten sacrifice may create an undue hardship on the rest of your family: Example: Dad's giving up cheese limits the meals possible. Solution: First think about how your sacrifice will affect others.
2. Treating Lenten sacrifices like New Year's resolutions: Resolutions tend to be all about you, like giving up sweets or going on a diet. But Lent is all about God, so giving up sweets should be because your body is a temple of God, and so worthy of care and respect. Going on a diet should be because you want to be healthy in order to serve God and others better.
3. Getting discouraged and giving up: If you aren't doing well with your Lenten promises, pick up and try again. God is willing to give us another chance. Discouragement is the devil's friend. Don't give in.
4. Trying to do too much: Don't take on more than is reasonably possible. Trying to do too much sets us up for failure. It is better to do one thing and do it well, or subtract something that isn't so necessary to our life, like watching TV.
5. Don't be a spiritual show-off, or letting Lent become a competition: Don't brag about your good deed to others. Do your good deeds in secret. Jesus said when you give alms; do not let your left hand know what your right is doing, so that your almsgiving may be secret. And your Father who sees in secret will repay you.
6. Failing to celebrate the Easter Season: After the 40 days of Lent, with its sacrifices, repenting, and striving to grow in our faith, the 50 days of the Easter season need to be a time of rejoicing, continuing your spiritual growth, and celebrating.

ERRORES DE CUARESMA

1. Su sacrificio de Cuaresma puede crear una dificultad excesiva para el resto de su familia: Ejemplo: El hecho de que papá renuncie a el queso limita las comidas posibles. Solución: Primero piensa en cómo tu sacrificio afectará a los demás.
2. Tratar los sacrificios de Cuaresma como resoluciones de Año Nuevo: Las resoluciones tienden a ser todo acerca de usted, como dejarse comer algo dulces o ponerse a dieta. Pero la Cuaresma tiene que ver con Dios, por lo que debe renunciar a los dulces porque su cuerpo es un templo de Dios, y por lo tanto digno de cuidado y respeto. Ponerse a dieta debe ser porque quiere estar saludable para servir mejor a Dios y a los demás.
3. Desanimarse y darse por vencido: si no está cumpliendo con sus promesas de Cuaresma, levántese y vuelva a intentarlo. Dios está dispuesto a darnos otra oportunidad. El desánimo es amigo del diablo. No te rindas.
4. Tratar de hacer demasiado: no asuma más de lo razonablemente posible. Intentar hacer demasiado nos prepara para el fracaso. Es mejor hacer una cosa y hacerlo bien, o dejar algo que no es tan necesario en nuestra vida, como ver la tele.
5. No ser un fanfarrón espiritual, ni permitas que la Cuaresma se convierta en una competencia: No presumas de tu buena obra ante los demás. Haz tus buenas obras en secreto. Jesús dijo cuando das donación; que no sepa tu mano izquierda lo que hace tu mano derecha, para que tu donación sea en secreto. Y tu Padre que ve en lo secreto te lo pagará.
6. No celebrar la temporada de Pascua: después de los 40 días de Cuaresma, con sus sacrificios, arrepentimiento y esfuerzo por crecer en nuestra fe, los 50 días de la temporada de Pascua deben ser un tiempo de regocijo, continuando con su crecimiento espiritual. y celebrando.
