Dana Bayer ~ principal of St. Joachim School for the 2023-24 school year

Fr. Henry has appointed Dana Bayer as principal of St. Joachim School for the 2023-24 School year, following the retirement of Armond Seishas. Dana had been teaching at St. Joachim for 30 years, almost all of those in 8th grade. She has worked closely with Mr. Seishas for the past 25 years on initially on the leadership team and most recently as Associate Principal.

Dana is a product of 12 years of Catholic education in the Diocese of Oakland; St. John the Baptist elementary school in El Cerrito, and Presentation High School in Berkeley. She attended UC Davis as an undergrad and then earned a Master of Education in Instructional Technology from San Francisco State University and a Master of Education in Catholic School Administration from the University of Notre Dame.

Dana says, *I am very honored and humbled to be offered this position. I know that I have very big shoes to fill but I am excited to begin this next part of my journey in the ministry of Catholic Education. St. Joachim has been my second home for the past 30 years- I have been blessed to be part of this community and to teach almost 1000 students. I am even more blessed to have so many of them come back with their own children and some even as teachers and staff. I am lucky to have worked closely with Armond all these years. I have learned so much from his knowledge and expertise and have been inspired by his faith-filled leadership. He has been a teacher, mentor, and friend and I am truly grateful for all he has taught me and for the experiences he has given me. 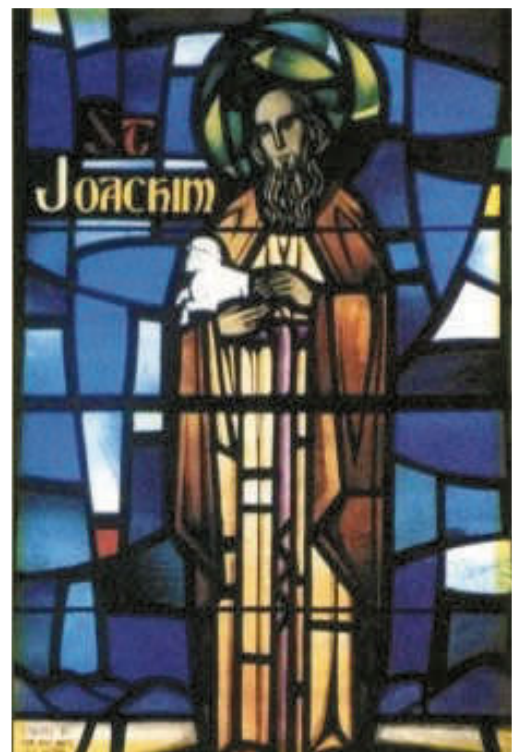

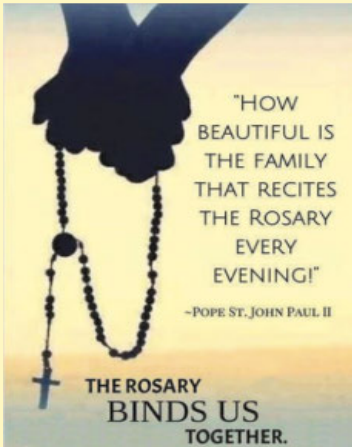

VATICAN CORNER

Pope Francis celebrated his 10 years as Pope with cardinals in the chapel of his residence on March 13, 2023. In interviews about his 10 years, he insisted it is not his task to make an accounting of what he has or has not accomplished. He said “the Lord will do the appraisal when he sees fit.” However, he said he was certain the criteria for judgment would be from Matthew 25: feeding the hungry, welcoming the stranger, clothing the naked, caring for the sick and visiting prisoners.” He also had three words for what he hopes for the future: “Fraternity, tears, smiles.” He said when a person knows how to cry and how to smile, he or she has their feet on the ground and their gaze on the horizon of the future.” When asked about death,



he said he thinks about death often and “very peacefully” because “it is necessary to remember” that no one lives forever. When asked what he would want as a gift for his 10th anniversary, he said “Peace. We need peace.” Here are some of his papal statistics: Number of Noon Blessings: 570; number of Wednesday General Audiences: 440; Meetings with heads of government: 330; he presided over 5 Synods of bishops; named 111 cardinals, 81 of which are under 80 years old and eligible to elect a new pope after Francis dies or retires; 60 visits to countries and territories; 35 trips into Italy; 150 trips into Rome; created about 900 new saints; beatified 1,355 people, wrote 3 encyclicals and 11 other major documents. After a decade as Pope, Francis continues to reshape the Catholic Church. His reform of the Vatican bank has made it no longer possible for mafia money to flow through the bank or corruption money for political parties in Italy as it did in the past. Travelling across the globe he has gone mostly where Catholics are few and feel left out, encountering the marginal, peripheral and excluded. He has promoted outreach to other religions, in particular with Islam. His strong environmentalism and his criticism of capitalism without government regulation have made many conservative inside and outside the Catholic Church angry. He has opened the door slightly for divorced and remarried Catholic to receive communion. Delegating more decisions to bishops, he has started a slow process of decentralization. He has opened up the Church administration by putting women in leadership rolls. He has attacked clericalism - the old boy’s network of priests, bishops and cardinals acting with privilege and ruling over their flock. Francis blames clericalism as the cause of the abuse of power and sexual abuse of minors which have choked the Church. He has gone after clerical sex abusers and those doing the cover-up, and held them responsible and accountable. By focusing more on the pastoral issues rather than doctrine, and leaning towards mercy over judgment, he has been accused of spreading confusion and in doing so creating more critics. But unlike his predecessors he has not disciplined those critics, and instead has basically ignored them. Francis did not sharply criticize Russia as the aggressor in the Russia Ukraine War and instead took the traditional role as mediator in international disputes. This also brought criticism from both liberals and conservatives, but in recent months Francis has started to blame the Russians for starting the war. Pope Francis’ most ambitious project is the ongoing huge global consultation on the Church’s future, which will culminate with two bishop’s synods. Francis’ goal is to reshape the Church to be more inclusive, where everyone can be heard and share in the decision-making. It will be interesting to see how that turns out, and hopefully Francis will be able to accomplish even more as Pope. Sources: reuters.com, ncronline.org, npr.org, theguardian.com
