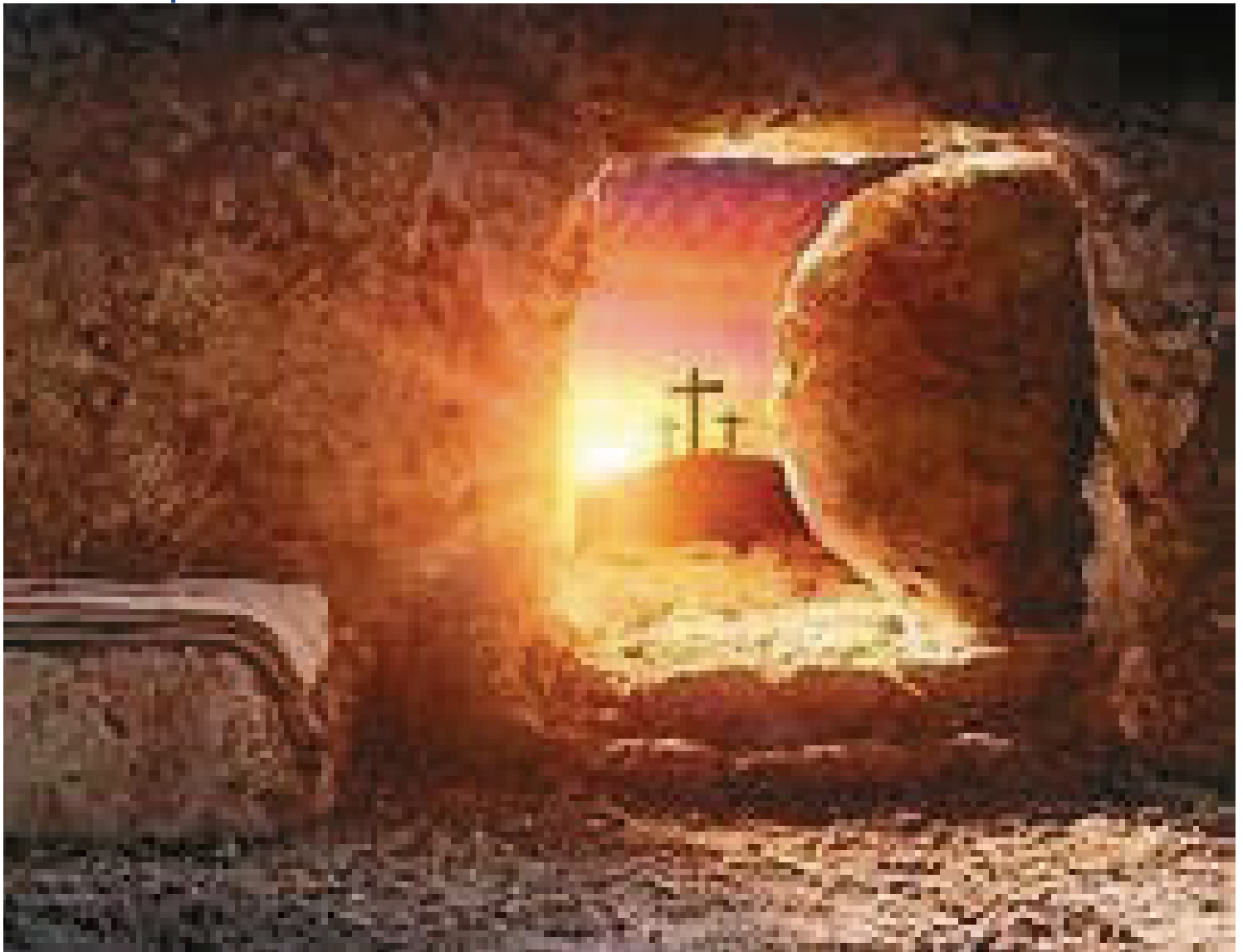

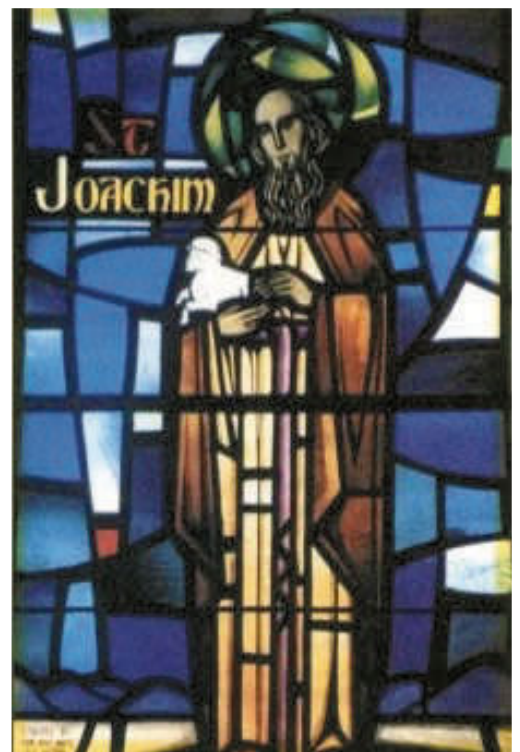

VATICAN CORNER

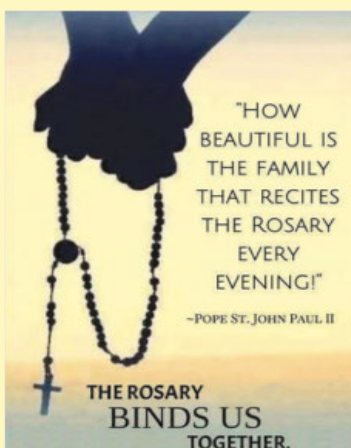


will soon celebrate Easter 2023, the day dedicated to observing the miraculous resurrection of Jesus Christ. His body was laid in the tomb, and after three days he arose from the dead. His glorified physical body appeared to the apostles and many others over a 40 day period, and then his body and spirit ascended into heaven. His funeral may have been a typical one following the Jewish culture and tradition in which he lived. Funeral rituals from Jesus's time are still used today but have changed somewhat. Jewish funerals of the time of Jesus started with the preparation of the body, and it is one ritual still common today. It typically means washing the body and possibly embalming.

In Jesus's day the body was washed and anointed with expensive perfumes, like nard, myrrh, and aloes. Then the body was wrapped in a shroud with the face covered with a special cloth, and the hands and feet tied with strips of cloth. In Jesus' day, the deceased was typically buried within hours of death. This was mainly because of the hot climate which quickens decay, and preservation methods were unavailable in those days. Quickly after death family friends and neighbors gathered to comfort the family and say their goodbyes. Today, we still hold this ritual, and it is the visitation or a viewing. But it no longer takes place in the family's home, but instead often in a funeral home. After the goodbyes, the person who died was carried on a pallet or litter to the grave by loved ones, as a sign of affection and love. The crowd of family, friends and neighbors formed a procession to the tomb, with women wailing and throwing dust. Today our version of a funeral procession is with pallbearers who carry the casket to the vehicle and the family, friends and neighbors travel to the gravesite and give support to the grieving family. There is historical evidence at some of the ancient tombs that eulogies were given similar to the way they are given today. In Jesus' day it was common practice to bury people in tombs and many families owned family tombs which could hold many deceased loved ones. The Jewish tradition was that after about a year, the family would return to the tomb, collect the bones and place them in a ossuary (a small box) and place the box with the other boxes there to make room for future generations. Today we do this differently and bury our loved ones in coffins at cemeteries or cremate the body into ashes. In Jesus's day, there was often a brief meal following the burial which was prepared by neighbors. For the next seven days, the immediate family remained at home for a period of mourning. Today we do something similar: sharing a meal, exchanging stories about the person who died and offer encouragement and words of condolence. We as human beings understand today as was understood in Jesus' time, that life is precious and worth celebrating.

For the month of April, 2023, Pope Francis has asked the world to pray in a special way for a culture of nonviolence and peace. He urged both countries and citizens to "resort less and less to the use of arms."

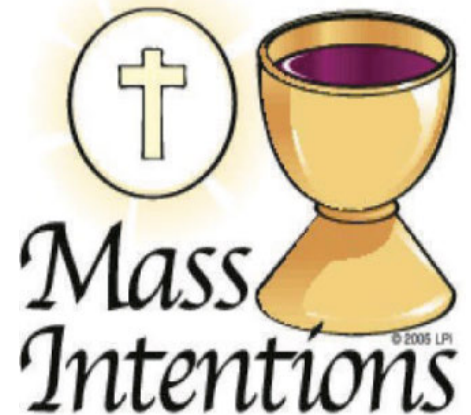
