"I Am Not Afraid — I Was Born to Do This."

Have you ever felt like you weren't doing the work you should be doing?

We have all had jobs that leave us feeling unfulfilled. Bored. Dreading the next day. We may even experience a sensation of unfamiliarity, of being unable to recognize ourselves.

Most of us have also been lucky enough to have a job that we love — a vocation, a calling that makes us look in the mirror and think, This. This is who I'm supposed to be. I recognize this person.

For me, that work is the work of marriage and motherhood. The hours are terrible, the pay is even worse, and my coworkers are frequently disappointed in me — but it doesn't matter. When I look in the mirror every morning and see my tired, wrinkled face gazing back, choruses of "I said I don't want the BLUE SHIRT, MOMMY, ugh!" and "Honey, I've got an early meeting, I'm so sorry but I have to run," ringing in the background, I think to myself: I recognize this girl. She was born to do this.

Christ's own disciples did not recognize him on the road to Emmaus. It wasn't until he took the bread and broke it that their eyes were opened, and they realized they had known it all along — "Were not our hearts burning within us?"

In that moment, Christ was doing the very work he was born to do, making the sacrifice.

I don't know what kind of vocation you are called to. I don't know what kind of work reveals your true self. But I hope that whatever work you are doing, you can look in the mirror and feel your heart burning within you.

Cuando me miro en el espejo todas las mañanas y veo mi rostro cansado y arrugado mirándome, coros de "¡Dije que no quiero la CAMISA AZUL, MAMÁ, uf!" y "Cariño, tengo una reunión temprano, lo siento mucho, pero tengo que irme," sonando de fondo, pienso para mí: reconozco a esta chica. Ella nació para hacer esto.

Los propios discípulos de Cristo no lo reconocieron en el camino a Emaús. No fue hasta que tomó el pan y lo partió que sus ojos se abrieron y se dieron cuenta de que lo habían sabido todo el tiempo: "¿No ardía nuestro corazón dentro de nosotros?"

En ese momento, Cristo estaba haciendo el mismo trabajo para el que nació, haciendo el sacrificio.

No sé a qué tipo de vocación estás llamado. No sé qué tipo de trabajo revela tu verdadero yo. Pero espero que sea cual sea el trabajo que estés haciendo, puedas mirarte en el espejo y sentir que tu corazón arde dentro de ti.




VATICAN CORNER ...continued On a

sunny and cool

spring day, some 45,000 pilgrims and tourists, and 300 priests, 15 bishops and 31 cardinals gathered in St. Peter's Square mid-morning on Easter Sunday, April 9, 2023 to celebrate Mass with Pope Francis presiding. The Square was decorated with orange-red tulips, yellow sprays of forsythia and daffodils, and other colorful seasonal blooms. The Mass celebrated the most joyous day of the liturgical year marking the Resurrection of Christ. Pope Francis arrived in a wheelchair and was back in public view just 12 hours after a 2.25 – hour long Easter vigil ceremony in the Basilica the night



before. Cardinal Battista Re celebrated at the altar due to Francis' difficulty walking and standing. Francis was sheltered by a canopy on the edge of the steps of the Square. The Gospel reading John 20:1-9 was proclaimed in Latin and Greek. It recounts the moment in which Mary Magdalene and the apostles Peter and John found the empty tomb after Jesus' resurrection. Following custom, Pope Francis did not give a homily after the Gospel, but stayed a few moments in silent prayer. He also participated in the "Resurrexit" and ancient rite honoring an icon of the Holy Savior. The ritual sung in Latin recalls how the apostle Peter, of whom the Pope is the successor, was one of the first witnesses to Christ's resurrection, after St. Mary Magdalene. While the "Resurrexit" is sung, deacons opened the panels of the icon of the Holy Savior next to the altar. Following the Easter Sunday Mass, Pope Francis greeted the crowd in his popemobile and appeared in fine form. The crowd had grown to about 100,000 people, filling the Square and the surrounding avenues. He was driven around the square and down the main boulevard leading to the Tiber River so more people could see him and the trip lasted almost 15 minutes before he returned to the Basilica. Francis then went up to the central balcony of St. Peter's Basilica, overlooking the Square, to give his twice-yearly "Urbi et Orbi" (to the city and the world) message and blessing at noon. He addressed the crowd and his speech was broadcast live around the world. He recalled that Easter is "the most important and beautiful day of history," the day Christ rose from the dead. "Let the Church and the world rejoice, for today our hopes no longer come up against the wall of death, for the Lord has built us a bridge to life" he said. He wished everyone a Happy Easter and in particular he greeted the sick, the poor, the elderly and all those suffering that they may experience the passage from affliction to consolation. He praised those who are doing all they can to offer assistance and welcome to people fleeing war and poverty. He asked that the Lord may open all our hearts to do the same. He spoke of prayers and peace needed for the Ukrainian people and the people of Russia, peace for Syria, Israelis and Palestinians, the young of Tunisia, Haiti, Ethiopia, South Sudan, and the Democratic Republic of the Congo. Prayers for the victims of international terrorism in Burkina Faso, Mali, Mozambique and Nigeria, Myanmar's peace to prevail and the Rohingya may encounter justice." He spoke of care for asylum-seekers, migrants and refugees and prayers for national leaders. Francis ended by asking the Lord ..."May you, the Lord of life, encourage us on our journey and repeat to us, as you did to the disciples on the evening of Easter: 'Peace be with you!'" sources: catholicnewsagency.com, vaticannews.va, yourvalley.net, reuter.com
