



Registration Requirements:

- 1.1. If this is your child's first year, a <u>copy</u> of his/her Birth, Baptism will be required at the time of registration and First Communion Certificates (for Confirmation registration) will also be required. Please make sure you bring copies and NOT originals.
- 2. If your child has not been baptized they MUST be baptized before the classes start in September.
- 3. If this is your child's second year, <u>tuition for their first year must have been paid in full</u> and copies of Birth, Baptism and First Communion (for Confirmation registration) Certificates must be already in the office before registration as a continuing student.
- 4. Classes can fill up and applications are accepted on a first come basis for students that have completed all the requirements.

Tuition Fees:

1 Child in the family \$100.00 ~~ 2 Children in the family \$140.00 ~~ 3 Children or more in the family \$150.00 MUST be paid in full at the time of registration.





VATICAN CORNER


Margaret Mary Alacoque, born in 1647 in L'Hautecor, Burgundy France, showed a love of God from an early

age. The only girl of seven children. Her father was a well-to-do notary. He died when she was eight and she was sent to a convent school run by the Poor Clares in Charolles. She made her first communion there at age nine and later contracted rheumatic fever, confining her to bed for four years. It is said that she was restored to perfect health after she made a vow to the Blessed Virgin Mary to consecrate herself to religious life. In recognition of this kindness, Margaret added the name "Mary" to her name. According to her later descriptions of her life, she experienced visions of Jesus Christ which she thought were normal. When her father died, her uncle held onto the family assets and her family became impoverished. During that time, her only comfort was frequent visits to pray in the local church before the Blessed Sacrament. At the age of 17, her brother came of age and took possession of the home and her life improved. Her mother encouraged her to socialize in the hopes of her finding a suitable husband. She had forgotten her childhood vow and began to accompany her brothers to social events. One night while returning home from a ball for Carnival, she experienced a vision of Christ scourged and bloody. He disapproved of her forgetfulness of him, but also reassured her that his heart was filled with love for her, because of the childhood promise she had made to his Blessed Mother. As a result of this, she became determined to fulfill her vow and entered the Visitation Convent at Paray-le-Monial at the age of 24. A year-and-a-half



later she became a nun. At the monastery Margaret Mary received several private visions of the Sacred Heart of Jesus. Jesus permitted her to rest her head upon his heart, and then told her that he desired to make the wonders of his love known to all mankind and to spread the treasures of his goodness, and that he had chosen her for this work. Margaret Mary was eventually able to convince her superior, Mother de Saumaise, of the authenticity of her visions, but unable to convince a Benedictine and a Jesuit, whom Mother de Saumaise consulted with, nor was she able to convince many members of her own community. In 1681, Margaret Mary felt compelled to make a personal testament about her life donated completely to Jesus by wounding her own chest. Eventually she received the support of Claude de la Colombiére, the community's confessor for a time, who declared that the visions were genuine. In 1683 opposition in the community ended when Mother Melin was elected Superior and named Margaret Mary her assistant. Later the monastery observed the Feast of the Sacred Heart privately, and two years later a chapel was built at Paray-le-Monial to honor the Sacred Heart of Jesus. Observance of the feast of the Sacred Heart spread to other Visitation convents. After Margaret Mary's death the Jesuits encouraged the devotion to the Sacred Heart, but it was controversial in the Catholic Church. However, 75 years later, the devotion was officially recognized. All Margaret Mary's actions, revelations, her beliefs and teachings regarding the devotion to the Sacred Heart were subject to minute examination. In 1824, Pope Leo XII pronounced her Venerable and on September 1864 Pope Pius IX declared her Blessed. When her tomb was canonically opened in July 1830, two instantaneous cures were recorded to have taken place. She was canonized a saint by Pope Benedict XV in 1920.

So why is the month of June known as the month of the Sacred Heart of Jesus? It is because the solemnity of the Sacred Heart is celebrated during this month. Jesus had appeared to St. Margaret Mary Alacoque with his heart visible outside his chest, on fire, and surrounded by a crown of thorns to show his immense love for humanity. Jesus revealed to Margaret Mary ways to venerate his Sacred Heart: by taking part in a holy hour on Thursdays and the reception of the Eucharist on the first Friday of every month. Also Jesus instructed St. Margaret Mary that the Friday after the octave of Corpus Christi be set apart for a special feast to honor his heart. There are twelve promises Jesus told St. Margaret Mary he gives tor those who are devoted to His Sacred Heart. There is no room to list them all here but the second one is: "I will establish peace in your families" Sources: catholic digest.com, catholic leader.com, wikipedia.org

El Juguete


