Communion with Christ and the Church

We should remember always the words of our Lord, "Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life and I will raise him on the last day. For my flesh is true food, and my blood is true drink. Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood remains in me and I in him." (Jn 6:54-56)

Some were shocked at Christ's words and no longer accompanied Him. Perhaps we may sometimes become accustomed to them and not reflect on the affirmation, which rests on Him also saying that He converts bread and wine into His Body and Blood, and passes on to His disciples the mandate, "Do this in memory of me," and the capacity to renew Jesus' self-offering to the Father, and to share this communion with others.

What can we do to renew and deepen our own faith? We ask God's help so that we may always take part in the Mass with great and faith and love, and so that these dispositions become ever stronger. We believe that the sacrifice of Christ and the sacrifice of the Holy Eucharist are one single sacrifice. The same Christ who offered himself once in a bloody manner now offers Himself in an unbloody manner. And Christ remains in the consecrated hosts, reserved in the tabernacle. Sometimes we venerate Christ with exposition of the Blessed Sacrament and some time of adoration. To look for opportunities to visit our Lord in the tabernacle is a sign of our love for Him.

As Pope Saint John Paul II emphasized in one of his Letters, the Holy Eucharist makes the Church. In communion, we are more closely united with Christ, and He unites us all in one body: the Church. The Holy Eucharist renews and strengthens our union with all of the members of Christ's Mystical Body, both living and dead. This union should help us to pray very often for the blessed souls in Purgatory, whom we always remember at Mass. Also, we remember our Lord's concern for those in need, and our closer union with Him helps us to be more aware that whatever we do for one of these, the least of His brethren, we do for Him.

And the Holy Eucharist reminds us of the divisions among Christians, which are not according to God's will. We pray, as Jesus did, that all may be one.

VATICAN CORNER

A Catholic feast day is a day when we remember and celebrate something or someone important in our faith. On July 22 of each year, we celebrate the Feast of St. Mary Magdalene, “the first witness of Jesus’ resurrection and the first evangelist”. She was from Magadala, a small fishing village on the Sea of Galilee. Mary was known to be a “great sinner”, a woman of the streets who heard Jesus speak of the mercy and forgiveness of God, and she completely changed her way of life. She became one of several women traveling with Jesus and his disciples and gave them material support. She had a great love for Jesus and was one who grasped the truth of God’s love for human beings. Her love was praised by Jesus when he said that because much was forgiven her, she loved much. Mary was an eyewitness to Jesus’s execution. She stood with Jesus’ mother Mary at the foot of the Cross on that brutal Good Friday and had been by Mary’s side during those difficult hours.



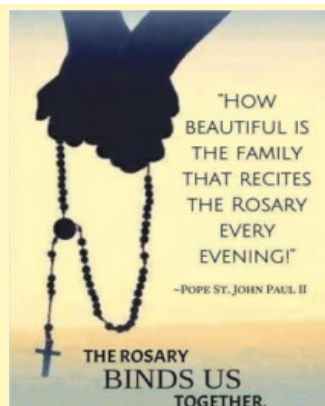
On Easter morning, she went with the other women to the tomb and saw it empty. In the garden near the tomb Jesus appeared to her. She was the first to witness his resurrection and went to tell the apostles. Her telling moved Peter and John to go see for themselves. By telling what she had witnessed she became the first evangelist, a messenger announcing the good news of the resurrection of the Lord. The apostles would in turn, announce the same to all the world. One legend has that St. Mary Magdalene died in Provence, France, in a cave where she spent her last days, and her body is resting in the chapel of St. Maximin in the Maritime Alps. Another legend says she is buried in Ephesus, Greece where she went with St. John after the Resurrection. It is said that St. Willibald, the English pilgrim to the Holy Land in the eighth century was shown Mary’s tomb in Ephesus. She has been called the “Apostle of Apostles” and has always been an example of great love and great forgiveness. However, celebrating her with a feast day is a very recent development. The Church ranks liturgical celebrations by importance, with solemnities the highest rank, feast days 2nd, and memorials 3rd. Feast days are generally reserved for apostles, evangelists and a few others. In 2016 Pope Francis decreed that St. Mary Magdalene’s liturgical commemoration be elevated from a “memorial” to a feast day. St. Mary Magdalene is currently the

only woman besides the Blessed Virgin Mary to receive a feast day. So by doing so, Pope Francis has given new and official prominence to St. Mary Magdalene. It is said that by doing so, the Pope’s intention was to do the same for all women in the Church.



Prayer: O God, whose Only Begotten Son entrusted Mary Magdalene before all others with announcing the great joy of the Resurrection, grant, we pray, that through her intercession and example we may proclaim the living Christ and come to see him reigning in your glory. Who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, for ever and ever.

Comunión con Cristo y con la Iglesia



Debemos de recordar las palabras de nuestro Señor, “El que come mi carne y bebe mi sangre tiene vida eterna, y yo lo resucitare en el ultimo día. Mi carne es verdadera comida y mi sangre es verdadera bebida. El que come mi carne y bebe mi sangre permanece en mi y yo en él.”

Algunos quedaron sorprendidos a las palabras de Cristo y ya no lo acompañaron. Puede que a veces nos acostumbremos a ellas y no reflexionemos en esta afirmación, que se apoya en él que también dice que El convierte pan y vino en Su Cuerpo y Sangre, y da a sus discípulos el mandato, “Hagan esto en memoria mía,” y la capacidad de renovar la ofrenda de Jesús al Padre, y de compartir esta comunión con otros.

¿Qué podemos hacer para renovar y profundizar en nuestra fe? Le pedimos a Dios su ayuda para que siempre tomemos parte en la Misa con gran fe y amor, para que así nuestra disposición sea mas fuerte. Creemos que el sacrificio de Cristo y que el sacrificio de la Santa Eucaristía son un solo sacrificio. El mismo Cristo que se ofreció una sola vez de manera ensangrentada ahora se ofrece a si mismo de una manera no sangrienta. Y Cristo permanece en las hostias consagradas, reservadas en el tabernáculo. A veces veneramos a Cristo en la exposición del Santísimo Sacramento y pasando algún tiempo en adoración. El buscar oportunidades para visitar a nuestro Señor en el tabernáculo es un signo de nuestro amor por El.

Como enfatizó el Papa San Juan Pablo II en una de sus Cartas, La Sagrada Eucaristía hace la Iglesia. En la comunión, somos más íntimamente unidos a Cristo, y El nos une a todos en un solo cuerpo: su Iglesia. La Sagrada Eucaristía renueva y fortalece nuestra unión con todos los miembros del Cuerpo Místico de Cristo, ambos vivos y muertos. Esta unión nos debe de ayudar a que oremos mas frecuentemente por las almas de Purgatorio, las cuales recordamos en cada Misa. También, recordamos la inquietud de nuestro Señor por los más necesitados, y nuestra unión con Él nos debe de ayudar a estar más conscientes de que lo que hagamos por los necesitados, aun los más pequeños, lo hicimos por El.

Y La Sagrada Eucaristía nos recuerda de las divisiones entre Cristianos, que no van de acuerdo con la voluntad de Dios. Recemos como lo hizo Jesús, para que todos seamos uno.
