



In the coming days, I suggest we all reflect on those in our midst who seem to be alone. Who can we invite into our lives who need something much more important than a party? Who is out there who simply need friends? They may not need a physical shelter but they do need the warmth of Christian hospitality and the kindness of others.





VATICAN CORNER On September 16, 2023 a new statue was installed in a

niche outside of St. Peter's Basilica at the Vatican. It is a statue of Saint Andrew Kim Tae-gon the patron saint of Korea. It is 12 feet tall, made of Carrara marble, weighs six tons and St. Kim is wearing a traditional Korean dopo (overcoat) and flat hat. The date of the installation was chosen as the anniversary of when St. Kim was beheaded by the Korean Joseon Dynasty, making Kim one of Korea's earliest martyrs, killed because of his religious belief. The statue was proposed by Cardinal Lazzaro You Heungsik, a Korean who Pope Francis in 2021 assigned to be the head of the Dicastery for the Clergy, part of the Vatican government responsible for overseeing matters regarding priest and deacons not belonging to religious orders.



Pope Francis had approved the statue and he welcomed a delegation of 300 clergy and lay members of the Korean Church who came to the Vatican for the dedication of the statue in a private audience. The statue was blessed by Cardinal Mauro Gambetti, archpriest of St. Peter's Basilica. Cardinal You speaking to Vatican press said the statue's dedication at the Vatican brought great joy to the Church in Korea. He said "We are very happy that Pope Francis wanted to accept our proposal, and it is a great honor for our Korean Church, which is very linked to the figure of this saint." "We believe and hope that he (Saint Kim) can be increasingly loved and his intercession invoked by the faithful from all over the world." St. Kim, after converting to Catholicism at the age of 15, was trained for the priesthood in Macao an autonomous region across the Pearl River Delta from Hong Kong, and he was ordained in 1836. Kim returned to Korea despite ongoing vicious religious persecution in order to evangelize his homeland. He was the first native Korean priest. He was only 25 years old when he was tortured and ultimately beheaded for the crime of being a Catholic. St. Kim writing shortly before his death, tried to encourage Christians to stay true to the faith. He wrote "We have received baptism, entrance into the Church, and the honor of being called Christians. Yet what good will this do us if we are Christians in name only and not in fact?" In his last hour of life, St. Kim said "Listen to me attentively. If I have held communication with foreigners, it has been for my religion and for my God. It is for him that I die. My immortal life is on the point of beginning. Become Christians if you wish to be happy after death, because God has eternal punishments in store for those who refused to know him." Along with 102 other Korean martyrs, whose executions had also been documented, Kim was canonized and became a saint on May 6, 1984 by Pope John Paul II during a visit to Korea. Approximately 10,000 Korean Christians were killed for their faith although their executions were not well documented. Christianity became tolerated in Korea in 1884. There are currently more than 5 million Catholics in South Korea, which is about 11.3% of the country's total population. In North Korea however, Christianity is brutally repressed under the dictatorship of Kim Jong Un. Anyone caught practicing religion or even suspected of holding religious views in private, can be arrested, tortured, imprisoned, and executed. At the end of this year's World Youth Day in Lisbon, Portugal, Pope Francis announced that the next World Youth Day will take place in Seoul, South Korea in 2027. Asia had been a major focus of Francis recently. When completing a four day trip to Mongolia. He said: "I have been to the heart of Asia, and it did me good."
