



VATICAN CORNER

Every day during the month of brutal fighting in the Gaza Strip

between Israel and Hamas, Pope Francis has called and talked with the priests, nuns and parishioners of Gaza City's Holy Family Church, the only Western rite parish in Gaza. He assured them that they are in his prayers and that he knows the suffering they are enduring, and offers his full sympathy. Father Gabriel Romanelli, an Argentine priest, who has lived in the Middle East for 28 years, is the church pastor and he said "in the parish we have taken in (initially) more than 80 Christians and other Muslim neighbors of our school who have requested accommodation there." "There are hundreds of dead and thousands of injured among the population. In asking for prayers for peace he repeated a saying of Pope Pius XII and Pope St. John Paul II had said: "nothing is lost with peace, everything can be lost with war." expressed gratitude for the closeness, concern and prayers and



the "hundreds of messages" he receives each day. The church has two Masses every day and the Rosary is prayed with the children and their families. One Sunday a mother was afraid for her son and asked that he be baptized. Sister Nabila Saleh said "It was a moment of spiritual resurrection and rebirth for all of us." She said "we want this brutal war to end." "Many people have lost loved ones, their homes, and everything they have. We ask for justice and peace. The Palestinian people also have the right to live. We ask not to punish the population because of a fanatic group. And then we ask that you pray for us." As of 2015, Palestinian Christians comprised less than 1% of the population in the Gaza Strip and approximately 1-2.5 % of the West Bank (area west of the Jordan River), those being the two Palestinian territories. In 1922 Palestine's Christian population was 9.5%. A large number of Arab Christians fled or were expelled from the Jewish-controlled areas during the 1948 Arab-Israeli War, and a small number left for economic reasons during the Jordanian control of the West Bank from 1948 to 1967. After the 1967 Arab-Israeli War the number of Palestinian Christians has increased but its percentage of the population had continued to decrease. Father Romanelli said about the time before the attack on Israel by Hamas, "We anticipated that something could happen, since in May (2023) we had a five-day war. [War] was already in the air; it was certainly a very violent year, and even though the May hostilities had ceased, the entire area did not look good." However, he noted, "as much as we suspected that something was going to happen, more by way of experience, more because of what's in the air, in the environment, I never imagined something like this." He said he has a responsibility "for many people, sick people, families, we have more than 10 Caritas clinics that have been prepared for an emergency for several months." But "there is so much confusion that it's not known where the needs are." When Israeli forces ordered more than a million residents to move from the northern part of the Gaza Strip to the south, hundreds of thousands did not follow those orders. Many from the small Christian community, which numbers about 1,000, instead took their families to stay in their churches, thinking they would be safe there, as they have been during previous battles between Israel and Palestinian armed factions. But after a deadly Israeli air strike hit an outbuilding of the Greek Orthodox Church of St. Porphyrius, all sense of security was lost. Eighteen Christian women, men and children were killed. As of this writing it is estimated that more than 10,800 people in Gaza have been killed since the start of the war, according to the Hamas-run health ministry, including more than 4,400 children. Father Romanelli said "I want to hope and I ask God to stop everything, there is nothing impossible for God." He hopes there will be a truce and that a humanitarian corridor can be established to help the victims of the conflict. George Anton who is sheltering in the Holy Family Church compound with his wife and three daughters said "We trust Pope Francis, but we don't trust others to listen to the voice of peace." He said "It's a very scary thing. You feel you sit waiting for your turn to die. You don't know when and you don't know how or why." Mr. Anton works for the Roman Catholic charity Caritas, and he says he has had to have tough conversations with his daughters aged 8, 10, and 12. "I am telling them the whole truth. I say we are with Jesus, but I also tell them that they are in a war." "Sometimes, I leave them to go to get bread, to bring medicine or clothes, and every time I go, I say, 'Goodbye. If I return back, all's ok. If not, guys, that's it." He says there is no keeping his girls from the horror of death and destruction. "This is what they hear from 600 people around them in the church, watching videos on the internet. This is what they see from the bombardment all around. They do not sleep at night because they're terrified. The sound of the rockets is like Hell." Sources: bbc.com,ncregister.com, vaticannews.va, wikipedia.com
