VATICAN CORNER

Cremation is the process by which



very high temperatures are used to reduce a deceased person's body into brittle, calcified bones which are then processed into ashes. Cremation is an increasing popular choice for funeral arrangements, and it is predicted by the National Funeral Directors Association that it will be used over 80% of the time by the year 2045. Cremation's growing preference is largely due to its affordability and flexibility, offering families a more cost-effective and adaptable alternative. The Bible does not explicitly forbid or condone cremation. 1 Corinthians 15:35-38 and Thessalonians 4:16 describe that our bodies will eventually be resurrected by God. For many years it was the Church's position

that to reach Heaven and enjoy eternal life then one's deceased body needed to be buried. Since Jesus was buried in a tomb after the crucifixion, and then rose again in three days, that influenced many to follow in his footsteps and use a traditional burial. Also, historically another big reason why traditional burial was used was for the Catholic religion to difference itself from the other pagan religions which commonly used funeral pyres to send off their deceased to the afterlife. The Bible does not say a cremated body cannot rise, in fact, the Vatican explicitly approved cremation in 1963 as a final disposition if the practice remains in line with the fundamental belief in the resurrection. In their approval the Church was saying that Catholics have nothing to fear from choosing cremation as their final arrangement. Any misgivings Catholic may have about cremation are strictly holdovers from long ago times. Church permitted cremation has strict rules that need to be followed, but on December 9, 2023, those rules were changed slightly by the approval of Pope Francis. Italian Cardinal Matteo Zuppi of Bologna asked for Church guidance because of people who could no longer pay for the continued upkeep of ashes preserved at cemeteries in Italy, and those people who wanted to scatter the deceased's ashes in nature. The Cardinal asked that given "the canonical prohibition against scattering the ashes of the deceased, was it possible instead to prepare a permanent sacred place for the commingling of the ashes of different people together? The Vatican's department of the Doctrine of the Faith explained that the body of the resurrected person will not necessarily consist of the same elements that it had before it died, and even if the body has been totally destroyed or dispersed, the resurrection can still occur. So, they agree to allow the commingling of ashes at a permanent sacred place such as a cemetery, or in an area dedicated to this purpose by the ecclesiastical authority. The identity of each person is to be identified so not to lose the memory of their names. The Cardinal also asked if a family may be allowed "to keep a portion of their family members ashes in a place that is significant for the history of the deceased?" The Vatican's doctrinal office said the ashes must be kept in "sacred places", and therefore not at home, divided among family members nor scattered to the wind. It warned that a Christian funeral could be denied to those who request that they be scattered. But they added that relatives may ask for "a minimal part of the ashes of their relative to be stored in a place of significance for the history of the deceased person." This would be on condition that anti-Christian practices such as pantheism or naturalism are "ruled out" and that the remaining part of the ashes are kept in a sacred place. Keeping ashes in a sacred place "ensures they are not excluded from the prayers and remembrance of their family or the Christian community," and prevents the departed from being forgotten, or their remains being shown a lack of respect." 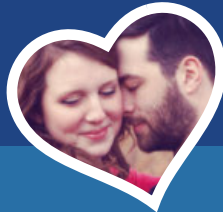
