


VATICAN CORNER The terms of the historic 2018 agreement between the Vatican and the government

of Mainland China were never released, but from all appearances, it looks that Beijing has violated the agreement by making bishop appointments without the Pope's consent. Beijing also has changed some historic dioceses boundaries that were created by the Vatican in another apparent violation of the agreement. In the Catholic Church, the pope is the only one who has the power to create, modify, or delete dioceses, and the only one who can assign a diocese to a bishop. The Vatican entered into this agreement with China with the hope of uniting China's estimated 12 million Catholics, who have been divided between an official church which is government supervised and an underground church with bishops sworn loyalty to the Vatican. The Chinese government is a communist state based on a system of people's congress under the leadership of the Chinese



Communist Party. It is estimated that 52% of the population are atheists or unaffiliated, 22% follow folk religions, 18% are Buddhists, 5% are Christians, 2% are Muslims and 1% are Hindus, Jews and Taoists. Religion seems to be important to China's government, but nationalism and the fear of foreign powers seem to be more important. China has demanded that they alone should choose their country's religious leaders. China's reason for entering into the agreement with the Vatican seems to be to give them more control over the Catholic religion in China. The agreement apparently did nothing for the Catholic priests and bishops who were detained in China and who are believed to have died in prison. The agreement does not involve full diplomatic relations between Beijing and the Vatican. The reason for this roadblock is that Vatican City is the only remaining European government still having bilateral relations with the island of Taiwan, which China claims is part of their territory, although they do not control it. The 2018 historic agreement apparently still allowed the Vatican to have final say in the selection of future bishops; however they are to be selected from a short list nominated by the government. The agreement has been renewed by both sides twice since 2018, and will come up for review again this coming October. In April, 2023, Bishop Joseph Shen Bin transferred himself from the Diocese of Haimen to the Diocese of Shanghai with the backing of the Chinese state. This was done without the Pope's permission in violation of the 2018 agreement. This move to Shanghai was widely interpreted as a kind of necessary self-promotion for the bishop to move to a larger diocese, in order to reflect his position of importance within the state church apparatus. He is the current president of the Bishop's Conference of the Catholic Church in China a group not established nor controlled by the Vatican. The Vatican has not yet been able to get China to walk back any illegal Church appointments, and it is clear that China will continue to make episcopal appointment without Vatican input. On January 29, 2024, it was announced that Pope Francis has created a new diocese in China, which matches the boundary lines drawn by Beijing, and this was done back in April 2023. In China the Catholic Church has 97 dioceses, 20 archdiocese, 28 apostolic prefectures, and two ecclesiastical administrations. However the Chinese government has claimed there are only 104 dioceses. Also after a one year delay, Pope Francis has appointed three new bishops to China. The Vatican has said the new appointments took place within the framework of the 2018 agreement. In July, 2023 Cardinal Parolin the Vatican Secretary of State said underground Catholics in China continue to be treated with suspicion by the government, even though, he stressed, "they sincerely want to be loyal citizens and be respected in their conscience and in their faith." The indications are that China is gradually creeping toward a practically independent Communist Catholic Church.





Lenten Fasting and Abstinence

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are obligatory days of universal fast and abstinence. Fasting is obligatory for all who have completed their 18th year until the beginning of their 60th year. Fasting allows a person to eat one full meal. Two smaller meals may be taken, not to equal one full meal. Abstinence (from meat) is obligatory for all who have completed their 14th year of age. If possible, the fast on Good Friday is continued until the Easter Vigil (on Holy Saturday night) as the "paschal fast" to honor the suffering and death of the Lord Jesus and to prepare to share more fully and celebrate more readily his Resurrection. Fridays in Lent are obligatory days of abstinence (from meat) for all who have completed their 14th year. As always, anyone for whom fasting or abstinence would pose a health risk is excused. This year Ash Wednesday falls on February 14. The Sacred Fast and beginning of Lent far surpass "Valentine's Day" in religious importance.


