




Every year on February 11th, the

Catholic Church observes a day of awareness called World Day of the Sick. This day was introduced by Pope John Paul II, and is aimed at getting everyone to offer prayers for those suffering from illnesses, and to encourage all to see the face of Christ in his and her ailing brothers and sisters. Pope Francis spoke to the faithful gathered at St. Peter's Square during his Sunday Angelus (prayer) on Feb. 11, 2024 and he prayed for all those who are unable to receive medical treatment in the world, and especially in



war-torn nations such as Myanmar, Palestine, Israel and Ukraine. This year he said he wanted to "draw attention to the importance of relationships in illness." He said the first thing that we need when we are sick is "the closeness of loved ones" as well as that of health workers and of God. "We are all called to be close to those who suffer, are sick, or frail. He said it is not possible to keep silent, as this day is celebrated, "about the fact that there are so many people today who are denied the right to care, and therefore the right to life!" "I am thinking of those living in extreme poverty: but I am also thinking of the territories of war: there, fundamental human rights are violated every day! It is intolerable."

The continuing war between Israel and Hamas in the Gaza Strip has brought reports of increasing hunger and practically nonexistent medical care. There are a high numbers of children needing urgent help. Father Ibrahim Faltas, Franciscan friar, and the Vicar of Custody of Holy Land wanting to get urgently needed care to the injured and sick children of Gaza. He talked with the Italian government and received their enthusiastic support to providing humanitarian aid. Italy worked intensively with the Israeli authorities, the Palestinian national authorities, and the Egyptian authorities, and an agreement to help the "innocent victims" was reached. Italy became the first European country to launch an international rescue operation for the victims of the war in Gaza. The Vatican's Bambino Gesú pediatric hospital in Rome took in the first of a number of young people transported to Italy for medical treatment. The first Italian airlift was on January 29, 2024 and it brought 10 children and one 18 year old man. The 11 had been taken south across the border into Egypt in preparation for their flight to Italy Following the first airlift, the Italian hospital ship "Vulcano" made the 4-to-5 day trip from Egypt bringing another 50 to 60 children with their guardians to Italy. Other Italian pediatric hospitals in Genoa, Bologna and Florence, have agreed, and are receiving children besides the Vatican hospital. The Italian government and armed forces studied the possibility of setting up a field hospital in Gaza, but the security situation made that impossible. The ongoing bombings in the southern part of the Gaza have made the situation even more difficult.. Another airlift is expected in February. Father Ibrahim Faltas said "This morning, I experienced moments of intense emotion, seeing the youngest child at just 4 months, to one at 18 months, who arrived here alone because they lost everyone. Many told me they were rescued from the rubble of their homes. Unfortunately, none of the operators spoke Arabic, so they quickly became attached to me and didn't want me to leave. A little one called me 'dad.' We absolutely must continue this operation; there is still much suffering in Gaza that needs attention." Sources: vaticannews.va, Americanmagazine.org, aleteia.org.






