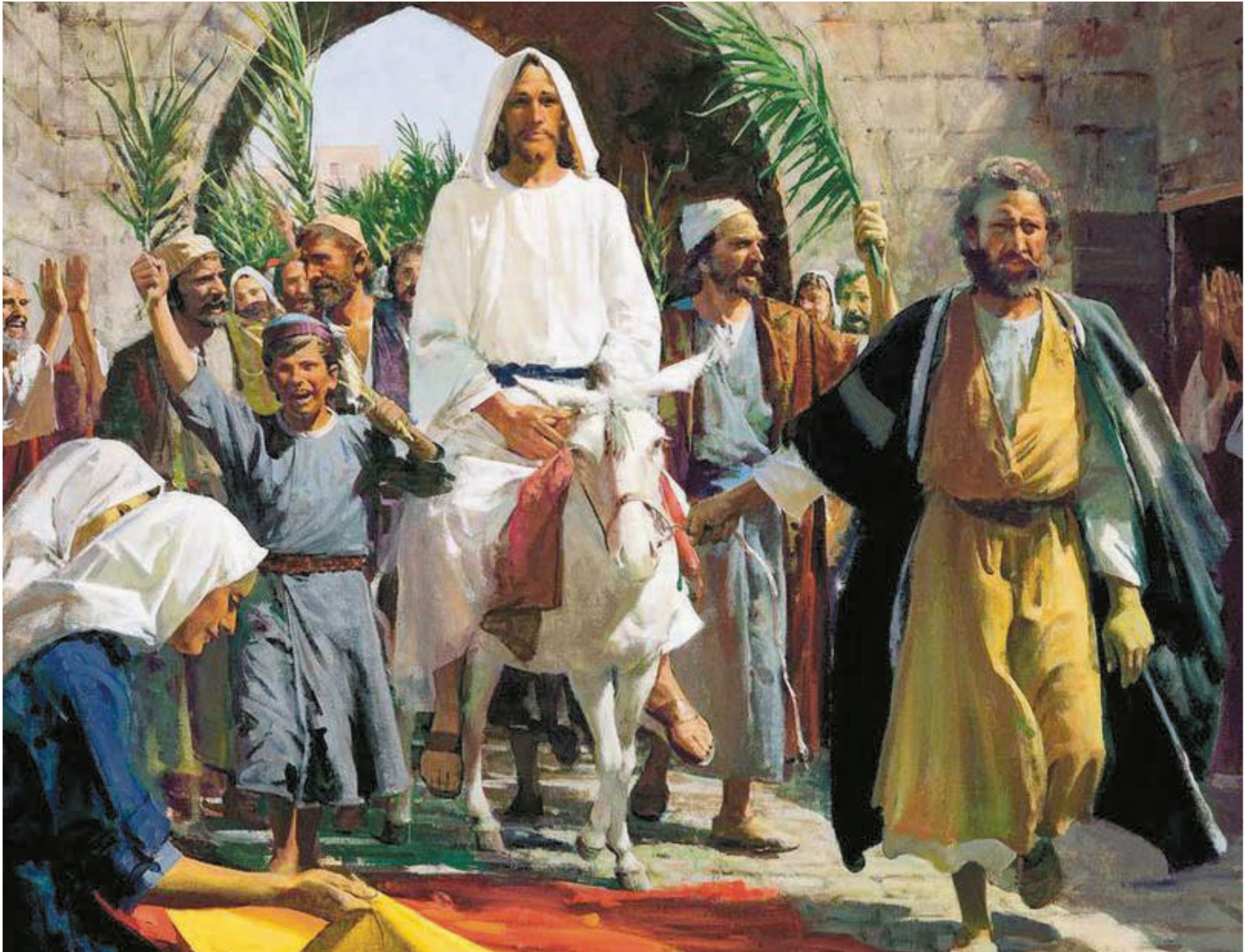

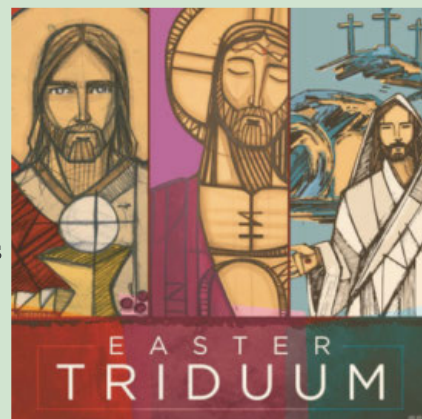

The Easter Triduum

Easter Triduum is a term used by the Roman Catholic Church to denote the three days from the evening of Holy Thursday to the evening of Easter Sunday. The Triduum begins with the evening Mass of the Lord's Supper and ends after evening prayers at sunset on Easter Day. The term was used at the Second Vatican Council, when the revised liturgical calendar set the final part of Holy Week apart from Lent proper. Previously, these three days had already gained distinction from the rest of Holy Week with an observance of silence, which were also known as "the still days"

The single celebration of the Triduum marks the end of the Lenten season, and leads to the Mass of the Resurrection of the Lord at the Easter Vigil. The liturgical services that take place during the Triduum are:

- * Mass of the Lord's Supper
- * Good Friday of the Lord's Passion
- * Mass of the Resurrection of the Lord



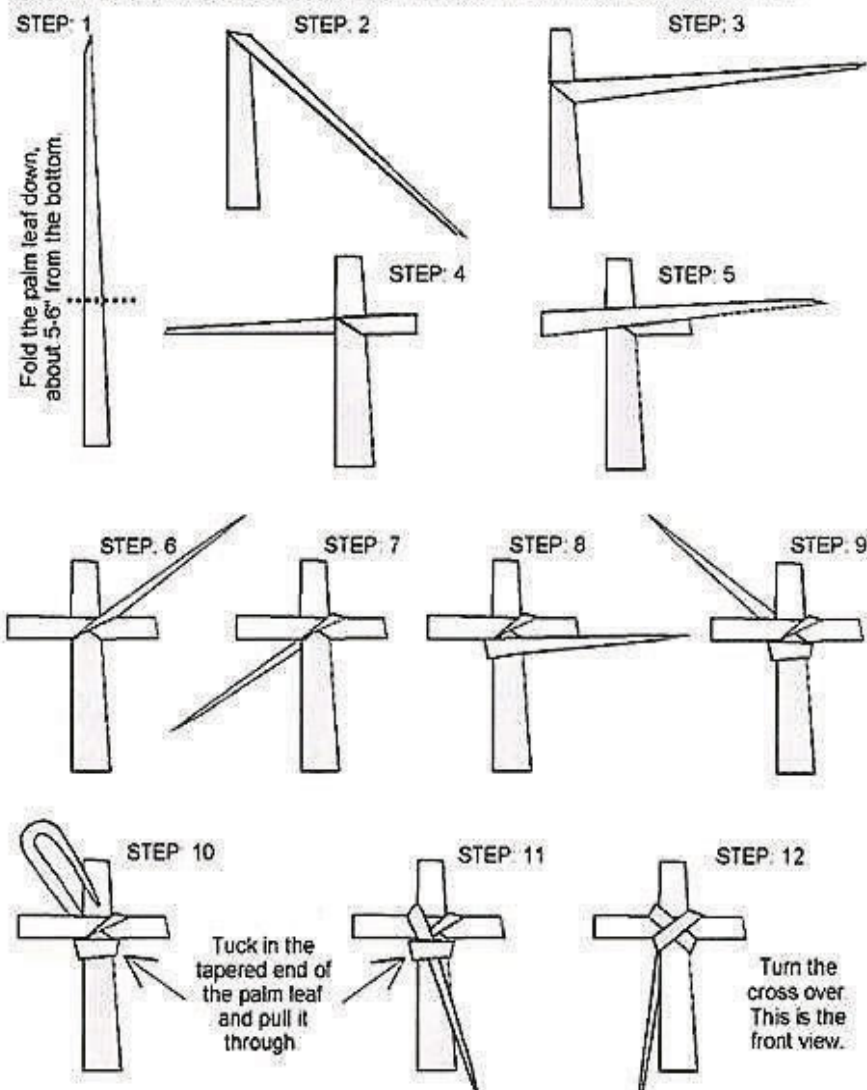

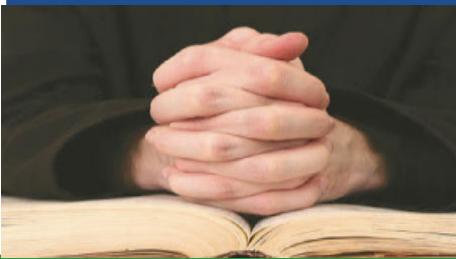

VATICAN CORNER

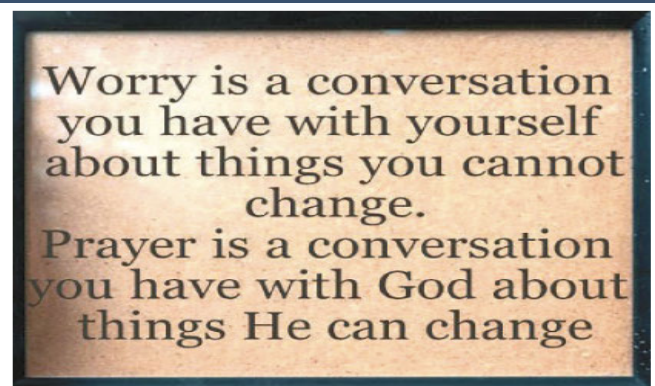
Why do we call it Good Friday,

when it is the day Jesus suffered a painful and cruel death and was laid in the tomb, a day of sorrow and remembrance? In the past the day has been called The Holy and Great Friday, Holy Friday, Sorrowful Friday, Sacred Friday, Passion Friday, and the Long Friday. The origin of the name Good Friday is not clearly known. One explanation is that it was derived from "God's Friday" in the way that "goodbye" came from a contraction of the phrase "God be with you". But many language experts believe it came from the meaning of the word holy in old English for the word "good". Examples of this are calling the Bible "the good book, calling Christmas "good tide, and formerly calling Holy Wednesday Good Wednesday. However, another reason may be because of its religious significance. Because of Jesus's death it led to the Resurrection of Jesus and his victory over death and sin, the celebration of Easter and the opening of Heaven's gates for the just souls who had gone before him. It may seem strange to call the day that Jesus died "good" but it was truly good.



When the Bible says there were three days and nights between the Crucifixion of Jesus on Good Friday and his Resurrection on Easter Sunday, how does that timing make sense? Jesus died around three in the afternoon on Friday and was entombed shortly thereafter. The Resurrection occurred by dawn on Sunday. So Friday - 9 hours, Saturday - 24 hours and Sunday - 6 hours (or less) equals 39 hours, much less than the 72 hours of "three days. There has been much study and discussion about this matter and some scholars believe the Crucifixion actually took place on Wednesday, basing their theory on their interpretation of certain Biblical phrases. Pope Benedict XVI discussed this view in his series of books entitled Jesus of Nazareth. But there is another solution which makes the timing of events of Holy Week work, and that timing is not a dogma of the Faith - a truth revealed by God. Scholars can explore other timing scenarios. There are at least eight cases in the Gospels that Jesus referred to the time he would rise as "On the Third Day". In Matthew, the Jewish authorities asked that the tomb be secured until "the third day". Also, Mark records three instances of him saying he will rise "after three days", and John says it will happen in "three days". The explanation involves understanding the Jewish way of counting 3 days. Where the ancient Jews differ from us is that they would often count parts of a day as wholes. Also the Jewish day starts at nightfall and continues throughout the night and the following day, until the next nightfall. So the Crucifixion ending before sundown on Friday is day one, Saturday is day two (the Sabbath). and day three begins at sundown on Saturday and includes the Resurrection.

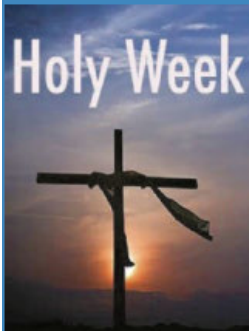
