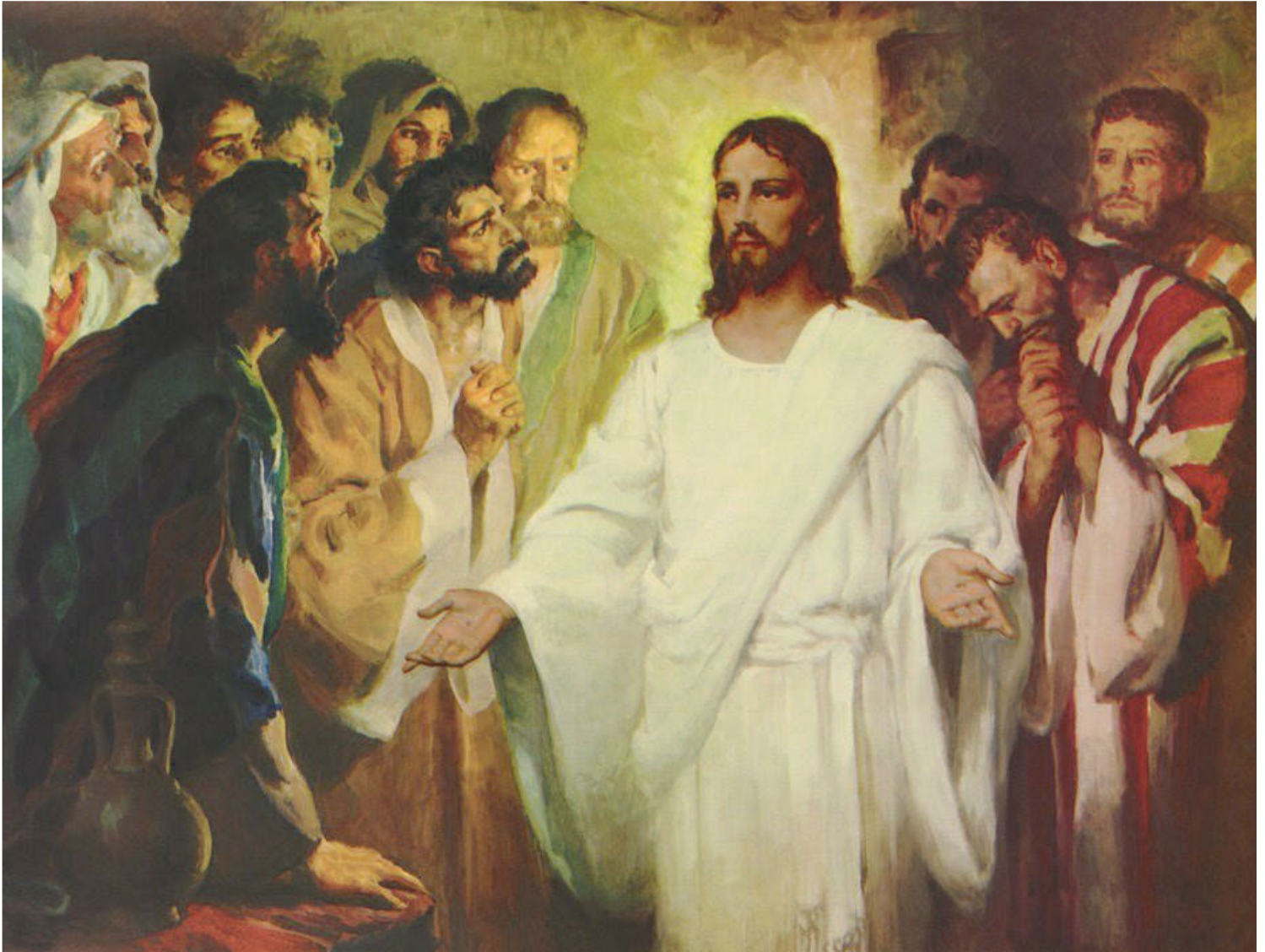

## VATICAN CORNER

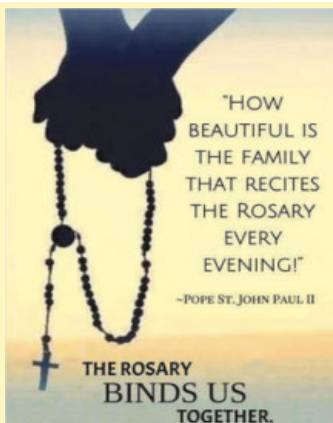
After Pope John Paul II died on

April 2, 2005, the conclave to elect his successor ended with Cardinal Joseph Ratzinger becoming Pope Benedict XVI. The Spanish journalist Javier Martinez-Brocal has interviewed Pope Francis about his relationship with Pope Benedict and what were revealed, among other things, were some interesting detail about that conclave. The interview resulted in a new book published March 31, 2024 called *The Successor*. In the preface of the book, Pope Francis explains that cardinals are sworn not to reveal what happens in a conclave, but he says “popes are allowed to tell.”

Francis was then Cardinal Jorge Mario Bergoglio of Buenos Aires, and he says that his name was used by a group of cardinals “to block Benedict’s election and then negotiate for a different, third candidate.” He said he had received 40 of the 115 votes from among the cardinal-electors which was “enough to stop the candidacy of Cardinal Joseph Ratzinger, because if they would have kept voting for me he would not have been able to reach the two-thirds needed to be elected pope.” That group of cardinals “still did not agree on who, but they were on the verge of throwing out a name.” Francis said once he learned of their strategy after the second day of voting, he told Colombian Cardinal Darío Castrillón Hoyos, to not “joke with my candidacy” and to cease supporting him, “because I’m not going to accept” being elected.” “And from there Benedict was elected.” Pope Francis did not identify this group of conclave manipulators but said they later told him they did not want a “foreign” pope. It is unclear what the term “foreign” meant, but it had been used before meaning a non-Italian pope when describing John Paul II who was from Poland. Although Pope Francis was born and raised in Argentina, he is ethnically Italian, with his parents being Italian immigrants. In the interview Francis said Cardinal Ratzinger “was my candidate” in the conclave, and he came out of the conclave feeling pleased. “If they had elected someone like me, who makes a lot of trouble, I wouldn’t have been able to do anything.” “At that time, it would not have been possible.” Nonetheless, the papacy “wasn’t easy” for Benedict XVI, who “encountered a lot of resistance within the Vatican.”

Pope Francis’ picks for the College of Cardinal who will vote for his successor after he dies (or resigns) may indicate his reaction to the objection he encounter to a “foreign pope”. Over time with his picks he is tilting the leadership structure of the Roman Catholic Church away from its historic European base and toward countries in Africa, Asia and Latin America. In September 2023 after 18 new voting cardinals were installed, the Asia-Pacific region accounts for 18% of voting-age cardinals, up from 9% in 2013, Latin American – Caribbean region accounts for 18%, up from 16% in 2013, Sub-Saharan Africa accounts for 13% of cardinals, up from 9% in 2013, Europe accounts for 39%, down from 52% in 2013, North America accounts for 10%, down from 12% in 2013, and the Middle East-North Africa region will have 1%, down from 2% in 2013. Francis’ Cardinal choices look to be an attempt to reduce imbalance. Pope Francis was also asked in the interview what the Holy Spirit was saying to the Church through the election of Benedict XVI. “I am in charge here,” Pope Francis said was the Spirit’s response.” “There is no room for maneuver.”
