



Ascension of the Lord

Question:

Couldn't Jesus have done more good if he stayed on earth, rather than ascended into heaven?

Answer:

This is an interesting question! During his earthly life, Jesus gave sight to the blind, healed paralytics, drove out demons, and fed thousands with only a few loaves of bread. Imagine what he could have done if he'd never ascended into heaven! Imagine what our world could be! It's an interesting thought to consider, especially as the world faces challenges that only seem to deepen and expand. Yet at the Last Supper, Jesus says, "It is better for you if I go." Why? His response must have seemed strange to the Apostles at the time. In his place, Jesus says, he will send the Paraclete, the Comforter, the Advocate. He promises to send the Holy Spirit.

Jesus' departure allows the Apostles to become the leaders he has formed them to be. Jesus is no longer situated in only one geographical location, and his Church will never be a political kingdom. Soon after the Ascension, we celebrate Pentecost — the descent of the Holy Spirit and the radical empowerment of the followers of Jesus. We share in that empowerment and in that mission. Jesus is present in the sacraments, and he is present in us. Through our faith, hope, and love, we are called to be the good he does here on earth!

Ascensión del Señor

Pregunta: ¿No podría Jesús haber hecho más bien si se hubiera quedado en la tierra en lugar de ascender al cielo?

Respuesta: ¡Esta es una pregunta interesante! Durante su vida terrenal, Jesús dio la vista a los ciegos, curó a los paralíticos, expulsó demonios y alimentó a miles de personas con sólo unas pocas hogazas de pan. ¡Imaginate lo que podría haber hecho si nunca hubiera ascendido al cielo! ¡Imaginate lo que podría ser nuestro mundo! Es interesante considerar esta idea, especialmente ahora que el mundo enfrenta desafíos que sólo parecen profundizarse y expandirse. Sin embargo, en la Última Cena, Jesús dice: "Es mejor para vosotros si yo voy." ¿Por qué? Su respuesta debió parecerles extraña a los Apóstoles en ese momento. En su lugar, dice Jesús, enviará al Paráclito, al Consolador, al Abogado. Promete enviar el Espíritu Santo.

La partida de Jesús permite a los Apóstoles convertirse en los líderes para los que él los ha formado. Jesús ya no está situado en un solo lugar geográfico y su Iglesia nunca será un reino político. Poco después de la Ascensión, celebramos Pentecostés: el descenso del Espíritu Santo y el empoderamiento radical de los seguidores de Jesús. Nosotros compartimos ese empoderamiento y esa misión. Jesús está presente en los sacramentos y está presente en nosotros. ¡A través de nuestra fe, esperanza y amor, estamos llamados a ser el bien que él hace aquí en la tierra!




VATICAN CORNER According to James Hough, author, former seminarian, and teacher of Catholicism, the

job of being Pope "is a miserable, thankless job, whose reward is only in the next life; and that reward might easily be eternal damnation if he screwed it up too badly." Hough says "It is absolutely terrifying to be chosen to be pope. This is why they allow the chosen candidate to back down before anyone knows of it. And the changing room behind the High Altar where the newly elected pope changes into white robes has long been known as the 'room of tears.'" Hough goes on to say that the pope "has no vacations, no private time, etc.," and "he can't step one foot out of his apartment without people attending to him every instant." The pope's smallest comment is published and analyzed by untold numbers of people who endlessly repeat what he said, and then tell you what he meant. "The pope " is responsible before God for the salvation of millions of people all over the world. He is going to be judged before God on how many souls were lost under his papacy and how many were saved,... so pray for our Holy Father." According to author/engineer TomcatS, "Dealing with the politics of the Church



increases exponentially as part of (the pope's) new position" from regional to global. "The pope's life is essentially no longer his own, overseen by a papal staff that organizes every moment of his day, and that includes ambassadors and government officials and heads of state from all over the world. Only by the help of the Holy Spirit could one man face the challenge. Pope Francis turned 87 in December 2023, and has shown almost no signs of slowing down. He keeps up a routine that even a much younger man would struggle with. He wakes up at 4:30 a.m., prays and celebrates Mass, then holds his morning meetings, usually around five to seven meetings each morning. Then he has lunch, a 45-minute siesta, and then private meetings and phone calls until his 8 p.m. dinner and 9 p.m. bedtime. Pope Francis also works on the weekends and his summer holidays are not spent at Castel Gandolfo like other popes, but instead he works in the Vatican, but without his two weekly public audiences and with fewer public meetings so he can spend his time writing and reading, listening to music and meeting with friends. He usually takes about five international pastoral visits per year and those visits have packed schedules. His goal on many of those trips is to support the Catholic Church in the distant peripheries. He also regularly visits the peripheries of Rome, both its poor suburbs and its hospitals, rehabilitation centers, prisons and facilities for migrants and refugees. But Pope Francis' visits to the hospital have been increasing. A bout with sciatic pain in 2020, ten days in 2021 after colon surgery, inflamed knee ligament in 2022 which caused him to use a wheelchair to avoid most standing and walking, four days in March 2023 with bronchitis, eleven days in June 2023 following abdominal surgery. Reports throughout 2023 have said Francis's knee pain has significantly improved, although he often still uses the wheelchair. Pope Francis is becoming one of the oldest popes in history, fewer than 10 of the 266 popes served at that age of 87. According to Vatican correspondent Gerard O'Connell, Pope Francis seems focused on cementing his legacy through the ongoing synodal calling it "the most transformative event in the Catholic Church since the Second Vatican Council", and through appointment of his key ally Cardinal Victor Manuel Fernández as the Vatican's new doctrinal chief. However, it may be time for Pope Francis to slow down some, or face other ailments for which he might not be able to fully OVErcome. Sources: Quora.com, americanmagazine.org



Registration Requirements:

- 1.1. If this is your child's first year, a <u>copy</u> of his/her Birth, Baptism will be required at the time of registration and First Communion Certificates (for Confirmation registration) will also be required. Please make sure you bring copies and NOT originals.
- 2. If your child has not been baptized they MUST be baptized before the classes start in September .
- 3. If this is your child's second year, <u>tuition for their first year must have been paid in full</u> and copies of Birth, Baptism and First Communion (for Confirmation registration) Certificates must be already in the office before registration as a continuing student.
- 4. Classes can fill up and applications are accepted on a first come basis for students that have completed all the requirements.
