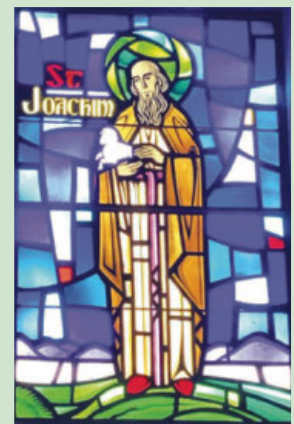

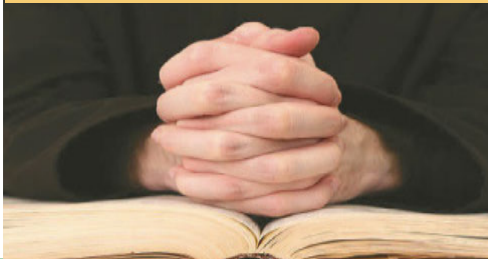

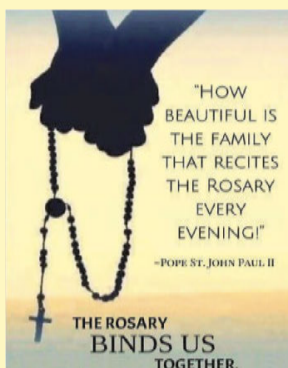
VATICAN CORNER

In our solar system there are many moons circling planets, but Earth's Moon has shown in computer simulations to be unique among the solar system, and possibly rare throughout the universe. Research reveals that less than 10 percent of terrestrial planets may have a moon massive enough compared with the planet it is circling to provide the stability that life needs to develop. Our moon makes Earth a more livable planet by moderating Earth's wobble on its axis, leading to a relatively stable climate. Without the moon, Earth, like a spinning top, would at certain times stand straight up and there would be no seasons then, but at other times, Earth would lean way over, and the poles would be very hot and the equator freezing cold. The moon also creates the tides and for certain living things it drives reproductive cycles. Also the Moon's nearness to the Earth encourages space exploration. We should thank God for such a wonderful celestial gift. However maybe it is time to remove the moon factor in the calculation done to determine the date when we



celebrate Jesus' death and resurrection - Easter. The Jewish Passover is the commemoration of the Biblical story of Exodus – where God freed the Israelites from slavery in Egypt. The date of Passover is calculated from the lunar calendar, and it was around Passover when the events of Easter occurred. So the calculation for the date of Easter has always been dependent on the lunar calendar. This then has caused Easter's date to vary from year to year. It always falls between March 22 and April 25 on a Sunday and is the on first Sunday after the first full moon on or after the spring equinox. Roman Catholics now also use the present day Gregorian calendar in determining the date of Easter while the Eastern Orthodox Christians use the older Julian calendar. Also some Orthodox use a revised Julian calendar while others do not. Because of the use of the different calendars there are relatively few years in which the Catholics and the Orthodox celebrate Easter on the same Sunday. The coming year, 2025 is one of those years. Also the year 2025 will be the 1700th anniversary of the First Council of Nicaea which is the first Ecumenical Council of the Church. That Council established the method of calculating the date of Easter. Since at least the Second Vatican Council in 1962, the Catholic Church has had the goal of making an agreement with the Orthodox Churches regarding the date of Easter. Both groups have pointed to the year 2025 to make that goal a reality, which would be a step toward Christian unity. Since the Second Vatican Council, Catholics have been open to adopting any method of determining the date of Easter, even to have a permanent date and take the moon out of the calculation if the rest of the Christian world, especially the Orthodox agree. Pope Francis in 2022 repeated Saint Paul VI statement that "we are ready to accept any proposal that is made together." But both sides have some concerns about the establishment of a common date. Using the Julian calendar does not reflect astronomical reality and over the centuries it has gotten off by two weeks. Faith cannot be contrary to reason but build upon it, so going back to the less accurate Julian calendar would not make sense. The Orthodox are wary of appearing to be losing or being absorbed by the Catholics if they just adopted the Gregorian calendar. So that probably will not happen. The third concern is if a fixed date for Easter is established, where the lunar cycle is left out of the calculation then Easter will become disconnected from ancient tradition. Establishing a common date for Easter would make a more unified Christendom, therefore, it is worth the effort of trying.
