Holy Water

Question:

What is holy water and how do I explain the reason that it is placed at the entrances of churches to my non-Catholic friends?

Answer:

Holy water is a sacramental, a reminder of the life of the Church expressed and celebrated through the sacraments. God's grace is mediated through word and gesture (the outward signs). This comes to us through Jesus (instituted by Christ) as he entrusts to the Church his saving mission (to give grace). In turn the Church, through the sacraments, shares that grace and mission with us.

On Ash Wednesday, we receive ashes on our foreheads to remind us of our origins, humbly created from the dust. But by blessing ourselves with holy water, we are reminded of our destiny! We are baptized sons and daughters of God. This is also a call to conversion, to live more fully our baptismal call to live as disciples of Jesus. We see holy water whenever we renew our baptismal promises. This will occur during the Easter liturgy as well, reminding us that we are indeed on a journey of faith and renewed in Christ. Blessing ourselves with holy water reminds us that we are baptized into a community faith, and always in need of turning from sin and toward God. Holy water is a visible sign of our baptism! ©I Pi



Pregunta:

¿Qué es el agua bendita y cómo les explico a mis amigos no católicos el motivo por el que se coloca en las entradas de las iglesias?

Respuesta:

El agua bendita es un sacramental, un recordatorio de la vida de la Iglesia expresada y celebrada a través de los sacramentos. La gracia de Dios está mediada por palabras y gestos (los signos externos). Esto nos llega a través de Jesús (instituido por Cristo) cuando confía a la Iglesia su misión salvadora (dar gracia). A su vez, la Iglesia, a través de los sacramentos, comparte esa gracia y misión con nosotros.

El Miércoles de Ceniza recibimos cenizas en la frente para recordarnos nuestros orígenes, creados humildemente del polvo. ¡Pero al bendecirnos con agua bendita, recordamos nuestro destino! Somos hijos e hijas bautizados de Dios. Este es también un llamado a la conversión, a vivir más plenamente nuestra llamada bautismal a vivir como discípulos de Jesús. Vemos agua bendita cada vez que renovamos nuestras promesas bautismales. Esto también ocurrirá durante la liturgia pascual, recordándonos que de hecho estamos en un camino de fe y renovados en Cristo. Bendecirnos con agua bendita nos recuerda que somos bautizados en una fe comunitaria y que siempre necesitamos alejarnos del pecado y acercarnos a Dios. VATICAN CORNER

Starting Sept. 2, 2024, Pope Francis

began his first international trip of the year, after a period of slower travel due to his age and health. It is his longest papal trip ever, a 20,000 mile roundtrip 12- day journey to Indonesia, Papua New Guinea, Timor-Leste (East Timor) and Singapore. He is traveling with his doctor and two nurses. He is also traveling with his secretaries for extra support, which is not usual. Cardinal Pietro Parolinn the Vatican's Secretary of State was supposed to travel with Francis, however due to the death of the Cardinal's mother he stayed behind. On the trip Francis is meeting with Catholic bishops, priests, religious brothers and sisters, seminarians, catechists, political leaders, interreligious groups, Catholic communities, missionaries, residents of nursing homes, refugees, orphaned children, street children at a Caritas



Technical School, the elderly, the disabled, fellow Jesuits, and the faithful. In each of the countries he will be welcomed by Cardinals, and three of them are Cardinals he created himself being the first-ever for those countries. Indonesia is a very large country of almost 17,000 islands with many tribes, ethnic groups, languages and cultures. The 8 million Catholic make up about 3% of the population which is primarily Muslim. Papua New Guinea has 2 million Catholics and has suffered a devastating earthquake on March 2024. Ninety-six percent of the country of Timor-Leste is Catholic and because of the poverty and unemployment, many of the young people are leaving the country and the Church is studying how to provide assistance. Singapore is an international business hub with about 6% of the population Catholic, and the people are generally well educated and more affluent. On his trip Francis is bringing medicine, clothing, toys and other necessities to help people living in the remote areas. Reporter Linda Bordoni one of the journalists traveling with the Pope has reported two stories of ordinary people coming to see Pope Francis. One lady named Carol had walked for days through the jungle to see the Pope. She brought with her two treasured Vatican medallions which her grandfather had received almost 50 year earlier when he was the first of his country to travel to Rome to attend a papal audience with Pope Paul VI. Carol was asked if she was afraid during her journey through the jungle? She said "No, God was with me". Another person, an Indian missionary sister who stood in line waiting to greet the Pope before his meeting with young people began, told reporter Linda Bordoni that her life every day involves traveling for hours in dinghies on the rough sea to bring assistance to people who have walked for hours through the jungle to reach them. The sister said the people have nothing. They live in houses with no electricity or running water. Many die in childbirth or in their infancy because there are no health services. The rising ocean is getting closer and closer to the house the Sisters live in. She said the main aim is to educate the children to peace while tribal conflicts continue to cause, conflict, deaths and destruction. When asked if she gets scared in the dinghy bringing assistance, she said "No God is with me." In one of his addresses so far on his trip, Pope Francis said in Papua New Guinea "After visiting your country, many tourists return home saying they have seen 'paradise,' "They usually refer to the natural beauty they enjoyed. We know, however, that this is not the greatest treasure. There is a more beautiful and fascinating treasure that is found in your hearts and that manifests itself in the charity with which you love each other." "The most precious gift you can share with everyone is to make Papua New Guinea famous not only for its variety of plant and animal life, its enchanting beaches and clear sea, but famous above all for the good people you meet here."
