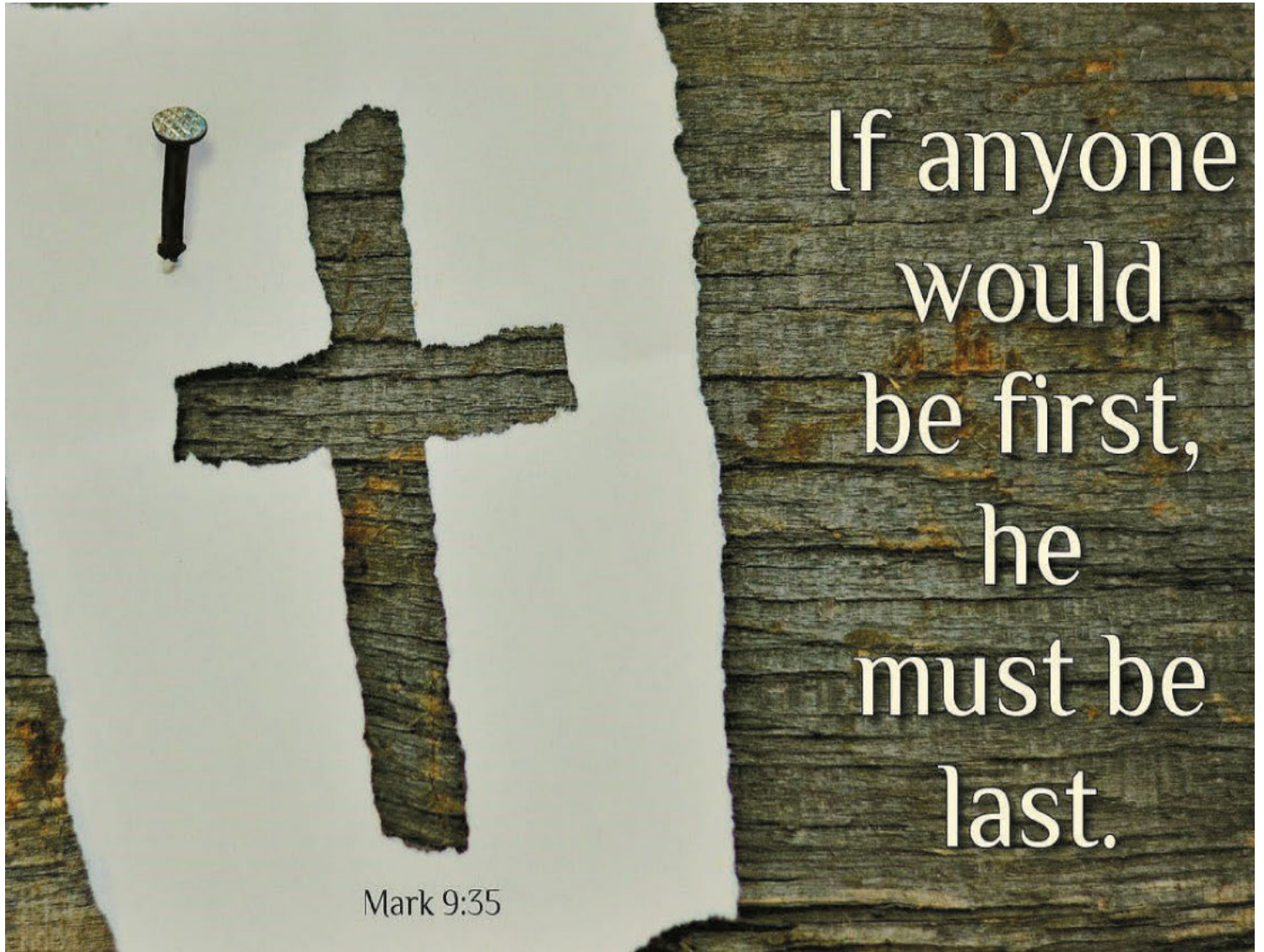

You line up with your group and in sequence based on your numbers. This means that before every flight, you'll hear people ask over and over, "What number are you?" Some don't ask and simply place themselves in the line. I have been A-1 before and had someone stand in line in front of me. There is nothing before A-1 in the line! It is crazy the urgency of some to board the plane and get the perfect seat. For some, I think it has more to do with a sense of entitlement. No one is going to cheat me out of my place in line! I deserve it!

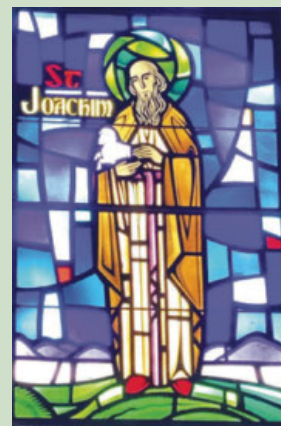

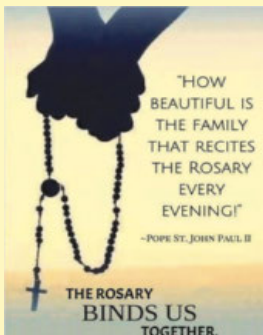

VATICAN CORNER

In Singapore, on Friday September 13, 2024, at the end of his trip to Southeast Asia & Oceania, Pope Francis' visited the elderly and sick at St. Theresa's nursing home. In 2003, management of the home was taken over by the Catholic Welfare Services (CWS), a non-profit, social service agency, with the goal of uplifting the lives of the less fortunate in the community. This home was founded 90 years ago by the Little Sisters of the Poor. That Congregation started in Cancale, France in 1839 by Jeanne Jugan, she, having felt the need to care for the many elderly poor who lined the streets of French towns and cities. That women's religious institute spread across France, expanded into England and kept growing and is now operating in 31 countries including the United State. It is one of the largest religious institutes of women in the Catholic Church, with 234 houses and 2,372 members. Founder Jeanne Jugan was canonized a saint in 2009, by Pope Benedict XVI. Members of the Little Sisters of the Poor make vows of chastity, poverty, obedience and hospitality. They believe hospitality perfects the other three vows by bringing their religious consecration into the realities of everyday life and giving a spiritual dimension to the many humble tasks of hospitality performed throughout the day. At St. Theresa's Home in Singapore, inside the chapel written in Chinese on the wall behind the altar is "The love of God abides in the world." Pope Francis received a warm welcome at the home and in the chapel he blessed around 60 wheelchair-bound seniors while in his own wheelchair. He told the seniors that "God is happy to hear your prayers" and he said he prays for them and asked them to pray for the Church, humanity and for him. The home is a peaceful oasis for elderly people in Singapore who have nowhere else to go. Director of Nursing, Gillian Beins told Vatican news that "Every little thing that we do for the elderly residents, we do with our heart, and I look forward to coming to work every day, because doing little things with great love gives me a lot of satisfaction." The elderly "are my best friends actually, I don't consider them patients or residents, actually we are friends." Before Pope Francis' visit, resident Bridget Ng said of the Pope – "A very nice man, and she was happy she wouldn't have to travel all the way to the Vatican to see him. "He's so good, he comes to see us." HR Manager Candy Lin expressed her admiration for Pope Francis' tireless dedication to the faithful – he's almost 88 years old and about to complete the longest Apostolic Journey of his pontificate. "Despite his health challenges, he's still full of zeal, he still wants to go on and on for his people. I think he wants to create this hope in people, and bring us together." Executive Director Victor Seng explained to Vatican News that "Family members are not able to take care of their own parents, because most of the time they are actually with their own children, and they are also working." He said that the high cost of living in Singapore keeps couples from having kids. Because of this, "the gap between the young and the old is getting wider and wider." "Families find it more difficult to care for the elderly." He noted that in the next few years, as many as 60-70 percent of Singaporeans will be over the age of 60. He explained that CWS sees to all the financial needs of residents whose families can't afford to pay for the home. Also they receive government support through subsidies, and receive benefits from cooperation between different religious groups. "What we all do is to love these people." "The goal is to give older people "a happy and good life before God takes them back home" and to give them "the best care and love" that he can – that love of God that abides in the world and, in a very tangible way, in St. Theresa's Home. 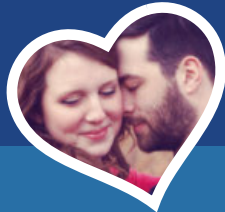
