

# VATICAN CORNER

On October 6, 2024, Pope

Francis led the Rosary prayer for peace at the Basilica of St. Mary Major, while he sat at the feet of the venerated ancient Byzantine image of the Blessed Virgin Mary, and prayed that violence and hatred be extinguished from human hearts. He was joined by the participants in the second session of the Synod on Synodality which is currently taking place at the Vatican. The list of ongoing armed conflicts in the world is a long one. There are more



than 45 in the Middle East and North Africa, more than 35 in Africa, 21 in Asia, 7 in Europe, and 6 in Latin America. In Francis' prayer for peace, he brought to the Blessed Virgin Mary the sorrows and hopes of the peoples at war. He said humanity currently has great need of her loving gaze, which calls us to trust in her Son, Jesus Christ. "Fly to our aid in these times oppressed by injustices and devastated by wars. Wipe the tears from the suffering faces of those who mourn the loss of their loved ones, awaken us from the stupor that has darkened our path, and disarm our hearts from the weapons of violence." The Pope expressed his concern that our world is in danger, as we have lost the "joy of peace and the sense of fraternity." He prayed that humanity may learn to "cherish life and reject war, care for those who suffer, the poor, the defenseless, the sick, and the afflicted, and protect our Common Home." He asked Mary, Queen of the Rosary, to untie "the knots of selfishness and disperse the dark clouds of evil" and fill us with her tenderness. Our Catholic Religion teaches us that Mary hearing our prayer requests and brings them to God. God is the one who answers prayers, and Mary acts as a powerful intercessor. How can we explain why God allows such tragedies as the war to occur? One answer is that God is not the author of evil or suffering, nor is he absent when humans are suffering. Our Heavenly Father is the author of human freedom. Men and women can choose to embrace good or bad, right or wrong, because God created us with free will. We abuse God's gift of freedom through sin, complicity with the forces of darkness, or surrendering to temptation. Our sins, however private, damage others and offend the created order. It is through sin that evil enters the world. To extinguish evil, God would have to deprive us of our freedom as well. Nor is God absent when human beings are suffering. God provides us with hope, grace, mercy, and consolation when we are being attacked by evil forces or in physical or emotional anguish. And without faith, would it not be possible to argue that war is merely another example of "survival of the fittest" the principle which rules the animal kingdom? Author Harold Kushner reminds us that faith provides "eyes with which to see the world" and a way of determining "what makes some things wrong." Catholic Faith affirms that God is present in our human suffering and not absent from it, and that only with faith can we overcome evil and prevent it. Likewise, without faith, we are unarmed against evil and without hope in suffering. A prayer was found on the cellar wall of a Nazi concentration camp after it was liberated that sums up the argument for faith even amid situations that test it: I believe in the sun even when it is not shining. And I believe in love, even when there's no one there. And I believe in God, even when He is silent... Pope Francis in his general audience on Sept. 1, 2019, said "Dealing with silence from God can be particularly painful, but it provides an opportunity to put faith and trust into action." "No matter what, He is always with us, and His silence always has a purpose." "How many times have we asked and not received, knocked and found a closed door? In those moments of seeming defeat, Jesus invites us to insist and not to give up." "Prayer always transforms reality: if things around us do not change, at least our hearts are changed. Jesus promised the gift of the Holy Spirit to every man and woman who prays." Francis said we can be absolutely positive that "God will respond" to our prayers. "No prayer goes unanswered, but that God's timing is different from our own."


