



VATICAN CORNER

The Trump administration's crackdown on

undocumented migrants is a concern for the Vatican and Catholic leaders in the U.S. It was reported that in the 20 days since President Trump's inauguration, 8,000 people were arrested in immigration enforcement actions. Some are being held in federal prisons and other are being held at Guantanamo Bay Naval Base in Cuba. Cardinal Michael Czerny, the head of the Vatican office for Promoting Integral Human Development, is the latest of several Vatican officials to speak out against U.S. immigration policy changes, which numerous Catholic leaders, including Pope



Francis, have criticized as unjust. Cardinal Czerny said in an interview on Feb. 10, 2025, that "A crackdown is a terrible way to administer affairs and much less to administer justice." "I'm very sorry that many people are being hurt and indeed terrorized by the measures." "All we can hope for is that the people, God's people and the people of goodwill, will help and protect those vulnerable people who are suddenly made much more vulnerable. Archbishop Joseph F. Naumann of Kansas City, Kansas said on Feb. 7, "The Church does not have the authority or the responsibility to determine the legal status of those living in the United States," but does have "an obligation to care for every person with respect and love, no matter their citizenship status." But he also endorsed making a priority the immigration enforcement against those who endanger public safety. The United States has long had more immigrants than any other country and has now one-fifth of all the world's international migrants. Immigrants come to the U.S. from nearly every country in the world. Here are some statistics from the PEW Research center about immigrants. In 2023 the U.S. foreign-born population reached a record 47.8 million, about 5 times the number of 1970. Congress made changes to U.S. immigration laws in 1965 which accelerated the growth of immigration. Today immigrants make up 14.3 % of the U.S. population, but that percentage is still below the record set in 1890 of 14.8 %. Mexico is the top country of birth for U.S. immigrants with 10.6 million in 2022, making up 23% of all U.S. immigrants. India is second with 6 million, China is third with 5 million, Philippines is fourth with 4 million, and El Salvador is fifth with 3 million. Most immigrants (77%) are in the U.S. legally. As of 2022, 49% were naturalized U.S. citizens, 24% were lawful permanent residents, 4% were legal temporary residents and 23% were unauthorized immigrants. Nearly all unauthorized immigrants living in the U.S. enter the country without legal permission or arrived on a nonpermanent visa and stayed after it expired. There are unauthorized immigrants that have permission to live and work in the U.S. and are temporarily protected from deportation. Temporary Protected Status (TPS) about 650,000, Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals program (DACA) about 600,000, Asylum applicants about 1.6 million, and other protections – several hundred thousand. Also under other special programs about 500,000 immigrants from Ukraine, Cuba, Haiti, Nicaragua and Venezuela. In 2022, 30 million immigrants were in the U.S. workforce with 22.2 being lawful immigrants and 8.3 million being unauthorized. Inspired by the Bible's call to "welcome the stranger", Pope Francis has made caring for migrants a priority of his pontificate, demanding that countries welcome, protect, promote and integrate those fleeing conflicts, poverty and climate disasters. He said that governments are expected to do so to the limits of their capacity.


