(PRACTICING) CATHOLIC – THE LOG IN YOUR EYE

Mini Reflection: If we see a splinter in another person's eye, or a problem in the world that needs to be fixed, what Jesus is saying is not that we should ignore it and move on. He's merely saying that, when we see these things, we must take them first as a challenge to examine ourselves.

The Log in Your Eye

Today's Gospel is a big favorite of non-Christians — or Christians who don't like being told what to do.

That trusty ol' remove the wooden beam from your own eye line is a classic. Mind your business, Christians! You're not perfect either. And that's entirely true. None of us are perfect. We've all got logs in our eyes. We can't approach life acting like we have the answers simply because we follow Jesus.

Jesus has the answers, and we have Jesus. The real problem with having someone remove a splinter from my eye, if he himself has a log in his eye, is not that he has no business removing the splinter from my eye. It's that he can't see clearly to do it. His own eyesight is occluded. If we see a splinter in another person's eye, or a problem in the world that needs to be fixed, or a scandal in the community that should be addressed, what Jesus is saying is not that we should ignore it and move on. He's merely saying that, when we see these things, we must take them first as a challenge to examine ourselves. To address the problem as it exists within our own souls, so that we ensure we are seeing clearly. Then, if we reach out to pluck the splinter, we will do so with clear eyesight.

He wants us to worry as much about our own souls as we do about other people's.

We tend to look at the world and feel anxious — so much evil! So much hate! So much sin! We pray, God, when will you change it?

And He whispers back: I will change it here.

Now. In your own heart. You just have to ask.





VATICAN CORNER

As of this writing, The eighty-eight year old Pope

Francis is on his 11th day of hospitalization for complications from a lung infection. He is currently in critical condition, and in showing early signs of kidney failure, although his doctors say his kidney problem is currently mild and under control. Francis was having difficulty breathing for several days before he was admitted to Rome's Germelli Hospital on February 14, 2025. He was diagnosed with double pneumonia, meaning both lungs were affected at the same time. An infection of the lungs causes inflammation of the air sacs which leads to the accumulation of fluid or pus



in the lungs, which can interfere with breathing. The doctors said the infection in the Pope case was "complex" due multiple kinds of microorganisms. Because his blood was showing anemia, which is a lower-than-normal amount of red blood cells carrying oxygen in the blood, he was given blood transfusions. On Saturday February 22, Francis went into a long asthmatic respiratory crises that required high flows of oxygen. Doctors warned that the main threat would be sepsis, a serious infection of the blood that can occur as a complication of pneumonia. But there was no evidence of any sepsis and the Pope was responding to the various drugs he was given. He had a "tranquil" night following his treatment and although his condition is still critical, he has not had any further respiratory crisis, but still remains on oxygen therapy. On Sunday the report was that Francis remains alert and he participated in the morning's Holy Mass. He thanked the people caring for him and said "I have recently received many messages of affection, and I have been particularly struck by the letters and drawings from children. Thank you for you closeness, and for the consoling prayers I have received from all over the world!" He also posted the statements "take risks for love" and "May we transform evil into goodness and build a fraternal world." On Monday there was made a slight reduction in the oxygen flow the Pope was receiving, and he showed a "slight improvement" and was able to resume some work while still in the hospital and being treated. He received the Eucharist in the morning and in the evening he called the parish priest of Gaza to express his closeness, maintaining his contact with that church since the war between Israel and Hamas began in October 2023. Groups of Catholics have gathered at St. Peter's Square to pray for the Pope's recovery. Archbishop Rino Fisichella, a senior Vatican official who presided over a Mass at St. Peter's Basilica on Sunday, asked parishioners to make their prayers for Francis "stronger and more fervent." In countries around the world, churches have also been holding special services. "These are difficult moments for the Holy Father and also for humanity, for the whole world," says Marisa Maron, one of the people who gathered at Basilica of St. John Lateran.

A prayer for Pope Francis from the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops:

O God, shepherd and ruler of all the faithful, look favorably on your servant Francis, whom you have set at the head of your Church as her shepherd; Grant, we pray, that by word and example he may be of service to those over whom he presides so that, together with the flock entrusted to his care, he may come to everlasting life. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. Amen.






Lenten Fasting and Abstinence

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are obligatory days of universal fast and abstinence. Fasting is obligatory for all who have completed their 18th year until the beginning of their 60th year. Fasting allows a person to eat one full meal. Two smaller meals may be taken, not to equal one full meal. Abstinence (from meat) is obligatory for all who have completed their 14th year of age. If possible, the fast on Good Friday is continued until the Easter Vigil (on Holy Saturday night) as the "paschal fast" to honor the suffering and death of the Lord Jesus and to prepare to share more fully and celebrate more readily his Resurrection. Fridays in Lent are obligatory days of abstinence (from meat) for all who have completed their 14th year. As always, anyone for whom fasting or abstinence would pose a health risk is excused.

Ayuno y abstinencia Cuaresmal

El Miércoles de Ceniza y el Viernes Santo son días obligatorios de ayuno y abstinencia universal. El ayuno obliga a todos los que han cumplido 18 años hasta los que están al comienzo de los 60. El ayuno permite tomar una comida completa y dos comidas más pequeñas que no equivalgan a una comida completa. La abstinencia de carne es obligatoria para todos los que hayan cumplido los 14 años de edad. Los viernes de Cuaresma son días de abstinencia obligatoria de carne para todos los que hayan cumplido los 14 años. Como siempre, está exenta cualquier persona para quien el ayuno o la abstinencia suponga un riesgo para su salud, por ejemplo, las mujeres embarazadas (madres lactantes) o las personas que reciben un tratamiento médico no están obligadas a ayunar. Sin embargo, las personas que se encuentran específicamente en esta categoría, están invitadas a practicar otra forma de ayuno independiente de la comida.


