

Filling the Basket This Lent

Lent calls us into deeper everyday stewardship because it beautifully creates opportunities to be mindful of the call of Christ in even the most mundane moments of our day.

Many of us will participate in the time-honored tradition of doing penance, or "giving something up" for Lent. When we do this, we are mimicking the Israelites who filled their baskets with the first fruits of their harvest, "and having set them before the Lord, your God, (bowing) down in his presence" (Deuteronomy 26:10).

What are we going to bring before the Lord this Lent? What are our first fruits?

If you're struggling with ideas for how to "fill your basket," it can help to come at the problem from the opposite side. Take a look at the six characteristics of Everyday Stewardship and think about the moments in your day when you fail to fulfill the virtues to which they call you.

What is keeping you from being mindful of the call of Christ throughout your day? I promise you, if you listen, you'll hear it more than once.

What is keeping you from being prayerful? When you have set your first fruits before the Lord, what keeps you from bowing down in His presence to finish the offering?

What keeps you from being grateful — especially of the small things that so often go unnoticed? hat keeps you from being gracious, from leaving people smiling as they walk away?

What keeps you from being committed and accountable? Where do your excuses come from and what makes you indulge them?

¿Qué te impide estar en oración? Cuando has puesto tus primeros frutos ante el Señor, ¿qué te impide inclinarte en Su presencia para terminar la ofrenda?

¿Qué te impide ser agradecido, especialmente de las pequeñas cosas que tan a menudo pasan desapercibidas?

¿Qué te impide ser amable, dejar a la gente sonriendo mientras se alejan?

¿Qué te impide comprometerte y rendir cuentas? ¿De dónde vienen tus excusas y qué te hace complacerlas?



VATICAN CORNER

On March 3, Pope Francis had two

more episodes of acute respiratory failure in the hospital, and began receiving oxygen through a ventilator again, as he continues to fight double pneumonia. The doctors had stopped using the mechanical ventilation on Francis because his breathing was improving, but after these new episodes, it is being used again to help him breath. The cause of his breathing difficulty was a large amount of mucus and other secretions from his lungs. Reports were that his blood tests remain



stable, but his condition remains fragile. The infection is not growing, but the situation is complex, and he is still considered in danger, but no longer in critical condition. The Holy Father has remained alert and able to engage with those around him through his illness. His health reports have been improving up until the two episodes. A few days earlier he had met with his secretaries at the hospital and has been keeping in touch with Vatican affairs and is still making decisions. While in the hospital he has signed off on the appointments of 20 bishops, accepted the resignation of four, and approved moving five people toward sainthood. What he is missing is the contact with the faithful, his general audiences, and the pastoral activity. Pope Francis is in charge, but the day-to-day running of the Vatican and the Church belongs to a team of officials, and the Chief among them is the secretary of state, Cardinal Pietro Parolin. Other Vatican functions are going ahead as normal, including the Vatican's 2025 Holy Year celebrations. However, the Pope's illness makes one think, who exactly would run the Vatican if he is unable to perform his normal duties. Canon Law has no specific legal provisions that address when a Pope is incapacitated. The Pope remains in charge even if he is unwell, but he can delegate some of his authority to key officials like the Secretary of State and can delegate tasks to others as needed. When a bishop gets sick and can't run his diocese, Canon 412 says a diocese can be declared "impeded" if its bishop – due to "captivity, banishment, exile, or incapacity" cannot fulfil his pastoral functions. In such cases, the day-to-day running of the diocese shifts to an auxiliary bishop, a vicar general or someone else. Pope Francis is the bishop of Rome, but there is no provision for the pope if he similarly becomes "impeded". Francis's illness has awakened old concerns among church experts and observers about who would govern the Church if this or any pope were to fall into a coma or otherwise be incapacitated for months rather than weeks. In 2021, a team of canon lawyers worked on trying to correct this legal problem and called for new law to allow the transfer of governing authority to the entire College of Cardinals or a commission, depending on how long the pope was incapacitated and if a committee of experts determined the pope's incapacity was irreversible. Then the cardinals could declare that the popes governing days were over and call a conclave to name a new pope. But this work by canon lawyers was only a proposal, and no new laws resulted. With Francis' condition slowly improving, the solving of the governing problems created by an incapacitated pope seems less urgent at the moment. As of this writing, the Pope has spent 18 days in the hospital. Some Italian doctors predict it will be another 14 days before he can return to his residence at the Vatican with a medical station placed there. Nightly rosary services are being held in St. Peter's Square for Francis' health and recovery. Cardinal Robert Prevost, from Chicago, the head of the Vatican's Dicastery for Bishops, has been leading the Roman based cardinals, the Vatican officials, and the hundreds of lay faithful in prayer for Francis for the past seven nights. All are hoping and praying for a speedy recovery for Pope Francis.. To be continued.






