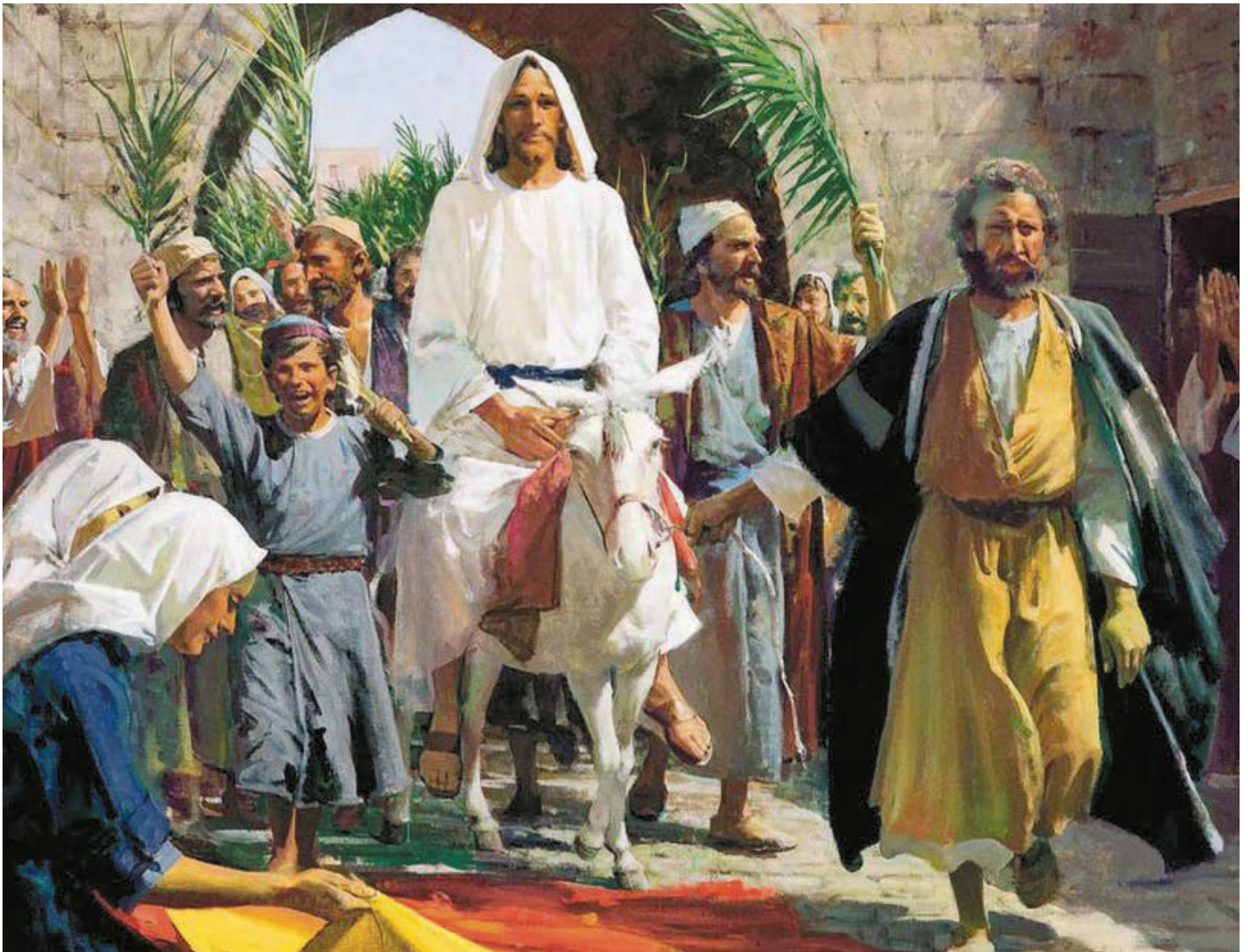

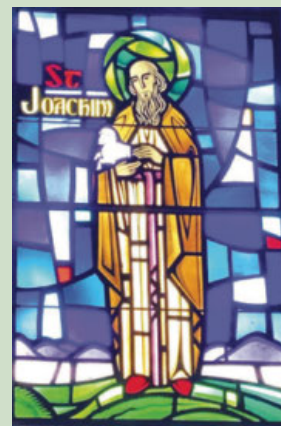

VATICAN CORNER

Before 1966 the Church law prohibited eating meat on Fridays throughout the entire year. The reason for this comes from the teaching that Jesus died on Friday. His death redeemed a sinful world, and to commemorate this sacrifice, people should abstain on Fridays from eating the meat of warm blooded animals that have shed their blood. It is a symbolic “stay of execution” for cows, pigs, chickens, and sheep, just as the cross saves us from eternal death. Abstinence and fasting are seen as



forms of penance, a way to show sorrow for sins and to grow in holiness through self-denial. In 1983 the new law required abstinence from meat only on Ash Wednesday and on Good Friday. The United States Catholic Conference of Bishops (USCCB) extended this law to include all Fridays in Lent, but with the understanding that every Friday during the year would remain a day of self-denial for remembrance of the passion of Jesus. The Church still asks that we continue to make every Friday a special day of penance or substitute some other penitential observances. The Bishops in 1966 said it is fitting that Catholics should continue to abstain from meat on Fridays freely and out of love for Christ Crucified to show our solidarity with the generations of believers who did so for nearly all of the past two millennia. Eastern Christians, both Catholic and Orthodox, still observe abstinence on Fridays (and on Wednesdays, as Catholics once did – and their abstinence is sterner than ours, excluding fish, dairy, and other animal products). In anti-Catholic times, Catholics were mocked for avoiding meat, being called “fish-eaters” or “mackerel snappers” that Catholics claimed as badges of honor. The Bishops said: For this and other reasons, by avoiding meat on Fridays, we remind ourselves that we are part of something bigger than our own cultural moment. Also the Bishops in 1966 said Our deliberate, personal abstinence from meat, more especially because no longer required by law, will be an outward sign of inward spiritual values that we cherish. In other words – avoiding meat on Friday matters simply because it makes us different. It’s something we do, other than going to Mass on Sundays, that marks us as Catholic – and this is beneficial both to us and to those around us. The Bishops’ intentions in 1966 turned out to be an utter failure. The spirit of penance, especially on Fridays, was not revitalized, it was decimated. For most Catholics, even churchgoing Catholics, Friday is no different from any other day, and hasn’t been for decades. However, it is still a day of voluntary penance.

Fish being coldblooded are considered an acceptable alternative to the meat of warm blooded animals. The fast-food chain McDonald’s played a small but iconic role in Lenten history, at least in the United States. According to McDonald’s company, in 1962, Lou Groen, an early franchisee of McDonald’s in Cincinnati, Ohio, in a heavily Catholic neighborhood observed a decrease in sales for his beef burgers on Friday during Lent. He proposed to Ray Kroc the founder of McDonald’s that his restaurant begin selling fish sandwiches as a way of bringing in observant Catholics on Fridays. Ray Kroc was dubious of adding fish to the menu, and Groen would later claim that Kroc told him: “I don’t want my stores stunk up with the smell of fish!” Kroc and Groen decided to run a test on a Friday, selling fish sandwiches alongside the “Hula Burger” – a meatless sandwich of grilled pineapple with cheese on top. The fish sandwich was a great success selling 350 compared with 6 “Hula Burgers”. A few years later the Filet-o-Fish sandwich was born, the first new dish officially added to the original McDonald’s menu. The fish sandwich is still a popular menu item throughout the world and many competitors have imitated it.

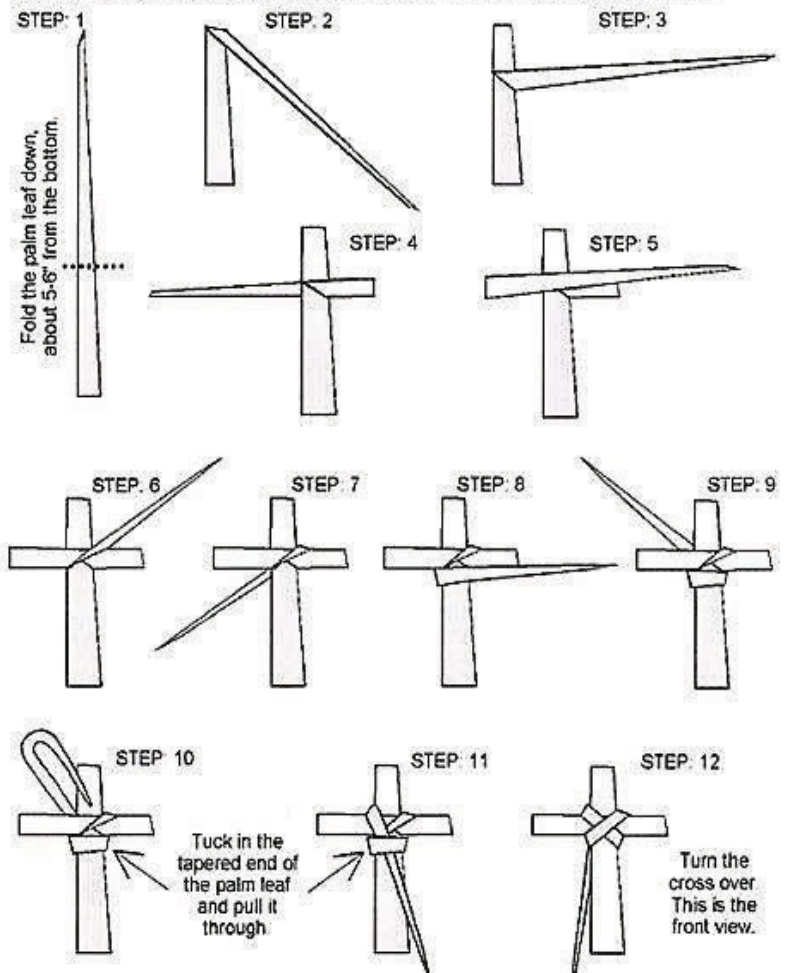

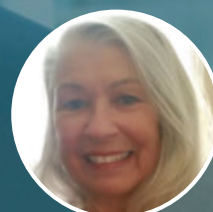
